Section 1: Issues and Concerns in the Fayetteville, NC Area

Issue: The Dangers Of Breaking From Our Constitution

Synopsis: Dr. Adam Carrington, assistant professor of politics at Hillsdale College's Graduate School of Statesmanship, unpacks the recent trend of states passing legislation to do away with the Electoral College, and the repercussions of state lawmakers, as well as presidential candidates, desiring to break from tradition. Carrington also addresses other proposed changes to our Constitution, including altering both the number of U.S. Supreme Court justices and the amount of time lawmakers can debate about judicial nominees.

For Americans, it often means figuring out how to balance religious convictions with all of the other rights granted in our Constitution, some of which conflict at times. Many of those rights were granted in the first ten amendments and are often referred to as the Bill of Rights because they were meant to provide assurances that a powerful government would not run roughshod over an individual's rights. We know that the guarantee of religious freedom was one of the first amendments made to the U.S. Constitution and, as such, it's often referred to as our "first freedom." That's why the case of florist Barronelle Stutzman is so important. It pits the powerful government of the State of Washington against a grandmother who runs a family-owned florist business in Richland, a small town on the Columbia River.

Issue: The Dangerous Inequalities Of The “Equality Act”

Synopsis: A bill labeled the Equality Act could go to a vote in the U.S. Senate at any time. The measure, which threatens religious liberty on a number of fronts, has already passed the U.S. House. And if you think that it can’t pass in the Republican-controlled Senate, consider the fact that eight Republicans helped to pass the bill in the House. If the bill (H.R.5) passes in its current form, it would be the first time in history that the classifications of “sexual orientation” and “gender identity” would be elevated to protected status under federal civil rights laws.
