LOCAL ISSUES ADDRESSED DURING THE QUARTER

The following are local issues of concern to the community. Programs that addressed these issues during this reporting period are listed as follows.

Local Issue/Concern	Brief description of local issue or concern
Education Issues	It's important for students to have access to a quality education as we prepare them for college and the workforce. It's also important for cities and counties to have excellent school districts because we know outstanding education systems attract new industry, businesses and jobs. The quality of the education system is the first thing employers and families look for when relocating. WTOK continues to focus on education.
Economic Development	We've shown viewers how important economic development is for communities to thrive. There's a local push to strengthen economic development partnerships, including creating a regional, economic development authority.
Crime	Crime continues to be a problem in Meridian. The city and police department are addressing the issue, but is it enough? What's being done to lower the crime rate and to stop violent crimes? WTOK is holding local officials accountable. WTOK is also focusing on domestic violence/abuse awareness and prevention.
Weather/Environment	WTOK is the local weather authority in our market. We take breaking weather/severe weather seriously and the weather stories we cover are informative and can save lives. We also cover environmental stories that impact our audience.
Drug Epidemic	Drug crimes and drug addiction are serious problems in Mississippi and Alabama. Prescription drug abuse (opioids) continues to reach crisis levels and some communities are now dealing with cocaine and heroin problems. We're tackling the problem by talking to drug and mental health experts and to law enforcement.
Tourism/Travel/Area Attractions/Recreation	Recreation is an important part of leading a balanced life and WTOK is committed to showcasing local tourist attractions, historic sites, and entertainment destinations available for both locals and visitors.

Friday, May 17, 2019

Overtured

When 19-year-old college student Mark Fisher was murdered, the public outcry was deafening. The Final Act

It took authorities five years to charge Martin, a wealthy doctor and father of eight, with Michele's murder. Now, 36 years after that tragic day, Diane's youngest child, Becky Babcock, who was born while Diane was incarcerated and adopted by another family, speaks to "20/20" in a new interview.
