Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

A. Ojai Raptor Center:

Jacquelyn DeSanits, the Education Program Manager from the Ojai Raptor Center spoke to KjEE about the organization and how they protect animals. She gave a brief history of The Raptor Center, and explained how the organization works to protect injured animals. She also provided tips on what to do when someone finds an animal they may think is in need of assistance.
