### Section II: Responsive Programs –

- A. Animal shelter, vaccinations, support and education

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 3, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 13 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Alessandra Navidad, President and CEO of AAWL and part of Pet Housing Help AZ. Pet Housing Help AZ is a group of affiliations that came together to offer resources, assistance and temporary homes for pets of residents who are struggling with rent and need a time out to get back on track. Many residents in Arizona are experiencing housing difficulty with a 28 percent rise in rent costs over the last year. The Pet Housing Help AZ project has sought out the input of the Arizona Housing Coalition in addition to being a resource for overall health and wellness. Health and wellness, housing and more help to breed a stronger community. The Pet Housing Help AZ is in need of people willing to foster animals while people get back on their feet.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 17, 2022 at 6:43:05 a.m. and May 8, 2022 at 6:43:10 a.m. Duration 16 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Mikkel Becker, Certified Trainer, Dog Behavior Counselor and Lead Animal Trainer with Fear Free. Mikkel discusses that there is more anxiety in our dogs than we realize and offers suggestions for how to alleviate that stress. Furthermore, sometimes our dogs get into trouble or barking annoying our neighbors because they are bored. She discussed different activities to activate our dogs' minds. Dogs are part of the family but the conversation stemmed from how to make them an active member of the family with anxiety-free training.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 17, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 10 minutes and 35 seconds. A segment with Nicki Bosch, Marketing Director with Lost Our Home Pet Rescue. Lost Our Home Pet Rescue works with Sojourners, Heidi's Village and other partners to provide stable, temporary housing for people in need. The Temporary Home project is how Lost Our Home Pet Rescue got started back in 2008 as a way to help people get back on their feet without losing their four-legged family members in the process. Lost Our Home Pet Rescue will hold your animal for 90 days as you search for a stable environment. Lost Our Home Pet Rescue is always looking for volunteers to help care for the animals while their owners are in transition.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 1, 2022 at 6:09:30 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Cathy Bissell, Founder of Bissell Pet Foundation. The Bissell Pet Foundation is supporting Empty the Shelters initiative in which the Bissell Pet Foundation supports and takes care of adoption fees. The spring months have overcrowded shelters and pets need to find their forever homes. The Bissell Pet Foundation focusses on spaying and neutering, microchips and pet vaccinations to help pets be more easily adoptable.

## **B. Community Awareness**

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 3, 2022 at 6:15:20 a.m. Duration 15 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Jennifer Purcell, Senior VP and Director of Development with the Alliance of Arizona Nonprofits. The Alliance of Arizona Nonprofits is organizing and hosting their annual Arizona Gives Day. The 24-hour event that is spurred on with an online platform of over 1,000 different charitable organizations to donate has raised an enormous amount of money for the charities in the Valley and also raised awareness about many needs. From Arizona Gives Day, not only is the monetary involvement key, so too is the foundation of finding new volunteers and spreading the word on many non-profits, large or small.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 24, 2022 at 6:24:30 a.m. Duration 9 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Cherie Koss, Executive Director of River of Time Museum and Exploration Center. The museum has received a makeover after it closed for two years because of COVID. In that time, the museum has received funding to improve the museum and transform the exhibits with the focus on sustainable and water resources. A variety of positions are needed to be filled by volunteers.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 15, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 9 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Debbie Hillman, Chief Administrative Officer at Mercy Care. Mercy Care is dedicated to community reinvestment and provides grants to different companies and organizations through MERCY CARES initiative. Right now, there is not an application process for organizations seeking assistance, but they are working on expanding those opportunities to non-hand-picked organizations. Mobile units are an important part of the communities that MERCY CARES needs to serve and the partnership with Farm Express are examples of what these opportunities create to benefit the community.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 22, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and May 29, 2022 at 6:46:10 a.m. Duration 15 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Sue Thew, Communications Manager with Vitalant. Vitalant is the largest nonprofit supplier of blood to Arizona hospitals. The need for donations equates to 600 people a day. Vitalant is able to split out different components of blood in which certain aspects can be stored for four days while others for 45 days. The shelf life for blood overall is not long. The need is growing as holidays and the summer months are approaching to make sure the blood supply stays up to meet the demand.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 22, 2022 at 6:38:25 a.m., June 5, 2022 at 6:27:40 a.m. and June 12, 2022 at 6:51:45 a.m. Duration 7 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Ari Halpert, Communications Department Officer with Maricopa County Air Quality Department. The Maricopa County Air Quality Department has a new campaign, 'Commit to One Day, Help Keep Ozone Away.' There is good ozone and bad ozone and the bad ozone stays close to the ground,

can cause health problems and increase health concerns for people with asthma. The campaign is designed to commit to one day in the summer of doing something that won't cause bad ozone like carpooling, riding a bike, pumping gas at night instead of during the day.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 29, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and June 5, 2022 at 6:36:10 a.m. Duration 8 minutes and 35 seconds. A segment with Jussane Goodman, Director of Community Engagement with Phoenix Rescue Mission. Phoenix Rescue Mission is launching its Code: Red Summer Heat Relief Campaign that is aiming to help unhoused and at-risk individuals across the Valley survive Arizona's triple digit temperatures. Phoenix Rescue Mission partners with many organizations to make sure Valley people can get access to water and items during the hot summer months.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 5, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 9 minutes and 40 seconds. A segment with Jody Boyd, Executive Director and Founder of The Singletons. The Singletons is an organization that helps families who are single parent households where cancer has affected them or their children. The Singletons is a community that provides comradery and support for dealing with such a difficult challenge. In addition, donations of food, meal prep, and donations of necessary supplies are a big part of what The Singletons helps to support.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 19, 2022 at 6:11:00 a.m. Duration 8 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Rachel Stacke, A Community Engagement Supervisor with Phoenix Rescue Mission. Phoenix Rescue Mission is a place of hope, healing and new beginnings. Part of that is the operation, Hope For Hunger Food Bank. Typically, the Phoenix Rescue Mission serves around 160 Valley families every day but that need as increased over the last few months with the economic changes. Donations are greatly needed in order to continuing operating the packaged non-perishable and perishable food options to families who come to the bank location.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 26, 2022 at 6:47:30 a.m. Duration 13 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Tim Harrison, VP of Corporate Partnerships and Special Events with Phoenix Children's Hospital Foundation. Phoenix Children's Hospital provides numerous services to children who are in need of cancer treatments, emergency services and more. In order to operate the Phoenix Children's Hospital at a prestigious level with the ability to care for any and all patients, the hospital operates on a \$2.7 million budget daily. In order to continue those services, Phoenix Children's Hospital has many different fundraising opportunities, community events and more to continue its operations and level of care.

### **C. Education and financial support programs**

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 3, 2022 at 6:32:25 a.m. Duration 27 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Carol Carrol, President and Director with Sister Cities in Fountain Hills. Sister Cities was a program that began in the Eisenhower era and has been flourishing since. Fountain Hills has three sister cities across the globe. The concept is to send high school aged students to these cities to go to school, live and absorb other cultures. In return, those cities send students to Fountain Hills. The concept is to learn other cultures, learn about other ways of life and thought processes and the hope is to bridge together a more friendly and positive world. The education that is garnered from these exchange programs highlight a global perspective and to broaden acceptance and ideas.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 17, 2022 at 6:12:20 a.m. Duration 12 minutes and 5 seconds. A segment with Anne Landers, VP of Strategic Impact with Junior Achievement of AZ. Junior Achievement of Arizona has been helping Arizona children for more than 60 years succeed in work and life. The pillars of Junior Achievement of Arizona include financial literacy, work readiness and entrepreneurship. Junior Achievement of Arizona helps with virtual classes, in-person classes at schools and help parents with ways to talk with their children about financial literacy. Junior Achievement of Arizona is directly in schools to help with educational programs.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 29, 2022 at 6:08:50 a.m. and June 19, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 10 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Brent Sullivan, Chairman of Care Fund Advisory Council Great Phoenix. Bill Rodgers, President and Founder of Homeowners Financial Group started the Care Fund after a personal experience with a friend's child needing care and assistance at the Phoenix Children's Hospital and realizing that these kids spent a lot of time without their parents because their parents were forced to work or face eviction from their homes. The Care Fund pays money directly to the lender or landlord for three months to help alleviate the stress of bills while a child is sick and needing critical care. The Care Fund plans to provide \$2.5 million in grants for families this year.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 5, 2022 at 6:10:10 a.m. Duration 17 minutes. A segment with Stephanie Parra, Executive Director with All in Education. All in Education is to exist to ensure that individuals from the communities most impacted by education inequities are the ones making decisions for all students. With a challenge of seeking to build an Arizona where no child is at risk of falling behind, where parents feel valued and supported and most importantly where all kids feel loved and honored in their classrooms. All in Education focuses heavily on the Parent Educator Academy and how parents are fundamental to their children's success in academics.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 19, 2022 at 6:19:35 a.m. Duration 13 minutes. A segment with Beth Maloney, Director of Arts Education at Act One. Act One is actively working with arts organizations across the state of Arizona exploring digital and virtual platforms to share with schools to ensure that Arizona's children continue to have access to the arts. Teachers are encouraged to request field trip opportunities through Act One and Act One will provide the funding and transportation, if needed, due to lack of district funding. Act One typically works with Title I students to provide them access to the arts which is important to the core of education.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 26, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Karl Gentles, Executive Director of Back to School Clothing Drive. Back to School Clothing Drive provides about \$450 worth of school materials and school clothes to students in need. Parents need to pre-register for the event as the number of backpacks and supplies is capped at 5,000 students. It is important that students have the right materials and clothes to begin their school journey, which sets them up for better success in the learning environment.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 26, 2022 at 6:26:50 a.m. Duration 20 minutes and 25 seconds. A segment with Daniel Davis, Director of Landlord Relations with Home Inc. Home Inc. is the administrator for the program, Threshold, which is encouraging property owners and managers to make their properties available to low-income individuals and families. There is a huge need in the Arizona community for affordable housing. Home Inc and Threshold surveyed property managers and owners as to what they would need in order to get onboard with affordable housing. Home Inc. has stepped in to manage that relationship and provide the funding to

property owners to incentivize their efforts for more affordable housing. This expansion allows there to be a broader net for where people can live, work and socialize in a community.

#### **D. Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Advocacy, shelter and support**

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 10, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and April 24, 2022 at 6:49:20 a.m. Duration 10 minutes and 15 seconds. A segment with Heidi Koffman, Founder of Art in the Afternoon. Heidi, a sexual assault survivor, founded Art in the Afternoon as a way to bring sexual assault survivors together for community, shared experiences and art therapy. The power of art in ones live to be able to express the traumas suffered is an important step in the healing process. Art in the Afternoon is a nonprofit organization that is looking to help shape and form women with trauma to acknowledge, feel and empower themselves.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 24, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 10 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Laura Pahules, CEO and Founder of Control Alt Delete. Control Alt Delete is a two-year old 501 c3 organization in Phoenix that's primary focus is removing barriers that prevent domestic violence victims from fleeing abusive relationships. The assistance can come in the form of a hotel stay, payment for a ride somewhere away from the situation and it certainly always factors in if kids are involved in the process.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 1, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and May 15, 2022 at 6:51:25 a.m. Duration 9 minutes. A segment with Myriah Mhoon, CEO of New Life Center Sexual Assault Crisis Center. The center is newly created that focuses on helping sexual assault victims receive the help they need with counseling opportunities, how to process what has happened and to file a police report. The center has a partnership with Phoenix Police and is a safe place for a victim to get the help they need.

#### **E. Health care related resources**

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 10, 2022 at 6:10:30 a.m. Duration 15 minutes and 25 seconds. A segment with Jody Boyd, Executive Director and Founder of The Singletons. The Singletons offers financial resources and community resources to those single-family members fighting cancer. Part of health in fighting cancer is the chemo and radiation, but it is healthy meals, a community of understanding and comradery. The Singletons kitchen offers healthy meals to families to make it easy to get proper nutrition. The Singletons offers payment assistance on electric bills and gas cards to get to and from doctor's appointments. The Singletons requires that you are living a single life, with an active cancer diagnosis from an oncologist in order to receive assistance from the nonprofit organization.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 10, 2022 at 6:26:10 a.m. and May 8, 2022 at 6:23:25 a.m. Duration 19 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Tomas Leon, President of Equality Health Foundation. The Equality Health Foundation envisions a world of vibrant and inclusive communities where all individuals have the opportunity to live healthy lives. Equality Health Foundation partnered with United Health Care Community Plan of Arizona and Valley of the Sun United Way to start Blue Zones Activate South Phoenix. Equality Health Foundation's efforts are to be a health resource with a lasting impact to start to the change the overall health and life expectancy from zip code to zip code.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 8, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 10 minutes and 35 seconds. A segment with Jessica Arnold, Corporate Communications Manager with Delta Dental of Arizona. Delta Dental of Arizona is committed to finding ways to serve the nonprofit section in spreading the message and providing resources to improve oral health. Delta Dental of Arizona collaborated with Neighborhood Outreach Access to Health to create a free cookbook that used the expertise of nutritionists and oral health experts. Foods that we intake directly correlate with oral health and this free cookbook offers nearly two-dozen options for breakfast, main dishes, snacks, desserts and beverages.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 1, 2022 at 6:21:45 a.m. and June 19, 2022 at 6:32:50 a.m. Duration 20 minutes and 40 seconds. A segment with Fred Johnson, President and CEO of Team Select Home Care. Arizona has a pilot program, Family Licensed Health Aide that allows parents to be licensed to care for a medically fragile child in a nurse capacity and be paid through Medicaid. Families face many hardships when caring for a medically fragile child and this program allows people to be paid for the work that would be done by a nurse. This also helps alleviate the burden of nurse shortages as well.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 15, 2022 at 6:23:45 a.m. Duration 20 minutes and 15 seconds. A segment with Cara McNulty, DPA, President Behavioral Health and Mental Wellbeing with CVS Health. The conversations surrounding mental health have certainly changed and younger generations are driving the need to change the conversation around mental health. Gen Z and Young Millennials are accounting for 41 percent of dealing with anxiety and depression. The mental toll on young people throughout COVID has extended into the need to seek services. CVS Health is now expanding to dedicate its health resources to mental health and offering screenings for depression and other mental health care needs.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 12, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 23 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Dr. Christopher Smith, Chief Science Officer with SARRC. SARRC stands for Southwest Autism Research and Resource Center. SARRC is celebrating 25 years offering many programs that is trying to focus on early detection and intervention. SARRC is trying to create research that expands the ability to detect earlier than three years old. Furthermore, SARRC offers programs for teens and adults that help transition into adulthood through employment services. Families who know and have early detection of autism are better equipped with understanding and development.

#### **F. Front line, first responder, active duty military and veteran support**

**Valley Focus** - Broadcast on April 10, 2022 at 6:45:55 a.m. and May 1, 2022 at 6:42:55 a.m. Duration 16 minutes and 35 seconds. A segment with Zack Renschler, United Goodyear Firefighters. United Goodyear Firefighters took an oath to make sure they aren't putting off their mental and physical health. Often times there are many occupational hazards associated with firefighting. So they have taken an oath to make sure they are doing the physical elements to keep themselves and fellow firefighters safe, but also to make sure they are attending their checkups and other needs. Zack is hopeful that this group can have a bigger impact in legislation and other station houses across the state. An upcoming charity event will raise awareness and continue first responder support.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 24, 2022 at 6:11:40 a.m. and May 8, 2022 at 6:11:05 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 50 seconds. A segment with Nancy Keane, Executive Director of USO Arizona and Patrick Fitzhugh, Board Chairman of USO Arizona. USO Arizona supports Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Airmen, Coast Guardsmen and their families. The USO Arizona strengthens America and Arizona's military service members by keeping them connected to family, home and country, throughout their service to the nation. USO Arizona is proud to support military spouses and hosts baby showers and events that provide a sense of community and bond.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 22, 2022 at 6:46:25 a.m. and June 12, 2022 at 6:37:10 a.m. Duration 13 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Aaron Hoyt, Arizona Army National Guard. The Arizona Army National Guard offers support and assistance through its services. Many former active duty military come back and join the National Guard in service of their country. Furthermore, the National Guard continues to offer training, educational assistance and many other resources for the service and commitment.

Arizona's Children Association is the oldest and largest statewide comprehensive child welfare and behavioral health not-for-profit agency in Arizona. Arizona's Children Association is searching for case managers to work with children, advocate for them, and be a part of the positive work done. The Arizona's Children Association is dedicated to the work of children and wants to give them an opportunity to succeed after a tough situation.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on April 24, 2022 at 6:34:45 a.m. Duration 13 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with SSG Aaron Hoyt with the Arizona Army National Guard. The National Guard offers many opportunities to people who commit three to six years of service with the guard. Included in that time is training for specific job opportunities or payment of higher education to advance in different fields of study. The call to action to serve is there in addition to the opportunities available to someone beyond serving.

A segment with Aubrey Stark, Franchise Owner with Express Employment Professionals. Unemployment has hit an historic low of 3.3 percent in the month of April, which has made the job landscape very competitive. Express Employment Professionals are involved in many different sectors to provide help for job seekers at no charge. Employers have had to adjust their expectations of what the job market is commanding to pay employees and to keep them happy to avoid extreme turnover. Express Employment Professionals navigates the waters for job seekers with employers and also helps employers manage expectations.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 12, 2022 at 6:23:25 a.m. Duration 13 minutes and 15 seconds. A segment with Shelly Drews, Heritage Communities' Regional Outreach and Education Specialist and Rhonda Thiel, Regional Director of Operations at Heritage Communities. Heritage Communities partnered with Help My Senior, LCC to offer classes that are NCI A-approved Caregiver Certification training classes. Once these classes are completed, a test passed, people with the certificate can apply for the numerous elderly caregiver job openings. These job openings

are specific to non-medical care and are desperately needed. The burnout rate and turnover in addition to the growing number people in need of assistance has created a huge shortage of caregivers.

## **H. Youth support**

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 15, 2022 at 6:44:15 a.m. and June 19, 2022 at 6:53:45 a.m. Duration 6 minutes and 55 seconds. A segment with Jay Spector, Board Chair with Arizona Helping Hands. Arizona Helping Hands provides essential needs for children in foster care through programs promoting safety, permanency and health. So far in 2022, Arizona Helping Hands has served over 1,095 children. Arizona Helping Hands focuses on helping foster families as well as kinship families. May is National Foster Care Month and there are currently over 14,000 children in the foster care system needing support. Arizona Helping Hands offers many programs and needs support to offer school fits, birthday gifts and essential needs for families.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 22, 2022 at 6:17:00 a.m. Duration 19 minutes and 55 seconds. A segment with Ben Smith, Founder of Gnosis IQ. Gnosis IQ is an algorithm program that is designed to help predict how a student is going to do in school based on the grades and emotional wellbeing of the child. The major benefactor of this program is that it allows a student to interact every day, whenever they are feeling they want to share how they are feeling. It also notifies a teacher right away with concerns and the need to reach out right away. By logging in to the program, a student is giving permission for Gnosis IQ to share those internal feelings and ultimately get the help warranted for the child. Gnosis IQ has helped save the life of a child in middle school who was actively plotting her suicide. Gnosis IQ is seeing students report depression and sadness in high volumes of recent. There is a psychological aspect to young children feeling scared to tell someone how they are feeling in person but more comfortable sharing with a screen and having an adult approach them to seek the guidance they need.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 29, 2022 at 6:19:50 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 5 seconds. A segment with Sarah Grado, Grants and Contracts Administrator with notMYkid. notMYkid has been providing youth, families, schools and community partners with high impact prevention education and early intervention programs for more than 20 years. Suicide continues to be the second leading cause of death for adolescents and young adults in 10 to 24 years old and Arizona ranks in the top 10 nationally for youth suicides. notMykid is licensed by the Arizona Department of Health Services to operate an outpatient treatment center. Peer to peer support in youth is an important element of healing as well and notMYkid offers that as well.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on May 29, 2022 at 6:31:10 a.m. Duration 14 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Diogo Pereira, Executive Director of Harmony Project Phoenix. Harmony Project harnesses the transformative power of music to increase access to higher education for underserved students by removing systemic barriers to achievement through academic and social support. There is a tremendous amount of benefit and connection to music and learning valuable life lessons that are translated into staying focused, disciplined and ultimately helping to further ones education.

**Valley Focus** – Broadcast on June 26, 2022 at 6:12:00 a.m. Duration 14 minutes and 35 seconds. A segment with Dawn Garza, Director of Operations with Lily's Pad. Lily's Pad is a nonprofit organization that was started in response to Lily's journey with Leukemia. The family of Lily



discovered the social isolation was taking a toll on Lily, who was unable to play with her friends or go to parks and playgrounds due to the unsanitary nature and her immunocompromised state because of chemo treatments. Lily's Pad has a donated location that is under renovation to support hospital grade HVAC, and is utilizing a design team for practical playground equipment that is easy to sanitize properly. Lily's Pad is hoping to bring together a community of people and provide children with the emotional wellbeing they need to tackle their physical diagnosis.
