The following list of issues and problems was prepared by the Public Affairs Department of WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1, Rochester, NY.

WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1, on a daily and on-going basis, examines and attempts to determine the needs of the community during regular news coverage (includes TV and newspaper). Events being covered by WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1 news broadcasts, which run every half-hour between 6:20 am and 8:50 am, Monday through Friday, also help determine the direction of community affairs programming. In addition, portions of public affairs programs are aired in actuality format in Morning Drive news broadcasts to add awareness and to better highlight community concerns and issues during the most-listened-to portion of the station's broadcast day.

In the city of Rochester an average of 95 people are diagnosed each year. CSC has found that screening falls short in the African American and Latino communities so they have started an aggressive Outreach and Community Engagement program in those areas in hopes of getting more people to screen for this disease. CSC has made free, at-home colorectal cancer screening kits available. Jim says these tests are 98% effective and that since the program started last spring, there has been a 47% return on at home tests with 20 positive tests returning.
