Economic Development	We've shown viewers how important economic development is for communities to thrive. There's a local push to strengthen economic development partnerships, including creating a regional, economic development authority.
Crime	Crime continues to be a problem in Meridian. The city and police department are addressing the issue, but is it enough? What's being done to lower the crime rate and to stop violent crimes? WTOK is holding local officials accountable. WTOK is also focusing on domestic violence/abuse awareness and prevention.
Weather/Environment	WTOK is the local weather authority in our market. We take breaking weather/severe weather seriously and the weather stories we cover are informative and can save lives. We also cover environmental stories that impact our audience.
Drug Epidemic	Drug crimes and drug addiction are serious problems in Mississippi and Alabama. A case that sent shock waves through Chicago began when police discovered seven-months pregnant Rhoni Reuter, longtime girlfriend of legendary Chicago Bears defensive back Shaun Gayle, murdered inside her home in a quiet suburb. A media frenzy ensued as authorities searched for the killer and over three years later a jury convicted Marni Yang, a single mother of three children, who had been romantically involved with Gayle. Now, nearly a decade after receiving a double life sentence, Yang breaks her silence to "20/20" in her first television interview. "Nightline" anchor Juju Chang reports.
