Shootings and Robberies

Story: West San Francisco Remains Found

Date: 04/02/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: A NEWS 11 FOLLOW UP ON DECOMPOSED REMAINS FOUND IN THE BASEMENT OF A ST. LOUIS HOME. THE REMAINS HAVE NOW BEEN IDENTIFIED AS THOSE OF 86-YEAR-OLD HERBERT LEE BROWN. POLICE SAY THEY WERE FOUND IN MARCH OF 2017 IN THE 42-HUNDRED BLOCK OF SAN FRANCISCO IN NORTH ST. LOUIS. THE MEDICAL EXAMINER'S OFFICE WILL CONDUCT AN AUTOPSY TO DETERMINE THE CAUSE OF DEATH. BANNER

Story: Youth Pastor Child Molestation Charge

Date: 04/17/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: A FORMER YOUTH PASTOR HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH SEVERAL SEX CRIMES INVOLVING A MINOR. UNIVERSITY CITY POLICE SAY 30-YEAR-OLD ANDREW DICKSON ADMITTED TO A SEXUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH A 15-YEAR-OLD. HE'S BEEN CHARGED WITH CHILD MOLESTATION AND STATUTORY SODOMY. OUR PARTNERS AT THE POST DISPATCH REPORTED THAT THE INCIDENTS HAPPENED AT HIS HOME ON MCKNIGHT ROAD IN UNIVERSITY CITY BETWEEN MARCH FIRST AND APRIL FIRST OF THIS YEAR.

Story: Manchester Kentucky Shooting

Date: 04/19/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: ONE MAN WAS SHOT IN THE HAND DURING A ROBBERY IN NORTH ST. LOUIS. THAT CRIME HAPPENED ON WEST FLORISSANT AVENUE NEAR WREN AVENUE. EARLIER, A 23 YEAR OLD MAN WAS SHOT IN THE LOWER BACK NEAR MANCHESTER AVENUE IN THE GROVE NEIGHBORHOOD OF SOUTH ST. LOUIS. POLICE FOUND THE VICTIM ON KENTUCKY AVENUE, ONE BLOCK SOUTH OF MANCHESTER. INVESTIGATORS ARE WORKING TO LEARN IF THE MAN WAS SHOT IN THAT AREA OR JUST SHOWED UP THERE TO SEEK HELP.

Story: Officer Shot

Date: 04/27/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: A CONFRONTATION BETWEEN AN OFF-DUTY POLICE OFFICER AND ANOTHER MAN LED TO SHOTS BEING FIRED AND BOTH MEN TAKEN TO THE HOSPITAL WITH NON-LIFE THREATENING INJURIES. IT ALL HAPPENED JUST BEFORE 1:30 THIS MORNING AT BOMBER O'BRIEN'S SPORTS BAR AND GRILL NEAR BECK AND KINGSHIGHWAY IN SOUTH CITY. ST. LOUIS CITY POLICE CHIEF JOHN HAYDEN SAYS FOUR OF HIS OFFICERS WERE OFF DUTY AND EATING AND DRINKING AT THE BAR. HAYDEN SAYS AT SOME POINT THERE WAS A CONFRONTATION OUTSIDE THE BAR BETWEEN ONE OF HIS OFFICERS AND A 22-YEAR-OLD MAN. ACCORDING TO HAYDEN, THAT MAN BEGAN SHOOTING AT AN OFFICER, STRIKING HIM IN THE WRIST AND SHOULDER. A SECOND OFFICER RETURNED FIRE, STRIKING THE SUSPECT IN THE LOWER EXTREMETIES AND SHOULDER. THE SUSPECT'S GUN WAS RECOVERED AT THE SCENE.

Story: Ballpark Village Arrest Date: 04/30/18- 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: POLICE HAVE RELEASED THE NAME OF THE MAN WHO WAS KILLED: 36-YEAR-OLD COREY HALL OF SPANISH LAKE. HALL WAS AMONG HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE AT THE 'EAT, DRINK, CHILL' EVENT AT THE BREWHOUSE IN BALLPARK VILLAGE. THE GROUP 'B-FREE ST. LOUIS' PROMOTES THESE EVENTS - WHICH HAD BEEN HELD HERE BEFORE WITHOUT INCIDENT - BUT SHOTS RANG OUT DURING AN ARGUMENT AROUND 8 LAST NIGHT. POLICE SAY HALL AND HIS FRIEND WERE BY-STANDERS; HALL WAS HIT IN THE HEAD; HIS 36-YEAR-OLD FRIEND WAS SHOT IN THE PELVIC REGION AND IS HOSPITALIZED IN SERIOUS CONDITION. THE DOWNTOWN ALDERMAN SAYS OBVIOUSLY THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO KNOW WHO THIS GUN-MAN IS.

Story: 16-Year-Old Shot Spanish Lake

Date: 05/03/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: POLICE ARE SEARCHING FOR THE GUNMAN WHO SHOT A 16-YEAR-OLD BOY IN SPANISH LAKE. IT HAPPENED AROUND SEVEN LAST NIGHT NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF BOWERS AND RHEA AVENUES. POLICE SAY THE TEEN WAS SHOT IN HIS LOWER BACK. OUR PARTNERS AT THE 'POST DISPATCH' REPORT HE WALKED TO A NEARBY GAS STATION FOR HELP. HE WAS TRANSPORTED TO A HOSPITAL. NO WORD ON HIS CONDITION OR A MOTIVE.

Story: MO Road Rage

Date: 05/11/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: A NEWS 11 FOLLOW UP ON A 23-YEAR OLD MEMBER OF THE MISSOURI AIR NATIONAL GUARD.HE SURVIVED TOURS TO IRAQ AND QATAR ONLY TO BE KILLED IN A ROAD-RAGE STABBING BACK HOME.CODY HARTER'S FAMILY IS DESPERATELY LOOKING FOR ANSWERS. 58-YEAR OLD NICHOLAS WEBB IS ACCUSED OF STABBING HARTER IN THE CHEST DURING AN ARGUMENT OVER "MERGING" ON SATURDAY.THE TWO HAD APPARENTLY STOPPED THEIR CARS ALONG A BUSY HIGHWAY AND WERE ARGUING.POLICE SAY WEBB TOOK OFF, BUT THEY FOUND HIM.

Story: Santa Cruz Boardwalk Shooting

Date: 05/14/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: CALIFORNIA POLICE INVESTIGATING A DEADLY SHOOTING AT THE SANTA CRUZ BEACH BOARDWALK. THEY SAY A MAN INSIDE A CAR ON THE PARKING LOT LAST NIGHT WAS HIT IN HIS TORSO WITH A SINGLE GUNSHOT. HE DIED AT A HOSPITAL. A JUVENILE AND TWO OTHER MEN INSIDE THE CAR WITH THE VICTIM...ARE ALL IN POLICE CUSTODY. AUTHORITIES RECOVERED A GUN INSIDE THE VEHICLE.

Story: Hit and Run Suspect Arrested Date: 05/23/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: THE NEWS HAS DEMOND MOOREHEAD'S FAMILY FIGHTING TEARS AGAIN. AT THE URGING OF U.S. MARSHALS, 18-YEAR-OLD JAMAICA JACKSON SURRENDERED TO AUTHORITIES THIS MORNING. COURT DOCUMENTS SAY SHE WAS PICKING UP SPEED AS SHE RAN THROUGH A STOP SIGN AND RAN OVER DEMOND WHO WAS RIDING HIS BIKE, KILLING THE BOY. A POLICE ACCIDENT RECONSTRUCTION EXPERT SAYS ANALYSIS SHOWS SHE MUST HAVE ACCELERATED NEAR THE VEHICLE'S FULL CAPACITY. MORE THAN A YEAR PASSED BEFORE JACKSON WAS CHARGED WITH A CRIME. SHE'S NOW JAILED ON A 250-THOUSAND-DOLLAR CASH ONLY BOND.

Synopsis: A SAINT LOUIS WOMAN IS PLEADING WITH THIEVES TO RETURN HER JEEP, A CRIME THAT WAS ALL CAUGHT ON CAMERA. THE OWNER SAYS THIS THEFT ROBBED HER OF NOT ONLY HER VEHICLE BUT ALSO OF SOME PRICELESS DOCUMENTS. THOSE ITEMS INCLUDE BIRTH CERTIFICATES, MARRIAGE RECORDS, AND A COLLECTION OF PHOTOS. THE VICTIM SAYS SHE WAS ABOUT TO MOVE OUT OF STATE WHEN IT HAPPENED

Story: Grand Chippewa Homicide Date: 06/02/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: SAINT LOUIS POLICE RESPONDED TO A CAR ACCIDENT EARLY THIS MORNING AND FOUND THAT THE DRIVER HAD BEEN SHOT. THE CRASH HAPPENED AT THE INTERSECTION OF SOUTH GRAND AND CHIPPEWA... A LITTLE AFTER 1:30. WHEN POLICE ARRIVED THEY DISCOVERED THAT THE DRIVER WAS DECEASED FROM A GUNSHOT WOUND. POLICE HAVE NOT RELEASED ANY DETAILS ABOUT THE ACTUAL SHOOTING. NO WORD ON IF ANYONE ELSE WAS INVOLVED IN THE CRASH.

Story: Church Road Body Found Date: 06/11/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: HOMICIDE DETECTIVES ARE INVESTIGATING AFTER A BODY WAS FOUND IN ST. LOUIS' BADEN NEIGHBORHOOD YESTERDAY AFTERNOON. POLICE SAY THE VICTIM IS A 55-YEAR-OLD MAN. HIS REMAINS WERE DISCOVERED A LITTLE BEFORE TWO O'CLOCK YESTERDAY ON CHURCH ROAD NEAR CHRISTIAN AVENUE. INVESTIGATORS HAVE NOT YET RELEASED A CAUSE OF DEATH.

Story: Downtown Robbery Attempt Date: 06/16/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY IN DOWNTOWN ST LOUIS SENDS TWO PEDESTRIANS TO THE HOSPITAL. POLICE RELEASING LIMITED INFORMATION ON THE CRIME- BUT DO SAY AROUND 12 THIRTY TWO PEDESTRIANS WERE STRUCK IN THE 7 HUNDRED BLOCK OF CHESTNUT BY A MOVING VEHICLE. THE CRASH STEMMING FROM WHAT THEY SAID WAS AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY. BOTH VICTIMS WERE CONCIOUS AND BREATHING WHEN TAKEN TO THE HOSPITAL-- THE EXTENT OF THEIR INJURIES IS UNKNOWN.

Synopsis: AN EARLY MORNING SHOOTING IN DOWNTOWN ST. LOUIS WEST. TWO PEOPLE WERE SHOT JUST AFTER TWO A - M ON OLIVE STREET AT NORTH 20TH. ONE VICTIM IS CRITCALLY INJURED AND A SECOND VICTIM IS LISTED AS STABLE.NO WORD ON SUSPECT OR WHAT MAY HAVE PROMPTED THE SHOOTING.

Story: 70 Shooting

Date: 06/25/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: THE AMOUNT OF DAMAGE THIS CAR SUSTAINED SHOWS JUST HOW FAST THESE CARS HAD TO BE GOING.ST. LOUIS POLICE SAY THREE CARS WERE INVOLVED IN A 3 CAR CRASH FOLLOWING GUN SHOTS. NEIGHBOR TELL ME WHILE THEY ARE NOT SHOCKED AT ALL.THEY SAY THIS HAPPENS ALL THE TIME AND POINTS TO THE METAL FENCE AS BEING ONE OF THEIR BIGGEST CONCERNS.I'M TOLD THEY HAVE REQUESTED CONCRETE BOULDERS OR SOME SORT OF SOUND BARRIER WALLS, BUT THAT NEVER

SEEMS TO BE ACCEPTED.AFTER THIS LATEST INCIDENT, SOME RESIDENTS ARE JUST FED UP.

Synopsis: TOYS-R-US IS CLOSING OR SELLING ALL OF ITS STORES IN THE US. BUT IF YOU HAVE AN UNUSED GIFT CARD, HERE'S AN OPTION THAT COULD NET YOU SOME NEW TOWELS OR SHEETS. BED BATH AND BEYOND IS ALLOWING CONSUMERS TO TRADE THEIR TOYS-R-US GIFT CARDS FOR A REDUCED BED BATH AND BEYOND GIFT CARD. A 20 DOLLAR TOYS-R-US GIFT CARD WOULD GET YOU A BED, BATH, AND BEYOND E-GIFT CARD FOR JUST UNDER 13 BUCKS. YOU HAVE TO ACT FAST. THE OFFER IS ONLY GOOD THROUGH TOMORROW.

Story: Stella Artois Beer Recall Date: 04/04/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: TROUBLE BREWING FOR A BELGIAN BEER BRAND OWNED BY A-B INBEV. "STELLA ARTOIS" IS ISSUING A RECALL. SOME BOTTLES OF "STELLA ARTOIS" BEER MAY CONTAIN PARTICLES OF GLASS. A PACKAGING FLAW AT A PRODUCTION FACILITY ... COULD CAUSE A SMALL PIECE OF GLASS TO BREAK OFF AND FALL INTO THE BOTTLE.

Story: Ford Recall

Date: 04/10/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: A MASSIVE RECALL FROM "FORD." THE AUTOMAKER IS PULLING BACK 350-THOUSAND F-SERIES PICKUP TRUCKS AND EXPEDITION SUV IN NORTH AMERICA. A PROBLEM COULD CAUSE THE VEHICLES TO ROLL AWAY EVEN WHEN THE TRANSMISSION IS IN 'PARK.' THERE HAS BEEN ONE CRASH AND ONE INJURY. DEALERS WILL INSPECT THE RECALLED VEHICLES FOR FREE AND MAKE ANY REQUIRED REPAIRS.

Story: Starbucks May 29 Training Date: 04/17/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: STARBUCKS IS CLOSING ITS EIGHT THOUSAND COMPANY OWNED STORES IN THE UNITED STATES NEXT MONTH TO EDUCATE EMPLOYEES ON RACIAL BIAS. THE STORES WILL CLOSE AFTER THE MRONING RUSH ON TUESDAY, MAY 29TH. THE EDUCATION SESSION IS IN RESPONSE TO LAST WEEK'S ARREST OF TWO BLACK MEN WHO WERE WAITING FOR A FRIEND AT A PHILADELPHIA STARBUCKS LAST WEEK. THE STORE MANAGER CALLED THE POLICE AND THE MEN WERE ARRESTED FOR TRESPASSING. STARBUCKS CEO KEVIN JOHNSON MET WITH THE TWO MEN YESTERDAY AND APOLOGIZED FOR HOW THEY WERE TREATED. THE RACIAL BIAS TRAINING WILL BE GIVEN TO ABOUT 175 THOUSAND WORKERS.

Story: Subway Stores Closing Date: 04/25/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: SUBWAY IS CLOSING MORE US STORES WHILE EXPANDING INTERNATIONALLY. THE CHAIN SAYS IT WILL SHUT DOWN ABOUT 500 STORES THIS YEAR ON THE HEELS OF HUNDREDS OF CLOSURES OVER THE LAST TWO YEARS. SUBWAY CURRENTLY HAS ABOUT 26 THOUSAND LOCATIONS IN THE US. THE CHAIN'S SALES DROPPED 4.4 PERCENT LAST YEAR DUE TO COMPETITION FROM NEWER CHAINS AND OTHER FAST FOOD OPTIONS. IT'S LAUNCHING A NEW LOYALTY PROGRAM, REMODELING STORES TO LOOK SLEEKER, AND ADDING TOUCH-SCREEN KIOSKS FOR ORDERING.

Story: Cambridge Analytical Closing Date: 05/02/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: THE CONTROVERSIAL DATA FIRM ACCUSED OF USING FACEBOOK USER DATA WITHOUT THE USERS' KNOWLEDGE IS SHUTTING DOWN. CAMBRIDGE ANALYITCA MADE THE ANNOUNCEMENT TODAY. THE GROUND BEEF WAS SENT TO RETAILERS INCLUDING KROGER STORES IN ILLINOIS. THE PRODUCTS HAD A SELL-BY DATE OF APRIL 9, 2018. IF YOU HAVE THE GROUND BEEF IN YOUR FRIDGE OR FREEZER RETURN IT FOR A REFUND.

Story: Carters Penguin Outfit Recall Date: 05/07/18 - 12pm, 4pm, 7pm

Synopsis: PARENTS: TIME TO CHECK YOUR CHILD'S CLOSET. KIDS CLOTHING MAKER 'CARTERS' IS RECALLING A THREE PIECE OUTFIT. THE PENGUIN CARDIGAN SET HAS A WHITE BODYSUIT, GRAY CARDIGAN TOP WITH A HOOD AND MATCHING PANTS. THE BUTTONS CAN PULL OFF CREATING A POTENTIAL CHOKING HAZARD. Synopsis: FIAT CHRYSLER IS RECALLING FOUR-POINT-EIGHT MILLION VEHICLES BECAUSE OF A MALFUNCTION THAT CAN KEEP DRIVERS FROM SHUTTING OFF CRUISE CONTROL. IT CAN HAPPEN WHEN THE VEHICLE ACCELERATES WHILE CRUISE CONTROL IS ON. THE NORMAL METHODS OF TURNING IT OFF TAPPING THE BREAK OR HITTING A BUTTON DON'T WORK.
