David Schwab, a research scientist with U of M's water center says he can't think of another place in the Great Lakes where a spill would have such a wide impact in such a short time. Michigan Regulatory Officials have established a task force on pipeline safety to examine that pipeline and others.
- 8/6-7 A U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service assessment crew will conduct work offshore of several rivers and streams in Marquette and Alger Counties this month, in the continuing battle against sea lampreys.
- 8/4-5 More steel supports are planned for an oil pipeline beneath the Straits of Mackinac. The project will add bracing to the Enbridge Energy pipeline that runs along the lake floor.
