LOCAL ISSUES ADDRESSED DURING THE QUARTER

The following are local issues of concern to the community. Programs that addressed these issues during this reporting period are listed as follows.

Local Issue/Concern	Brief description of local issue or concern
Health	The coronavirus pandemic continues to impact the United States and in our communities in Mississippi and Alabama. But other health issues existed before and have grown from the harm caused by the pandemic. WTOK is committed to serving its largely rural and economically disadvantaged audience with information to help them be safer and healthier.
Economy	Inflation and higher prices are being felt by everyone, regardless of their level of income. State and federal legislative actions affect people across our viewing area. People want to be informed of what is happening in Washington, Jackson and Montgomery.
Crime	Crime continues to be a problem in Meridian. The city and police department are addressing the issue, but is it enough? What's being done to lower the crime rate and to stop violent crimes? WTOK is holding local officials accountable. WTOK is also focusing on domestic violence/abuse awareness and prevention.
Weather/Environment	WTOK is the local weather authority in our market. We take breaking weather/severe weather seriously and the weather stories we cover are informative and can save lives. We also cover environmental stories that impact our audience.
Drug Epidemic	Drug crimes and drug addiction are serious problems in Mississippi and Alabama. Prescription drug abuse (opioids) continues to reach crisis levels and some communities are now dealing with cocaine and heroin problems. We're tackling the problem by talking to drug and mental health experts and to law enforcement.
Social Services	WTOK's coverage area has some of the most economically disadvantaged populations in Mississippi and Alabama, which are often impacted the most by problems of crime, mental illness, homelessness, lack of an educated workforce and lack of available health care. It also has some of the most generous and caring people. WTOK highlights these issues and the solutions and potential solutions made possible by the people who live here.

When police arrived, they found Dawn dead and Antonio fighting for his life — a fight he soon lost — and authorities singled out AJ as the prime suspect. Almost a decade later, the case has gone to trial twice, each time ending in a hung jury. However, bombshell new evidence, previously overlooked, upended the case and finally brought a legal resolution.
