Safyre and her crew took the stuffed animals to the Schenectady Center for Rehabilitation and Nursing to be washed and dried in industrial sized machines. They're headed to local police agencies and ambulance companies so first responders have something to offer a sad or hurt child when they respond to a call. Safyre, of course, has been an inspiration to the community for her recovery, positive attitude and charity work.

Wednesday, July 12 7:45 4 minutes

- It was a birthday party to remember when 5-year-old Bryce, who has autism, was surprised with a party given by his heroes -- local first responders. The idea was born when an Albany County Sheriff's deputy stopped by the house to change the battery in Bryce's Project Lifesaver monitor. Bryce's mom told the deputy no one came to the child's birthday party last year -- so she asked if officers could stop by and say hello this year. Instead, they threw a big party, with Menands police and fire departments, and the sheriff's office. The first responders got Bryce his own set of gear and a helmet, and an electric car he can drive, that looks just like a Menands patrol car.

Wednesday, July 25 6:15 4 minutes

- A very cute local video goes viral. The ice cream aisle at the Price Chopper in Malta, turned romantic when a would-be groom proposed to his girlfriend. The man grabbed a pint of Ben & Jerry's labeled "Marry Me Mint" AND ASKED HER...."HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF THIS FLAVOR???" She said yes. Angelo and Kelly, will be married September of next year.

Wednesday, August 2 6:15 4 minutes

- A former Scotia-Glenville football star gave of himself, quite literally, to help a sick baby. Mike Mushaw of Scotia now plays football for Central Connecticut State and his football team is part of the "Be The Match" program, a group that helps connect potential donors to people in need. He's donated bone marrow to help the sick infant. They take marrow from the pelvic bone with a needle and can leave donors weak and sore. He's had to miss some training, at least a couple of weeks, but it was well worth it. Mushaw does not know who the recipient of his donation is, and he may never know. He said there is a six-month waiting period to learn if the transplant worked, and if the recipient's family wants to contact him.

Wednesday, August 9 7:45 4 minutes

- Hundreds of bikers hit the road for the second annual upstate New York Wounded Veteran Run. This year, the event benefits Paul Miosek, who nearly lost his life serving the country during Operation Desert Shield. Miosek came into contact with a high voltage power cable, was in a coma for six weeks and lost both of his legs. At times he thought no one cared but not any more. Led by the State Police, bikers began their route in Brunswick and ended it with a barbecue in Clifton Park. Last year, their first year, the Wounded Vet Run raised \$8,000 for another wounded veteran. Organizers say they doubled that this year for Paul.

Wednesday, August 16 6:15 4 minutes

- A Rotterdam letter carrier made an unscheduled delivery Saturday, saving a turtle from an ugly end. While on his route, he spotted the turtle crossing Dunnsville Road, parked his truck and gave the turtle a lift to the other side. A Rotterdam resident took a picture posted it on Facebook and the letter carrier was an instant hero. The Facebook poster wrote, " He was a young guy and so quickly and naturally picked up the turtle and placed him safely in the grass. My son and I clapped for him, as he walked back to his vehicle, and smiled at us. It was very sweet to see this young man taking the time to help that little creature."

- A lemonade stand in Ballston Spa was shutdown by the state health department roared back to life this weekend and for a good cause. 7-year old Brendan Mulvaney got shutdown when some vendors at the Saratoga County Fair complained, but that was short-lived. He reopened Saturday was given the key to the village by the mayor and raised a bunch of money for his 12-year old friend Maddy who's scheduled to have surgery today at Shriner's Hospital. Thanks to Brendan and his family and donations of lemonade for the stand, they raised more than \$900 for Maddy and her family.

- A great tribute in Schenectady, to our veterans. Officials over the weekend unveiled the newly refurbished "George Westinghouse and Bellevue Veterans Park". The renovations at the park included a new flagpole, refurbished memorial plaques, monument restoration, new lighting and new signage.

- Eleven people who are all over the age of 100 were honored last week in Schenectady. All 11 of them live at Kingsway Community in Schenectady and they were grateful for the recognition. A lot of family came by for the party which was truly a celebration more than 100 years in the making.

- Wednesday, September 13       6:15    4 minutes

- A nice move by a local Orthodontist's office to help kids who need braces and, of course in the process, their parents. Adirondack Orthodontics is teaming up with the non-profit "Smiles Changes Lives" to provide up to 25 area "kids in need", with braces and with years of follow-up exams, free of charge. Doctors say most of the participants will probably be 11- to 13-years-old because kids that age are often at the point where serious orthodontic work could make a permanent difference.

- Wednesday, September 20       6:15    4 minutes

- A local 15 year old is being hailed as a hero on Facebook and elsewhere after coming to the rescue of two young girls trapped in an SUV. Anthony Powers was on his way to soccer practice

earlier this month when he saw the SUV hit by another car on Route 147 in Galway. The SUV veered off the road, into a ditch and started smoking. Not knowing if anyone was still inside the vehicle, he ran toward it, against the wishes of his mother who was driving him to practice. There were some minor injuries but everyone is fine. Not surprisingly perhaps, Anthony hopes some day, to be a firefighter.
