## LOCAL ISSUES ADDRESSED DURING THE QUARTER

The following are local issues of concern to the community. Programs that addressed these issues during this reporting period are listed as follows.

<b>Local Issue/Concern</b>	<b>Brief description of local issue or concern</b>
Education Issues	How did local schools deal with test scores and state scores/report cards? There were several school systems in our area that received C's, D's and one school system failed. We talked to school administrators about their plans to improve public education.
Economic Development	We've shown viewers how important economic development is for communities to thrive. There's a local push to strengthen economic development partnerships, including creating a regional, economic development authority.
Crime	Crime continues to be a problem in Meridian, but it's not as bad as many think. There's a perception crime is out of control, but statistics show we have an "average" crime rate. We did several interviews with the mayor, police chief and with concerned homeowners.
Downtown Meridian Development	Development in downtown Meridian and revitalizing the downtown area have been important goals for the city. We reported on new businesses opening in downtown, including new entertainment destinations and museums and talked to city leaders about what this means for Meridian and how they're managing the growth.
Opioid/prescription Drug Epidemic	Prescription drug addiction has become a national epidemic and is destroying lives here in Mississippi. We covered opioid epidemic town hall meetings, interviewed police and drug addiction counselors about the problem and have done in-depth reports and public affairs programs about the crisis.
Tourism/Travel/Area Attractions/Recreation	Recreation is an important part of leading a balanced life and WTOK is committed to showcasing local tourist attractions, historic sites, and entertainment destinations available for both locals and visitors.
