11 conservation districts have been involved for more than a decade working with federal, state and local partners in developing management recommendations for the river.

Today's program discussed the findings of the long term study, and what some of the major concerns and issues are facing this iconic river.

Part of the upcoming symposium also includes an interactive art exhibition hosted by MSU-Billings.

Environmental Attorney Carrie La Seur discussed the relatively new legal concept of long-term guardianship of the river, such as appointing a Yellowstone River guardian to help protect its rights as a "living thing."
