Section I. Issues

KZMK, KWCD and KTAN have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Children's Services.** Children in Sierra Vista have a safe place to go after school. The Boys and Girls Club of Sierra Vista has many events and programs to keep kids safe and off the streets. February was the local radio-a-thon to get the word out.
- A. **Animal Services.** Dedicated animal service organizations care for dogs, cats, and other shelter pets. Getting the word out about long-time residents of the shelter to encourage adoptions and prevent euthanasia of pets at the shelter.
