

January 5th KQNG FM93.5, KSHK FM103.1, KSRF FM95.9, KUAI AM 570

We spoke with Loren Kayfetz of the Pannell/Kayfetz Charitable Fund about bringing world class classical chamber music to Kaua'i later this year to benefit not-for-profit social service agencies on Kaua'i. His charitable fund intends to allow students to attend at no cost to help introduce the music to local student who might not otherwise hear the music and at the same time raise funds for local agencies.
