In Gary, Buffington Harbor Gateway would close eight rail crossings on Clark Road. And in Schererville, the Kennedy Avenue Railroad Overpass Project would fund final design and construction of a grade separation at a crossing with over 30 trains a day.

Groundbreaking last September includes demolition of Hub Pool and excavation of a new pond.
