Education	Clear Connections	1/4/15	600	15	Kathryn Hickok of the Cascade Policy Institute discusses the demonstrable education progress which Charter Schools are making in Oregon. Adds that the challenge is still coming from public education unions that don't want the competition.
2 nd Amendment, Firearms Rights, Public Safety	Clear Connections	1/4/15	615	15	Frank Minitier, author of "The Future of the Gun" details how the 2 nd amendment actually protects public safety, countering gun-grabbing critics. He adds that future guns will likely have biometric mechanisms so that they can only be fired by "authorized" users.
Firearms and environment policy, wildlife, state government	Clear Connections	1/11	600	10	State Rep Sal Esquivel raises the alarm on an issue important to sportsmen in southern Oregon, that of the push to reintroduce the California Condor to Oregon lands, and it's tied to an environmental agenda to ban all lead ammunition in Oregon.
Free Speech, courts, school policy	Clear Connections	1/11	610	20	Constitutional attorney John Whitehead comments on how his organization, The Rutherford Institute, has asked the U.S. Supreme Court to reject a lower court ruling that declared it unsafe for California public school students to wear American flag t-shirts to school. In asking the Supreme Court to hear the case of <i>Dariano v. Morgan Hill</i> , in which several students were ordered by school officials to cover up their American flag t-shirts on May 5, 2010, allegedly because officials feared that other students celebrating the Mexican holiday Cinco de Mayo would be offended, Rutherford Institute attorneys note that the school should have focused on controlling unruly students and not on stifling patriotic speech protected by the First Amendment.
Education, tax policy, federal government	Clear Connections	1/18	600	20	President Obama proposes a new initiative to make community colleges free for two years. Neal McCluskey, associate director for the Cato Institute's Center for Educational Freedom says the plan is misguided. In an op-ed for See Thru Edu and a piece for Cato's @Liberty blog, Neal takes a look at not only the feasibility of this program, but also at the effectiveness of community colleges themselves. According to a report from the Digest of Education Statistics, only 19.5% of first-time, full-time students at public two-year institutions complete their studies within 150 percent of the time their program is supposed to take, and that rate has been dropping for several

					years.

Repulsed by the number of end-of-life patients who die in hospitals at exorbitant costs, Dr. Volandes' book poignantly illustrates the urgent need for doctors, patients and families to jointly determine care objectives, to discuss the validity of life-prolonging care, as well as the need for completing living wills and health proxies.
