

Wednesday, July 5                      6:15    4 minutes

- The Power to Push Team is at it again. Shaun and Seamus Evans are a local father and son team who ran across the country last year. Well, dad Shaun ran and pushed his 11 year old son in a wheelchair for Ainsley's Angels, an organization that helps special needs children across the country. This summer the run stretches 1700 miles to Louisiana. They have already donated one chair to a 10 year old girl.

Wednesday, July 12                    7:45    4 minutes

- The best lemonade in town was found in Albany at the South End Children's Café. The Cafe is a free restaurant serving low-income families, modeled after Jon Bon Jovi's Soul Kitchen. The kids at the cafe put up a lemonade stand. They made all the refreshments themselves and managed the stand. Their hard work brought in \$430 that will help feed families this summer.

Wednesday, July 19                    6:15    4 minutes

- In Burnt Hills, a really cool movement started by a 7 year old. It's the Kindness Rocks project ...the brainchild of Stella Kibler, who just finished up 2nd grade. It started with a few rocks from her back yard that she painted and wrote inspirational and supportive messages on and then left, anonymously, for friends and neighbors. But it's grown and Stella's up to 50 kindness rocks that she now leaves in public places, for complete strangers.

Wednesday, July 26                    6:15    4 minutes

- Marilyn Cataldo a 70-year-old Albany woman has unofficially broken a national powerlifting record deadlifting 281 pounds earlier this month in the Liberty Games competition in Latham. She lifted six more pounds than the current record-holder for her age and weight class, but to be "official" she'll have to do it in a national competition....and she plans to.... some time next year.

Wednesday, August 2                   7:45    4 minutes

- A nice response to a local crime victim who also was getting grief from his neighbors. 28-year-old Hutson Matthews had f-words and racial slurs painted on his SUV and the vandals even urinated inside, slashed the seats and removed entire parts of the car. To make matters worse, neighbors were upset because their kids were seeing the bad words as the vehicle sat in the driveway on Van Cortland Street in Schenectady. Nate Ryan of Rotterdam read about the backlash through social media and even though he didn't know Matthews got a couple of friends together, went to Mathews' home and cleaned off the paint.

Wednesday, August 9                   6:15    4 minutes

- Great work by a Schenectady High School sophomore who collected and cleaned dozens of teddy bears to donate to kids in memory of her late grandmother. Isabella Smarro donated the teddy bears to a bunch of local groups including Quest Schenectady, which provides a safe place for kids to go during the day. The Teddy bears also went to Raindrops Closet of Schenectady, which helps homeless children and to local fire and police departments to give to kids impacted by crime, fires or accidents.

Wednesday, August 16 7:45 4 minutes

- Diane Ferrara has had a tough couple of years. She learned she had breast cancer in 2015, had a bilateral mastectomy and they removed all the tissue and chest muscles. Then, over the last two years, Diane lost her job, broke her ankle and back, had knee replacement surgery and buried both of her parents. Despite that, she arrived at Turnpike Tresses salon in Duanesburg to help surprise a cancer survivor with a makeover. She had no idea that SHE was the surprise makeover recipient.

Wednesday, August 23 6:15 4 minutes

- In Queensbury, the community came together to help two boys whose mother and sister were killed. A fundraiser was held at Sky Zone to raise money for the two pre-teen boys Crystal also had.

Wednesday, August 30 7:45 4 minutes

- What an inspiration for people of all ages. Bridget Simpson just completed a little swim, 32 miles, the entire length of Lake George from the village all the way up to Diane's Rock in Ticonderoga. It took her 28-hours and six-minutes, making the Ticonderoga woman 11th person to make the nonstop swim. Even more remarkable, at age 49, she's also now the oldest to do it.

Wednesday, September 6 6:15 4 minutes

- Despite the lousy weather, truckers turned out for the fair's annual "Convoy for a Cause". The truckers raised a ton of money which is going to WGY Christmas Wish and Leatherstocking Honor Flight which flies veterans to Washington D.C. to tour war memorials. Thanks to Richard Kennedy, the Fonda Fair President, his crew and all the truckers who were so generous with their time and their money.

Wednesday, September 13 6:15 4 minutes

- In Clifton Park, Pai's Taekwondo hosted a free bullying class for local kids to teach them about bullying and how to stand up for themselves. Master Instructor Jake Allen says he teaches the kids to use good eye contact, a firm voice and strong posture...and how to ask for help if they need it.

Wednesday, September 20 6:15 4 minutes

- An impressive job done by an air ambulance company that flies among other places out of the Schenectady County Airport. A local crew from REVA was called-in after 150-mile-an-hour winds from Hurricane Irma destroyed St Thomas' airport and hospital. The Schenectady crew was able to successfully evacuate a U.S. soldier, who also happened to be 35 weeks pregnant. It was an incredible story. The company unveiled a new long-range aircraft that wasn't supposed to be put in service yet, and a truck had to plow away downed trees so the crews could make a landing near the pregnant soldier's home. They flew the soldier safely to Bethesda and BOTH, we're told are doing well.
