WEEK OF OCTOBER 1

- 3 people shot in an Albany nightclub. One would later die of his injuries. Albany's 13th homicide of the year
- Latest Siena poll shows Gov. Cuomo with a substantial lead over challenger Marc Molinaro
- Two separate fires in Albany leave a total of 70 people homeless. Both houses later had to be torn down
- Albany mayor Kathy Sheehan unveils her proposed budget for 2019. It includes a \$90 trash fee for single-family homes
- Montgomery County officials looking for missing woman. Michaela MacVillia would later be found murdered
- Residents in East Greenbush speak out about Regeneron's plans for an \$800 million expansion of their facility
- Frontier Town, once a popular North Country tourist destination, re-opens as an equestrian campground and community area.

WEEK OF OCTOBER 8

- Complete coverage of a limousine accident in Schoharie County that killed 20 people. 18 people in the car, including four sisters, died. Two people in the parking lot of the Apple Barrel Country Store were killed. This was the deadliest incident in the Capital Region since 20 died when the "Ethan Allen" tour boat went down in Lake George in 2005. This was, without question, the most significant story of the year, and continues to make headlines. We're still waiting for a formal report from the NTSB.
- Vigils in Amsterdam and Schoharie for those killed in the limo crash
- And more on another big story from 2018. Albany Police Chief Eric Hawkins defends his department's investigation into the officer-involved shooting of Ellazar Williams, who was left paralyzed when shot by Detective James Olsen.
- Nauman Hussein, operator of Prestige Limo, is arrested on 1 count of Criminally Negligent Homicide in connection with the Schoharie limo crash
- Funeral services begin for the victims of the limo crash, including four sisters and their husbands

This would become a major story, as the city changes its dangerous dog laws, and finally a deal is reached to spare Luna if she behaves for two years. State Sen. Jim Tedisco even petitioned Gov. Cuomo to "pardon" Luna.
- Icy conditions after a minor snowfall lead to major problems on area highways

New York's 'Do Not Call List' Not Being Enforced – An audit of the state agency in charge of the New York's Do Not Call List found that only a few of the hundreds of thousands of annual complaints actually are investigated. Between 2016 and 2017, only 2 complaints of 400,000 were referred to the Department of State's Division of Consumer Protection resulting in only \$44,000 in fines.

A Gloversville Middle School student is being credited with helping save the life of an elderly man who collapsed at a Cumberland Farms in Gloversville. Alan Welkey says he walked into the store, was having trouble breathing and collapsed to the floor and knew he was in trouble. 13-year-old Luke Page and his mom came to the rescue. Welkey said he still has to have surgery, but that he's doing much better, thanks to that chance meeting. He says Luke is his hero.

Oct 8, 2018 8:35 5 Mins

20 Killed in Limo Crash – 20 young adults were killed when a limo crashed over a ravine, making it the 2nd largest motor vehicle fatality. The 20 were headed to celebrate the birthday of one of the passengers. The limo had failed inspections and should not have been on the road. The company is facing lawsuits and criminal charges.

Oct 10, 2018 6:35 5 Mins

Saratoga Springs school board rejects arming grounds monitors – The school district has utilized SRO's for years, but have found a rule that allowed them to disarm them. There has been quite a bit of public outcry and parents are fighting for armed guards to be reinstated.

Oct 12, 2018 7:05 5 Mins

How to survive a limo crash – After the limo crash in Schoharie that killed 20 people, Deborah A.P. Hersman, president and CEO of the National Safety Council gave ways to protect yourself if you were in a limo crash. Tips include using seat belts if the limo has them and asking the limo company who expanded the limo size; Ford and GM both have safety programs in place.

Oct 16, 2018 8:35 5 Mins

Aurora Games – The Times Union Center announced a multi-day women's festival that includes sporting events and entertainment. Olympic athletes will be in attendance and will offer meet and greets.

Oct 18, 2018 6:05 5 Mins

Driver almost kills girl getting off school bus – A 7-year-old girl in Pittstown, MA was getting off of her school bus when a driver sped by, passing the bus on the right side of the road. Luckily, the girl was not hurt, but the driver has not been found.

St. Claire's Hospital cuts pensions – The former hospital announced they are cutting pensions

Oct 24, 2018 6:35 5 Mins

Baby Rayen – 4 month old Rayen was murdered by his mother Heaven Puleski. His body was found behind a building in Schenectady after days of searching.

Oct 29, 2018 6:05 5 Mins

Flea Market Discrimination – the Phoenicia Flea Market received criticism after denying a vendor after discovering that she made public posts on her Facebook page that contained hateful content. The Flea Market who prides itself on being all inclusive, apologized but declined to allow the vendor to participate.

Oct 29, 2018 8:35 5 Mins

Cohoes Community Center Closes – The Community Center closed it's doors without notice due to financial hardship leaving their employees without their final paychecks. It was discovered that there was a mismanagement of money. SEFCU came through for the employees and donated money to cover their last wages.

Nov 2, 2018 5:35 5 Mins

Distraction Robberies – Distraction robberies are occurring in the capital region, including on Blessings in Slingerlands. A person showed up and told the homeowner they needed to check the "lines" in the back of their property. While the homeowner was distracted with one suspect, another went into the house and stole money from her purse. Additional robberies took place in North Greenbush and Rotterdam.

Nov 6, 2018 8:05 5 Mins

Niskayuna Lockdown – A lockdown took place at Niskayuna High School after a threatening note was found. For hours, students weren't allowed to use restrooms or eat. Parents were upset and demanded better planning in case incidents like this occurred again in the future.

Election Coverage – Various Guest joined to discuss the local elections including Governor and the Rensselaer County DA.

Nov 11, 2018 7:35 5 Mins

Corinth Woman Killed – A woman was killed by her husband accidentally while he was cleaning his gun. She left behind 3 kids.

No Threat at Mohonasen – A Schalmont student posted a threat on social media against students and teachers at Mohonasen Central School. Officials and police said that they investigated and interviewed the student and deemed the treat not credible.

Volunteers with Concerned for The Hungry handed out hundreds of boxes of food for those in need for Thanksgiving. The boxes included canned goods, turkeys and food donated by local farmers. The organization has been fighting hunger since 1979.

1 year since Cohoes Fire – The Cohoes fire that took down a good portion of the city was remembered as 1 year had passed. The fire was started accidentally by a man trying to recreate a scene from a tv show.

Disabled Hockey Players Robbed – Disabled hockey players were playing a game when a woman stole thousands of dollars from their locker room. She was found, arrested and the money was returned.
