Sponsorships, Community Involvement, and Other initiatives Fourth Quarter, 2020

In November, KAMX partnered with Whataburger to help raise funds for Dell Children's Medical Center, a level 1 trauma facility in Central Texas. Mix 94.7 ran announcements encouraging people to donate at least \$1 at participating Whataburger Restaurants for which they would receive a free Whataburger on their next visit, with the purchase of a medium fry and drink. \$105,814 was raised and donated to Dell Children's Medical Center.

Mix 94.7, Majic 95.5, Talk 1370 and HOT 95.9 participated in the VOTE 411 campaign. The stations aired hundreds of messages letting people know about the different voting procedures in 2020, including mail in voting, registration and where to vote in person, including early voting. Information was also included on stations websites.

HOT 95.9 participated in the Holiday Toys for Girls and Boys Toy Drive. This virtual Toy Drive benefited Toys 4 Tots. HOT 95.9 ran announcements about the campaign and hosted a donation page on the station website.
