The program educates and informs the community about the negative health effects of tobacco and works to reduce the availability of tobacco products to youth and exposure to secondhand smoke in indoor and outdoor environments. The goal of Ventura County Public Health (VCPH) is to reduce tobacco use and tobacco-related illnesses and deaths and influence social norms towards a tobacco-free County. • The County of Ventura's Public Health department, is deeply concerned about the rising number of teens using flavored e-cigarettes. According to the CDC's National Youth Tobacco Survey - there was a 78 percent surge in e-cigarette use among high school students from 2017 to 2018 with 2019 climbing even higher. Parents--school might be out but don't let your guard down! More and more youth are using e-cigarettes, so while your kids are at home, talk to them about maintaining healthy habits. • Most kids don't realize that flavored e-cigarettes are high in nicotine. Sweet flavors mask the harsh taste of tobacco, making it easier for kids to smoke. Tobacco Free California's FlavorsHookKids.org reports teens are 7 times more likely to vape nicotine than adults, and 4 out of 5 kids who vape nicotine use flavors.
