Parents for public schools is hosting a series of community classes to address parents' concerns regarding education. A group of thirty parents are learning more ways to get involved in their children's education. The classes are designed to help students be successful. The guardians wrote mock letters to teachers, learned about parent teacher conferences, school board meetings, grading scales and school codes. The classes are a four day commitment. The participants will meet next in November. Parents for public schools will take new applications next year in march
Good Morning Meridian	10/3/16 6am/:30sec	A bond issue is being proposed to pay for a multi-million dollar school project in Newton County. Voters will decide if they want to pay for a performing arts center at the high school in Decatur. Nearly half of middle and high school students in the Newton County School District are in fine arts programs. Classes are large and school officials say there isn't a large enough space for performances. To compensate for the growing fine arts program the Newton County Supervisors have proposed a plan to build a Newton County School District Performing Arts Facility. Residents have a chance to approve a 9 million dollar bond issue to pay for the 11.5 million dollar project. It would take 60% of the vote to pass.

USA's Tutwiler College of Education was one of four colleges in the nation chosen for the grant from the U.S. Department of Education. The funding will help UWA to recruit, train, and support teachers in rural communities.
News @ 6	10/19/16 6pm/1:30 min	Each year, the Mississippi Children's Museum in Jackson inspires learning in thousands of children across the state. But one group is making an effort to bring that love of education to kids in Meridian. The city is now one big step closer to having a children's museum open for learning. Tuesday night the city council approved a request to lease land near Bonita Lakes for the project. The area by Bonita Lakes where the museum would be built is unique in that its 16 th section land—set aside for educational purposes.

Live @ 5	10/26/16 5pm/1:35min	<p>This is a week to make the message loud and clear for kids... that drugs are dangerous and they should avoid them at all costs. Philadelphia schools are doing special events all week to get the message of Red Ribbon Week out. This year's slogan for Red Ribbon Week is "YOLO : you only live once, so be smart and don't start." Throughout the week they have different projects and program about how to be drug free. Drug education videos are shown to students and they talk about the long-term effects of drug addictions.</p>

It's not required in Mississippi, but as Courtney Ann Jackson explains—the state is pouring more money into the programs. Public and private schools offer Pre-K, but the public schools that are just starting their programs often have limited slots available; private centers cost money. The state is already giving money to ten collaborative centers around the state. Now they've got an extra million to fund four more networks. When they reach kindergarten. But they'll also have a better chance of success down the road.</p>
Good Morning Meridian	11/21/16 6am/:30sec	<p>Despite an eventful couple of days in discussions, the public is no closer to knowing what changes lawmakers will consider to the current Mississippi adequate education program. Senate president Pro Tem Terry Burton of Newton says he favors having more public hearings in locations around the state. However, he says whether or not that will happen is being left up to the group Ed-Build. However, the head of the agency disagrees, and say that's actually the decision about whether there will be more hearings will be made by legislative leaders.</p>
New @ 5	12/9/16 5pm/1:45sec	<p>Mississippi's Superintendent of Education made a stop in Union today to commend the school district for its "A" rating. Mississippi State Superintendent, Dr. Carey Wright, finished her celebration of excellence tour at the 8th ranked district in the state. The elementary schools also had the top growth in reading and math in the state. There are a number of requirements to meet the "A" district rating received by Union and other schools. Proficiency, graduation rates, ACT scores, and year-to-year growth all factor in.</p>

The Secretary of State's office will reprint more than 2.7 million ballots from Alabama's election ballots in November. The original ballot left off language that prevented the legislature from using any money for the upkeep of the park system for other purposes. Amendment 2 would give the State's Department of Private Entities to operate hotels and golf courses in the state. It was sponsored by Sen. Clay Scofield.
News @ 5p	10/27/16 5pm/2:00 min	This Presidential election has certainly stirred emotions and interests...and it's putting an extra strain on election workers. Philadelphia Bureau reporter Lindsey Jennings says they're seeing tremendous turnout for absentee voting in Neshoba County. The Presidential Election is right around the corner and circuit clerk offices around the U.S. are bombarded with extra work trying to prepare for the big day. Neshoba County Circuit Clerk's office has seen an increase in absentee voters leaving the office shorthanded. The Circuit Clerk's office requested an additional 7500 dollars in the 2017 budget but it was denied. After explaining the amount of work during the election split between three people, the board reconsidered and granted 5000 dollars to hire a part-time employee, but the Circuit Clerk says hiring someone this late into the process would be difficult.

He says more than 1 million people voted in Mississippi on November 8 th , and 560 of those who did, did not show a driver's license, nor any other form of government-issued ID at the polls. This was the first presidential election for Mississippi's voter ID law to be in place. People who did not have ID on them on election day were able to vote by affidavit ballot, and then take an ID to their circuit clerk's office at a later time.
News @ 6p	12/2/16 6pm/:30 sec	A U.S. District judge is considering whether to dismiss a lawsuit over a 2015 Mississippi election that went to a drawing of straws. John Corlew represents voters who filed suit. He says legislators violated their constitutional right of equal protection by tossing out ballots that local officials had ruled were properly cast. The lawsuit demands that former Rep. Bo Eaton of Taylorsville be seated in place of Rep. Mark Tullos of Raleigh. The election in Smith and Jasper counties was certified a tie, and Eaton won by drawing straws. But the House of Representatives declared Tullos the winner.
Good Morning Meridian	12/19/16 6am/:30 sec	Members of the Electoral College expected to make it official later today—casting their votes to confirm President-Elect Trump's election. With the electoral college set to vote tomorrow, Trump's aides are pushing back against those allegations that his win was influenced by Russian hackers. If there is this conclusive opinion among all of these intelligence agencies, then they should issue a report or they should stand in front of a camera and make the case.

Organizers say they want kids to know they don't have to follow the wrong path in life. "One thing we talk about is the picture. You can't change a picture, but you can step outside of a window by starting to look at yourself and wanting to make a change. Not only for yourself, but for your family and your community." Wilburn says CYE puts on several events like this throughout the year.

The Lauderdale County Sheriff's department shut down two parties over the weekend—one in Causeyville and the other in Lauderdale community. Attorney Joseph Denson explains how the social hosting law works: "It's a law under the sales land section of the Mississippi code. It deals with anyone over the age of 21 that gives or sells and provides for alcohol beverage to be give to someone under the age of 18" Doctor of clinical psychology Lin Hogan is certified in advance alcohol and drug counseling at Weems. He says parents shouldn't host drinking parties for their kids. "We don't want to be fostering potential drug or alcohol problems saying yes its okay to drink at this facility, home, on the land, or something like that. It's just not safe." Dr. Hogan says—Youth who are exposed to alcohol or drugs early in life have a higher chance to develop an addiction in their adult life.

News @ 6	10/6/16 6pm/ 1:45min	<p>Officials at Mississippi Power say we are only a few weeks away from the plant’s completion, and they’re anxious to finally see it happen. After years of construction, the Kemper County Coal Plant is almost completely operational. Mississippi Power’s CEO says there’s only a few steps left to bring the plant to life. As of September, the coal plant is successfully producing syngas through both gasifiers—two huge milestones.</p>
Live @ Five	10/11/16 5pm/ :30 sec	<p>State officials are affirming a permit that allows the Kemper County Coal Plant to discharge water into a creek during high rainfall. The Department of Environmental Quality’s Permit Board voted today to reissue the permit with minor changes... The company is only supposed to let water flow from a holding pond into a creek after three days of heavy rainfall. Environmental officials say the holding pond water isn’t harmful.</p>
Good Morning Meridian	10/20/16 6am/:25sec	<p>New cost estimates say the power plant in Kemper County will cost much more to operate than originally thought. Mississippi Power says project operation and maintenance will be a billion dollars over its first five years. That’s four times more than was originally projected. The amount of equipment, material and employees at the plant has increased sharply as the plant’s total cost has ballooned to 6.9 billion dollars.</p>
Good Morning Meridian	11/16/16 6am/:30sec	<p>A new report warns against tax changes that could subsidize Mississippi Power’s Kemper County Coal Plant even more.</p> <p>The report is now being released by the environment group, “Friend of the Earth.” It states that the plant could receive another 700 million dollars in federal tax subsidies. The report is calling on congress to exact changes before the end of this year to prevent the Kemper Coal Plant from getting more subsidies. That facility is expected to open at the end of this year.</p>

News @ 10p	11/30/16 10pm/2:00 min	<p>The Kemper County Power Plant is one of the most expensive power plants ever built. It's more than two years past its projected deadline so far, it's four billion over budget. The company now says the plant should be in full service by the end of this year. However, some are still skeptical about the plant's future. The total cost for this massive plant is now up to nearly 7 billion dollars. The part that converts lignite coal into gas is what's not operational. Once it's all online—they'll get the chance to request rate adjustments or increases.</p>
News @ 10p	12/2/16 10pm/:25 sec	<p>Mississippi Power says it's likely to miss another deadline on its Kemper County Power Plant. Southern Company says it likely won't complete the plant until January. That means Mississippi Power must borrow \$250 million from Southern Company to repay federal tax credits already claimed. The plant and associated coal mine were originally supposed to cost 2.9 billion at most. It was supposed to be finished by May 2014. Customers could be asked to pay as much as 4.2 billion more.</p>

Firefighters brought their concerns including lack of leadership, inability to effectively communicate, failure to respond to firefighter safety concerns, fiscal decision-making priorities, and lack of overall concern for the well-being of union members to the city council in hopes for a change. Mayor Percy Bland is backing Chief Anthony Clayton saying there have been no complaints in the past 7 years. He says at this point no one is being terminated and there needs to be better communication.
Good Morning Meridian	10/28/16 6am/1:50 min	We begin this morning with a need for new police officers in Meridian...and police say a new recruitment effort appears to be working. Police say they're currently about thirty officers below full strength right now... but they've just started recruiting new officers...and with a new pay structure, that recruitment seems to be working so far. Calling anyone who would like to be a police. The Meridian Police Department has put out an application test for those who want to be part of Meridian's finest.
News @ 10p	11/1/16 10pm/ 2:00 min	The city of meridian is making it easier for people to see in some poorly lit areas. City council members have approved more LED lighting upgrades that will extend all the way from interstate 20 to the 22 nd Avenue bridge. Workers from the Parks and Recreation have also installed lights at Planet Playground, which is currently undergoing some upgrades. Not only that, but lights will be installed at the James Chaney Park which spans all the way from Paulding Road to 39 th Street. In the park a playground will be added before the end of the year. Council members say they approved the new lights for safety concerns that have been presented by residents, who feel that the brighter lights will help reduce crime and unwanted activities at night.

The City Council will be voting later today to approve a grant for new playground equipment for James Chaney Park. There is also a push to upgrade all of the city's playgrounds to be accessible for people with disabilities. One of those facilities is Planter Playground, where city officials are hoping for another community build, like the original. Councilman Thomas says the person who originally designed Planet Playground says it would take about 250 to 300 thousand dollars just to bring it back to how it originally was.</p>
Live @ Five	11/15/16 5pm/1:30 sec	<p>The Meridian City Council voted tonight to take another big step toward a multi-million dollar project. A private group has been working to raise the funds for a children's museum at Bonita Lakes...and tonight the council voted to help them move forward. Meridian City Council voted to lease six acres of land to the Mississippi Children's Museum. It was a 3-2 vote, council president Kim Houston voted in favor of the order to lease the land. Councilwoman Barbara Henson and councilman Randy Hammon voted against the agreement. Hammond voiced concern that the land should be preserved. Community member Peg Wahrendroff asked council to reconsider their decision and recommended the organization to find another destination.</p>

City council members were brought up to speed at a work session today about proposed improvements for the E-911 system. On this day he proposed to the city council major upgrades for the Fire Department's system, along with some that would help officers transfer information they gather while on patrol.</p>

During this week...experts shine a light on mental illness in our communities, in an effort to replace stigma with understanding. Government health data shows that about one in 5 million Americans live with a mental illness—about 50 million people. A mental illness may result from a traumatic experience, genetics, a life event, or a stressful job. And they can impact thinking, feeling, and behavior. Experts say early signs can include pulling away from family and friends, feeling extreme highs or lows, sleeping too much or too little, feeling helpless, substance abuse, and suicidal thoughts. These disorders can be serious and require medical treatment. The key to getting better is getting education, getting proper care...and fighting the stigma.</p>

Residents in the Lauderdale Community say what seemed like innocent fun, went downhill at a house party in the neighborhood. A total of 18 people were arrested for underage drinking. Doctor of Clinical Psychology Lin Hogan is certified in advance alcohol and drug counseling at Weems. He says parents shouldn't host drinking parties for their kids. Dr. Hogan says" Youth who are exposed to alcohol or drugs early in life have a higher chance to develop and addiction in their adult life.</p>
Live @ Five	10/20/16 5pm/1:05min	<p>With 66% of the world's population expected to be living in cities by the year 2050...mental health professionals are putting a new emphasis on reducing the negative impacts of urban life. Three things can help you reduce the stress of city living. The first recommendation: go to the park living close to or spending time in green spaces can decrease the risk of depression. Next up: get out of your car walking or cycling to work is better for your physical and mental health. Finally: be aware of your environment. Mindfully observing the area around you can help restore a sense of control. Loud noises keeping you up at night? Find the source even though you may not be able to stop it, knowing the cause can reduce your stress because it increases that feeling of control.</p>

Last night, the first responders who were on the scene of that crash gathered to support each other. The chief of the Hickory Volunteer Fire Department says it's important that the first responders know that they're not alone in trying to cope with this tragedy. "The mental health of our first responders is our utmost priority. Anytime we have a tragic accident like this we get together as a family, speak in private, and let everyone know that we're all going through the same feelings and just help one another heal." Counseling services are also being offered on all campuses within the Newton County School District. Officials from Weems Community Mental Health Center say children should be handled with care when dealing with these type of situations. Weems Community Mental Health Center has a crisis line that is open to the public. That number is 1-800-803-0245. Its open seven days a week, and 24 hours a day.</p>
<p>News @ 10</p>	<p>12/15/16 10pm/1:30</p>	<p>The number of overdose deaths caused by opioid drugs rose sharply in 2015. That's according to data released by the centers for disease control and prevention. Nationwide more than 33 thousand people died from opioid overdoses last year... Compared to nearly 29 thousand the year before. There were 9580 caused specifically by overdoses of synthetic opioids last year. That's an increase of about 73%. By comparison, deaths attributed to heroin rose by just 23% over the same time period. The CDC says the United States is in the middle of an opioid overdose epidemic—at least half of all deaths connected to opioid overdoses involve a prescription version of the drug. Drugs are now the leading cause of accidental death in this country. Fatal overdoses surpassed shooting deaths and traffic accidents year ago. Health experts say too many people still do not have access to effective substance abuse treatment.</p>

News @ 10	12/23/16 10pm/1:50	<p>There's a new development tonight in a road rage case from around the region. It involved a 3 year old boy being shot and killed in Arkansas last Saturday. The suspect was turned in to authorities last night by his family members. During this holiday season road rage—and overall stress—are not uncommon. Clinical psychologist Dr. Lin Hogan from Weems Community Mental Health Center says it's important for drivers to plan ahead before hitting the road. "Remember that when you're going to be driving there is a high likelihood that someone is going to pull out in front of you, or if you happen to see road rage the best thing you can do is to drive defensively."</p>
