

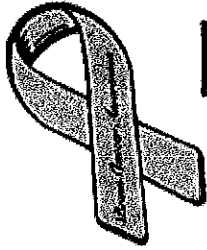
Bluff City Radio LLC Programs to deal with Issues: October, November and December, 2015
