This year, the program is on track to provide about 12 million pounds of food. That's about 10 million meals throughout the region.

Shaker students Gerard Rhatigan and Ben Olsen, along with Ben's mother Patricia, were able to save the 6 year old's life by pulling her from the water. Teresa was back home, watching TV, safe and sound, about a half-hour later.

• A group of Capital Region barbers were a cut above over the weekend. The Troy Boys and Girls Club was packed with barbers offering free haircuts for the homeless and veterans. More than a dozen barbers from shops across the community donated their time and talents. Organizers say something as simple as a fresh haircut can make all the difference in a time of need. In addition to the free cut, the homeless and vets were also given a free hot meal thanks to donations from the 99 Restaurant.
