A. Domestic violence, shelter and support

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 2, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 9 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Myriah Mhoon, CEO of New Life Center, Arizona's largest domestic violence shelter. New Life Center recently partnered with Kaity's Way, a nonprofit that advocates for healthy teen relationships and identifies how abusive relationships start and become normalized. New Life Center serves more than 1,000 children and adults annually through emergency shelter and outreach support programs.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 16, 2022 at 6:14:30 a.m. Duration 16 minutes and 55 seconds. A segment with Michael Medoro, Chief Development Officer with Childhelp. Childhelp has been around for 66 years with the fundamental goal to help children in serious domestic violence and sexual assault situations. Childhelp offers a 24/7 staffed hotline with text support if the situation is too unsafe to call. Childhelp provides villages for children to get therapy and treatment to help with abusive situations. Furthermore, children are able to stay up-to-date with school studies, spiritual relationships and more while getting adequate help while removing them from an abusive situation.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 27, 2022 at 6:18:35 a.m. Duration 19 minutes. A segment with Janice Podzmiek, Interpersonal Violence Liaison for Brain Injury Alliance of Arizona. Brain Injury Alliance of Arizona is a social benefit organization dedicated to creating a better future through brain injury prevention, advocacy and education. The statistics for women and men who are physically abused by an intimate partner increase when that partnership is part of the LGBTQ community. Often times brain injuries are caused by domestic, physical violence and it is important to help with both the physical and emotional trauma. The Brain Injury Alliance helps people get out of tough situations and provides them with the tools they need to thrive beyond their sustained brain injury.

B. Health care related resources

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 2, 2022 at 6:11:10 a.m. and January 9, 2022 at 6:18:15 a.m. Duration 15 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Steve Tepper, Executive Director with The Arizona Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired (ACBVI). Over 200,000 individuals in Arizona are blind or visually impaired. There has been a major shift in technology use in the last 18 months and the blind and visually impaired population needs resources, programs and products to stay active and engaged in job responsibilities and life activities. ACBVI helps educate individuals on the features their current devices probably have for visual impairment and hearing loss. In addition, ACBVI provides support groups, social recreation, help with orientation and mobility as well as living skills.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 2, 2022 at 6:38:55 a.m. Duration 6 minutes and 55 seconds. A segment with Matt Roberts, CVS District Leader. CVS Health is now offering COVID-19 vaccines for children ages five to 11 years old. They are at select CVS locations as availability is limited based on the dosage size for a child vaccine being different from an adult vaccine. In addition, boosters are now available for anyone 18 years and older, six months post second shot.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 23, 2022 at 6:16:40 a.m. Duration 13 minutes. A segment with Barb Kozuh, Director of Community Benefit with Delta Dental of Arizona. Delta Dental of Arizona Foundation's mission is to improve lives by promoting optimal oral health. Delta Dental is teaming up with Arizona PBS on an educational outreach program to promote good oral health to children in rural communities across the state. Arizona is doing very poorly statistically in children who have cavities and the goal is to get that number way down in the next decade. It all starts with teaching the children good practices, as good oral hygiene can lead to good overall health.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 30, 2022 at 6:20:05 a.m. Duration 7 minutes and 5 seconds. A segment with Jimmy Thomason, Executive Director of Aunt Rita's Foundation. Aunt Rita's Foundation began 35 years ago with the mission to end HIV in Arizona. Today, it continues to support local LGBTQ organizations with tests, prevention, education and awareness. Upcoming is the AIDS Walk Arizona and 5K Fun Run that directly supports those organizations on their quest to live a long-fulfilling life with HIV and with preventative measures.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 13, 2022 at 6:10:00 a.m. Duration 16 minutes. A segment with Sherri Wood, CEO of Oakwood Creative Care. Oakwood Creative Care began in 1975 with the founders dream of a nonprofit providing an alternative to costly in-home and institutional care. The Oakwood Model offers classes to anyone over the age of 18 with a cognitive, physical disability. The day-care center allows for respite for the caregiver but provides instructional, mind-stimulating and physical activities for members.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on March 6, 2022 at 6:33:10 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 40 seconds. A segment with Eric Weinbrenner, Phoenix resident diagnosed with ALS in 2019 and founder of

Paint for a Cure. Eric discussed his battle with ALS and how the disease has rapidly impacted him over the last few years. Eric broke down the in's and out's as to what insurance helps people with suffering from ALS and what insurance will not provide. He started Paint for a Cure to help families get the equipment they need to make them more comfortable in the battle with ALS, in addition, painting is a therapeutic and important part of Eric's life that allows him to focus on something other than his situation and to give back to the community.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on March 20, 2022 at 6:37:30 a.m. Duration 22 minutes. A segment with Laura Keller, Managing Director of Advocacy with American Diabetes Association. The American Diabetes Association is a network of more than 565,000 volunteers, their families and caregivers, plus a professional society of nearly 20,000 health care professionals with more than 250 staff members. The American Diabetes Association works strongly toward advocating insulin prices and overall health for everyone with an important initiative of Health Equity Now. Furthermore, American Diabetes Association offers a children's camp in the summer. This camp is a great place to learn more about living with diabetes, surrounded by a community of people living with the same health concerns and learning how to manage dietary life choices.

C. Youth support programs and resources

Academic Opportunity of Arizona is a nonprofit student tuition organization that provides educational funding and support both inside and outside the classroom for children living with disabilities and low-income hardships. The parents do have to apply every year for scholarships for the children K-12 and that provides materials to help them be successful in school and move on to furthering their education.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 16, 2022 at 6:31:55 a.m. Duration 12 minutes. A segment with Peter Volny, founder of Concours in the Hills. Concours in the Hills raises money for the Phoenix Children's Hospital in the form of a unique car show. The show has grown to about 1,000 cars, trucks, and special transportation. The event continues to raise thousands of dollars with a new goal of eclipsing the \$1 million mark in the next few years. The Phoenix Children's Hospital provides unprecedented care for children, but also provides financial support and resources for the families going through the difficult times too.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 23, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and February 13, 2022 at 6:55:15 a.m. Duration 4 minutes and 55 seconds. A segment with Zuri Torres, Girl Scout of Arizona Cactus Pine Council Communications Project Manager. Girl Scout Cookies are the most common thing we know about the organization. But Girl Scouts' mission is to build girls of courage, confidence and character, who make the world a better place. The Girl Scouts have many programs that work toward achieving that mission. The life lessons learned are invaluable, as they build good selfesteem and learn to be confident in their place in the world as they get older.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 13, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 9 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Julian Wright, Owner and Founder of Pedal Haus, and Jay Jones, Founder with SkateForty8. SkateForty8 represents the outcast, the marginalized, the broken-hearted and every unfilled dream in the inner city. SkateForty8 was started in 2020 with the hopes to bring passion and skateboarding to inner city youth. SkateForty8 is taking applications for those that deserve a free skateboard and Pedal Haus is providing proceeds to help support the cost of the skateboards. The idea is to get the kids to feel part of a community.

A segment with Russ Funk, Director of Community Engagement with Aid to Adoption of Special Kids (AASK). AASK is one of the largest foster care agencies in Arizona, having served the community since 1988. AASK is with families throughout the entire process and doesn't stop its services once the child is in the custody of a foster family. The resources provided to families by Aid to Adoption of Special Kids is immense and requires many volunteers.

College Bound Arizona helps students apply for grants and scholarships they are eligible to receive. College Bound Arizona helps with food insecurity to take one burden of life off a student's plate in their effort to further their education and improve their life. Finally, College Bound Arizona provides laptops and other resources for students who can't afford necessary materials to further their education.

UCP of Central Arizona offers individuals and families with disabilities, not just cerebral palsy, therapy assessments and treatments. Valerie is spearheading advanced detection in cerebral palsy in young children and babies that in turn starts

Arizona's Children Association is the oldest and largest statewide comprehensive child welfare and behavioral health not-for-profit agency in Arizona. Arizona's Children Association is searching for case managers to work with children, advocate for them and be a part of the positive work being done. The Arizona's Children Association is dedicated to the work of children and wants to give them an opportunity to succeed after a tough situation.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on March 27, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 8 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Anthony Kelly, Director of Creative Content with The Be Kind People Project. The Be Kind People Project is a dedicated nonprofit providing students with comprehensive youth development programming that effectively uses a positive approach to social, emotional and

academic learning. The Be Kind People Project also works closely with teachers and students in a realm of positivity and making a difference.

Ted explains the different ways assets can get held up, making the loss of a loved one more difficult. Ted also explains the differences between wills and trusts and how each family situation is different.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 16, 2022 at 6:44:40 a.m. and January 23, 2022 at 6:44:35 a.m. and February 13, 2022 at 6:40:10 a.m. Duration 14 minutes and 50 seconds. A segment with Tom Wheelwright, CEO and CPA with WealthAbility. The predicted tax season for 2021 was expected to have many changes but Tom divulges how many of the expected increases didn't occur. Tom provides advice on how to donate to charities to receive a federal and state deduction. He also walks through expense write-offs for those that started small businesses during the pandemic. He went into detail on how many new people started investing in the market and might not understand the capital gains tax implications and how best to limit federal capital gains taxes. In Arizona, the housing market was on fire with many people buying and selling property. The conversation funneled around different strategies to make purchasing a home work for you on your 2021 taxes.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 20, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and March 13, 2022 at 6:43:40 a.m. Duration 15 minutes and 50 seconds. A segment with Mary Reha, enrolled agent with Arete Financial Solutions. Business deadline to file for taxes is March 15. There have been several changes to the business tax code and it is important to understand those changes, get your paperwork filed on time, have your P&L's in order and discuss with your tax representative so you are following the new codes. In addition, people have worked free-lance gigs at much higher rates than ever before, so there are important things people who are filing their personal taxes need to understand too.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on March 13, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. and March 27, 2022 at 6:51:55 a.m. Duration 8 minutes and 45 seconds. A segment with Blake Quinlan, Scottsdale Franchise Manager with Express Employment Professionals. Jobs are very fluid right now in Arizona. A recent report

showed that most job seekers are wanting more money and better benefits. Express Employment helps job seekers with resume construction, an introduction to a hiring company and more. Express also has unique partners with businesses that are looking to expand and recruit new talent.

E. Homelessness, housing and hunger

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 9, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 18 minutes. A segment with Amy Schwabenlender, Executive Director of the Human Services Campus. The Human Services Campus is comprised of 16, 501c3 organizations that help serve the homeless population, providing shelter and food to those in need. Recently, the Human Services Campus extended its Welcome Center hours to 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Human Services Campus was able to apply some of the money obtained through the Covid-19 bills to extend these hours. Having the flexibility with the extended hours goes a long way to providing the ability to have conversations, build relationships and start the process to end homelessness.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 30, 2022 at 6:08:05 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Greg Peterson, founder of The Urban Farm. The Urban Farm is focused on sustainable gardening, composting, solar and the new buzzword 'permaculture'. Greg cites that various events in our lives causing supply chain issues, food shortages, power outages, etc. reinforce the need to be more cognizant of how to make do with what we have and be resourceful. There are simple steps we can take to improve our food supply.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 6, 2022 at 6:44:10 a.m. Duration 15 minutes and 55 seconds. A segment with Eileen Howard Boone, Senior VP of Corporate Social Responsibility and Philanthropy with CVS Health and Jackson Fonder, CEO of UMOM. UMOM restores hope and rebuilds lives by providing shelter, services and affordable housing for people experiencing homelessness. UMOM currently has over 300 students on their campus that are utilizing their resources. CVS Health has made an investment to four local nonprofits, including UMOM, as part of their Health Zones initiatives. The start of the five-year commitment wants to reduce health disparities and advance health equity in underserved communities. The program is focusing on six key areas; health, housing, education, access to food, labor, transportation and health care access. UMOM is a perfect fit with how they connect with the community.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 20, 2022 at 6:31:50 a.m. and March 6, 2022 at 6:46:05 a.m. Duration 13 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Jo Grant with Women 4 Women Surprise. Women 4 Women Surprise is dedicated to maintain dignity, self-respect and health for people who are food insecure, homeless and struggling financially. Someone who is currently on SNAP does not get feminine hygiene products covered under the program. Not having the proper feminine hygiene products can promote missed opportunities at work or in school.

F. Support initiatives surrounding elder care, mental health, drug abuse and addiction

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 23, 2022 at 6:05:55 a.m. and January 30, 2022 at 6:50:05 a.m. and February 27, 2022 at 6:50:55 a.m. Duration 9 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Deanne Poulos, Caregiver Services with Duet, Partners in Health and Aging. Duet is offering an array of new support groups, including those who have become caregivers for their loved ones. Often times there is a lot of stress and burden in a full-time caregiver role and it is important to take some time for yourself and have the advocacy needed. Duet is there with virtual and inperson groups with people who have been through or are currently going through the struggles.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 6, 2022 at 6:27:35 a.m. and February 20, 2022 at 6:45:35 a.m. Duration 16 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Gregg Goodman, Executive Director with Horses Help. Horses Help serves the special needs and at risk community by using horses and people to improve quality of life. Horses Help is able to provide the therapeutic environment for people to thrive using the equine approach. The mental stability that horses teach children with disabilities improves their quality of life and provides the necessary training tools applied outside of the equine environment. Gregg discussed the numerous stories of how Horses Help have changed lives and improved mental health.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 6, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 12 minutes and 30 seconds. A segment with Denise Kaye, co-owner with Connections in Home Care. AARP cited that 49 percent of workers are set to be providing elder care in the next five years. Generation X is now being called the Sandwich Generation as they have to care for both their children and their parents. Denise discusses how mentally taxing this is and drives wedges in other relationships as well. Connections in Home Care provides necessary care for elders that also allows that parent-child relationship to remain intact. The stressors of a full-time job, kids and parents is a lot. Often times, people don't realize how burnt out they are and stress is consuming them. For this, Connections in Home Care has numerous options whether it be with over 200 provider caregivers or helping with a roadmap to more advanced care.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on March 20, 2022 at 6:20:25 a.m. Duration 16 minutes and 35 seconds. A segment with Zack Renschler, United Goodyear Firefighters. United Goodyear Firefighters took an oath to make sure they aren't putting off their mental and physical health. Often times there are many occupational hazards associated with firefighting. So they have taken an oath to make sure they are doing the physical elements to keep themselves and fellow firefighters safe, but also to make sure they attend their checkups and other needs. Zack is hopeful that this group can have a bigger impact in legislation and other station houses across the state.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 2, 2022 at 6:48:20 a.m. and January 9, 2022 at 6:34:00 a.m. Duration 11 minutes and 25 seconds. A segment with Marianne Gouveia, Founder of EricsHouse. Marianne's son Eric committed suicide after a bout with heroin addiction that stemmed from suffering an injury in high school that hooked him on pain killers. She started EricsHouse to help with substance abuse issues and the grieving process of someone who is actively battling

addiction or lost the battle. EricsHouse uses a variety of different methods to assist with the healing and counseling process.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on March 6, 2022 at 6:00:00 a.m. Duration 12 minutes and 50 seconds. A segment with Carrie Collins, CEO of Brain Injury Alliance of Arizona. 70 percent of patients hospitalized with a TBI receive opioid prescriptions. 75 percent of heroin users in treatment started with pain killers. Surviving an overdose can have lasting effects on the brain and cognitive function. Brain Injury Alliance of Arizona can help people with TBI get the therapy they need who are also dealing with drug addiction. Sometimes this complicates the process of healing. And Brain Injury Alliance of Arizona helps the families with coping strategies and groups as well.

G. Community Awareness

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 23, 2022 at 6:30:10 a.m. Duration 14 minutes and 10 seconds. A segment with Sue Thew, Communications Manager with Vitalant. Vitalant is a blood donation bank that is at critical shortages in Arizona. Across the United States, someone every two seconds someone needs blood. Blood donations are more than just blood donations, they are platelet donations, red cells and even plasma. The precautions are very abundant for donating blood for anyone worried about COVID-19. Blood is used for so many different things and when the supply is low, that is a danger to the community.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on January 30, 2022 at 6:27:40 a.m. Duration 7 minutes and 40 seconds. A segment with Kendall Oltrogge, President and CEO of Premier Lab Solutions. Premier Lab Solutions is offering appointment and community based COVID-19 testing. They have collaborated with the state on various different community based locations for ease of access. They work with the insurance companies on getting tests at no cost to the client. Furthermore, if someone is interested in seeking employment with Premier Lab Solutions, they are hiring with bonuses.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on February 6, 2022 at 6:13:00 a.m. Duration 14 minutes and 20 seconds. A segment with Jennifer Purcell, Senior VP and Director of Development at Alliance of Arizona Nonprofits. The Alliance of Arizona Nonprofits is a group that works with Arizona legislation and legislation at the Washington DC level to advocate in the best interest of the nonprofits. Furthermore, the Alliance is gearing up for Arizona Gives Day. A 24 hour campaign for a one-stop-shop for donations for all nonprofits that sign up to be a part of the day.

All-ages are welcome. Gigi's Playhouse is dedicated to a GiGiFit program to instill a healthy lifestyle. In addition, Gigi's Playhouse has a university program that focuses on fundamental skills for life after school and how to get acclimated into a work environment. Press Coffee is stepping up with donations of the profits to Gigi's Playhouse when you purchase their Community Blend grounds.
