During the last quarter, WPIE ascertained that **Charitable Initiatives are of major interest in our community.**

In an effort to broadcast responsive programming to address these issues, WPIE took the following action during the Third Broadcast Quarter.

WPIE aired a live interview with Cornell Men's Hockey Head Coach Mike Schafer, who helps spearhead the annual Racker Rivals Big Red Hockey Game, during *Between the Lines*. The annual exhibition game will be played at Cornell University's Lynah Rink on Saturday, July 15. Proceeds from the event will support Franziska Racker Centers' programs for people with disabilities in the Ithaca Community. The game will feature players from Cornell's Men's & Women's hockey teams, hockey celebrities, Cornell hockey coaches and members from the community.

During the last quarter, WPIE ascertained that **Charitable Initiatives, Community Events involving Recreation are of major interest to our community.**

In an effort to broadcast responsive programming to address these issues, WPIE took the following action during the Third Broadcast Quarter.

WPIE broadcast a segment on its local talk show, *Between the Lines* with Chris Stephany of the Ithaca Tompkins International Airport to promote the return of the Runway 5k. After a few years away because of COVID-19, the Runway 5k will return on September 17th, giving local runners the chance to race on the airport's runway and taxiway.

A limit of 515 runners will be allowed to compete in this early Sunday morning event, with all of the proceeds raised that day going directly to a scholarship fund for pilots to attend flight training school. The goal of the event is to raise \$50,000 to help rectify the nation's critical pilot shortage.

During the last quarter, WPIE ascertained that **Charitable Initiatives, Community Events involving Recreation are of major interest to our community.**

In an effort to broadcast responsive programming to address these issues, WPIE took the following action during the Third Broadcast Quarter.

WPIE broadcast a segment on its local talk show, *Between the Lines* with Ben Sandberg, executive director of The History Center in Tompkins County, to discuss a fundraising initiative taking place over the weekend. Ben will be biking for 24 hours around Ithaca, Tompkins County, the Finger Lakes, and parts of Central New York to raise money for a new, yearly event called *Traverse Tompkins*.

Traverse Tompkins began in the fall of 2020 as a unique fundraiser to support The History Center in Tompkins County, as Sandberg biked all around the county, exploring historical points of interest, and live streaming his adventure – riding a total of 175.1 miles and raising over \$7,500. Sandberg raised over \$10,000 in 2021 and \$13,000 in 2022, with a goal of raising more than that.

At last count, Sandberg and other community members who participated in their own unique *Traverse Tompkins* raised over \$19,000 and accumulated nearly 400 miles ridden or run.

The initiative has become a staple to fundraising efforts for the center. Sandberg also discussed upcoming exhibits coming to The History Center in Tompkins County, which includes a celebration of local sports in the area that is set to begin in February 2024.

During the last quarter, WPIE ascertained that youth and adult mental health and support is of major interest in our community.

In an effort to broadcast responsive programming to address these issues, WPIE took the following action during the Third Broadcast Quarter.

WPIE broadcast a segment on its local talk show, *Between the Lines*, promoting Dryden high school boys and girls soccer's efforts to raise awareness on mental health. The teams held "You Matter Games" to promote the importance of mental health and suicide prevention. The games stem from a previous initiative that took place during the spring to honor the memory of former Dryden lacrosse coach Matt Williams, who passed away in 2022 after his own struggles with depression and mental health issues. The team used their games to bring awareness to a program within the school district called Mental Health 101: It Matters, which includes community resources, mental health services and social emotional learning opportunities.

BTL host Nick Karski spoke with Dryden boys soccer player Tyler Franzese and Dryden School PR Specialist Lara Patz about the games, the initiatives to bring mental health to the forefront, and ways that local residents around Tompkins County could help support all of the work being done within the school community.
