These professionals and artists perceptively and intimately document a life, times and setting that many others may overlook in day-to-day living. Domino Danzero was an Italian immigrant to the Ozarks who possessed many talents and work experiences. One of his talents was photography and the historical contributions he made with his skills while he was associated with the Harvey House restaurant chain and Frisco railroad. Additionally, his love of photography resulted in a rich collection of family and era images that provide a valuable document of life in the Ozarks during the late 1800s and early 1900s.

A collaborative effort between Domino Danzero's family, the Missouri State Archives, and the Missouri State University's Special Collections and Archives Department has resulted in the preservation and access to over 2000 of these historically significant images and reference resources.

As the terrorism of the past bleeds into the present, the film asks: what will it take for Americans to begin building a national movement for racial justice and reconciliation?
