Well-known Community Member Revived Following Cardiac Arrest - Grundy County Board Member Ken Iverson was revived by Grundy Sheriff Deputy Paul Clampitt, who used an AED on June 27th. WJDK did a three part series that talked about the importance of AED's in the community and the technology that saved Iverson's life. **Air dates:** 7/12, 7/13, 7/14

Major Drug Dealer Arrested Twice in One Month – Grundy County Sheriff Kevin Callahan said Charles Woods, 28, of Morris was arrested for dealing heroin to an undercover agent with the Metropolitan Area Narcotics Squad in Morris in June and again in July. The second alleged transaction occurred while Woods was out on bond. **Air dates:** 6/29, 7/21

Three Arrested For Robbing Bank in Gardner – Grundy County Sheriff Kevin Callahan said three individuals were arrested nearly two days after First Midwest Bank in Gardner was robbed. Callahan told WJDK two individuals were arrested in late July and one in August. **Air dates:** 7/25, 7/26, 7/27, 8/5

Local Woman Shares Story of Heroin Sobriety – WJDK did a four part series regarding the opioid epidemic. The first part involved an interview with a local resident who shared her story of being sober the past four years; second part involved the Grundy County Drug Court program; third part explained what lawmakers are doing to help the situation and the fourth part involved where people can receive help. **Air dates:** 8/20, 8/21, 8/22, 8/23

Attempted Murder Arrest in Morris – The Morris Police Department arrested a Bellevue, Washington man, who stabbed a female friend in the neck at a gas station on Route 47 in Morris. This comes after the woman was allegedly held captive, battered and threatened by Bartels on the drive from Iowa. Bartels was arrested near Brentwood Drive after he fled authorities following the stabbing. **Air Dates:** 8/22, 8/23, 9/6

Minooka Teenager Arrested For Killing Child – The Minooka Police Department said Nicolas Fecarota, 18, of Minooka admitted during police interviews to throwing his three-week-old baby multiple times to stop him from crying at an apartment complex in the 100 block of Aux Sable Drive around 12:20 p.m. on August 24th. **Air dates:** 8/25, 8/26, 8/29, 8/30, 9/5, 9/26
