

### QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST

The following is a listing of some of the significant issues responded to by stations KMED-AM and KRWQ Gold Hill, KZZE Eagle Point, KLDZ Medford, and KIFS Ashland, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period July 1, 2013 to September 30, 2013. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance. NOTE: KRWQ and KMED-AM aired these programs 30 minutes earlier than noted.

Description of Issue	Program/Segment	Date	Time	Duration	Narration of Type & Description of Program/Segment
Crime, sentencing reform	Clear Connections	7/7/13	600	15	Marc Levin, policy director of Right on Crime discusses HB3194, recently passed by the state legislature which is designed to reduce sentencing costs to taxpayers for certain crimes. Estimated to save hundreds of millions in the coming years over older sentencing guidelines.
Local economy, state government,	Clear Connections	7/7/13	620	15	State representative Dennis Richardson critiques the ending legislative session, decries what he calls a "lack of planning" in the session. Says the Democratic majority doesn't have a long-term plan of sustaining the spending increases enacted, and NO work was done to improve the job creation climate.
Marriage, family law Government and taxation	Clear Connections	7/14/13	600	10	A representative from the Cato institute explains the recent supreme court decisions regarding same-sex marriage, and the constitutional issues at hand.
State Government, public health	Clear Connections	7/14/13	610	10	State Senator Bates explains the progress in the session. Says the biggest gains were in the reform of state medical programs and PERS reform.
Children's Services, family law.	Clear Connections	7/14/13	620	10	Jennifer Mylenek of CASA and Bob Gervais of REMAX realty explain the audition process for "Southern Oregon's Got Talent", a fundraiser for Court Appointed Special Advocates. The program pays for the training and supervision of personnel who represent children in various family court conflicts.
Immigration policy, public safety	Clear Connections	7/21/13 and 7/28/13	600	15	Jim Ludwick of Oregonians for Immigration Reform discusses their efforts to place a referendum on the 2014 general election ballot to repeal SB838, which provides drivers license cards to illegal alien drivers in the state. Ludwick believes this is a danger to public safety, and encourages illegal behavior, including the taking of legal Oregonian's employment prospects.
Health, public charity	Clear Connections	7/21/13 and 7/28/13	615	15	Local opthamologist Dr. Matt Oliva promotes his non-profit, "Cataract Project for the Himalayans", which provides low-cost lens replacement surgery for needy people in Nepal. The techniques also help improve surgical procedures in the United States practices.
Healthcare, government action	Clear Connections	8/18/13	6:20	10	Liz McDonald of FoxBusiness.com has a story of an unintended consequence of Obamacare healthcare reform. Now, even government agencies are starting to trim hours on staff to take it under the 30 hour threshold for requiring healthcare benefits.

Local and State Politics	Clear Connections	8/18/13	600	20	State Representative Dennis Richardson talks of his platform for Oregon governor. He recently announced the start of his gubernatorial run. Conversation covered the need to raise funds from a grassroots base in order to show he has broad-based support. This will end up “shaking loose” larger donations from GOP officials on the national level.
Environmental Policy	Clear Connections	8/4/13	600	15	Local logger Mark Johnson responds to a local farmer group asking for more restrictions on logging in order to protect farming. Johnson claims that if anything, their organic farmings are more monoculture than the monoculture tree farms they fight.
Education, state government, taxation	Clear Connections	8/4/13	615	15	State Senator Bates explains the need for the Oregon Opportunity Grant. Several hundred million tax dollars would be placed in an endowment, and grants would be offered to needy students.
Land use, property rights, environment	Clear Connections	8/11/13	600	15	Michael Franklin of Tipi Village, part of the “Land Liberation Project”. His tipi community lives on land which must be sold. Franklin’s goal is to raise funds and put the land into a trust, and prevent a “well-connected” foundation from purchasing the land, and eventually selling it off at a profit to the Cascade-Siskiyou monument.
Nutrition, public health	Clear Connections	8/11/13	615	15	Jo Robinson, nutritionist, author of “Eating on the Wild Side”. Promoting the searching out of the most nutritious varieties of fruits and vegetables in the market. Says the most common, best-tasting varieties are often the least nutritious, and she offered tips on choosing better selections.
Healthcare reform, taxation	Clear Connections	8/25/13	600	15	Dr. Merrill Matthews, Institute for Policy Innovation discusses the exemption Congress has given themselves from ObamaCare., <u>an exemption Obama personally negotiated</u> , concluding: Matthews says this is yet another example of how badly congress screwed up both the health care legislation and the process.
Urban renewal, downtown revitalization, local economy	Clear Connections	8/25/13	615	15	Medford City Councilman Chris Corcoran brings us up to date on the various success stories involving the Lithia development at the Commons, and the recently announced purchase of the Red Lion Hotel by new owners who will renew the property.
Civil Rights, government surveillance, privacy	Clear Connections	9/1/13	600	20	In his new book, <i>A Government of Wolves: The Emerging American Police State</i> constitutional attorney John W. Whitehead paints a chilling portrait of a nation in the final stages of transformation into a police state, complete with surveillance cameras, drug-sniffing dogs, SWAT team raids, roadside strip searches, blood draws at DUI checkpoints, mosquito drones, tasers, privatized prisons, GPS tracking devices, zero tolerance policies, overcriminalization,

					and free speech zones. Whitehead reveals the inner workings of an increasingly pervasive surveillance state, including the NSA's program to track the communications of all Americans and map the daily activities of U.S. citizens.
State and Local Government, economy, social services	Clear Connections	9/1/13	620	10	Senior Fellow at the Cato Institute discusses the implications of their new study indicating 35 out of 50 states typically pay welfare benefits far above the minimum wage or prevailing wage. Says it is difficult to persuade people to work when it pays more to not work. Oregon typically pays benefits worth, on average, \$35,000 per year.
Transportation, Taxation, state government	Clear Connections	9/8/13	600	15	State Rep. Richardson critiques the governor's drive to reopen the Columbia River Crossing bridge controversy, cost overruns, and Portland's insistence on including light rail, which he considers a deal-breaker.
Family finance, telecommunications, federal government action	Clear Connections	9/8/13	615	15	Dan Isset, Parents Television Council points out the advantages of a cable choice bill making its way through the federal government. Details the huge subsidy costs consumers are saddled with due to bundling of networks. Folks have to pay for channels and networks they don't watch.
Timber, environment, economy	Clear Connections	9/15	600	15	Steve Swanson of the Swanson Group discusses the healthy forests, healthy communities issue, and the Walden/DeFazio compromise timber bill, and the need for such legislation.
