Wednesday, January 4 6:15 4 minutes

- A local brother and sister fighting a rare lung disease that keeps them on oxygen at all times, got their wish granted this week. The Make-a-Wish Foundation sent 5-year old Callan and 3-year old Charlotte Farrell to Disney World. Not only that but the kids got a huge sendoff with fire trucks and police vehicles flashing their lights; there was a limo and even Santa turned up in his sleigh.

Wednesday, January 11 7:45 4 minutes

- A bunch of wounded veterans and their families took to the slopes Friday at Windham Mountain. It's an annual event aimed at providing the vets with a chance to continue their healing in a unique fashion. They say learning to ski or snowboard helps them re-ignite their "can do" spirit. Dolly Harris, is a retired Army major and this is her third trip to Windham Mountain to take part in the "Warriors in Motion" Learn-to-Ski-and-Snowboard event.

Wednesday, January 18 6:15 4 minutes

- In Saratoga, the Solomon Charitable Trust awarded "Camp Abilities - Saratoga" , \$6,000 grant. The money will be used to purchase and fill a storage trailer for the camp's sports equipment. Camp Abilities Saratoga caters to kids who are visually and hearing impaired and helps them become physically active through sports.

Wednesday, January 25 6:15 4 minutes

- A bunch of local people hit the street for Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York's annual "Neighborhood Food Drive". They do it every year at this time because the food banks supplies always get very low right after the holidays. For the Van Woerts, it's a family affair with all the kids helping, who were going door-to-door picking up donations in Latham.

Wednesday, February 8 7:45 4 minutes

- In Altamont, two children suffering from congenital heart defects, along with a lot of help from the grown-ups, are giving back to the community, making and delivering handmade hats to babies in area hospitals and raising awareness of heart disease. 5 year old Ryan Galvin5 and 3-year old Preston Stewart, with an assist from the owners of the "Spinning Room yarn shop" handed out the hats as part of the Heart Association's "little heads, big hearts" campaign.

Wednesday, February 15 6:15 4 minutes

- In Schenectady, about two dozen students from Niskayuna and Schenectady high schools recently braved the cold and handed out nearly 500 donated winter scarves throughout the city as a gift to people in need. The CDTA donated the transportation for the kids, who also attached some inspirational notes to the scarves.

Wednesday, February 22 7:45 4 minutes

- Pet lovers went bowling for a good cause over the weekend - the annual PAWS fundraiser. Paws is a program run by the Albany Damien Center which helps people living with HIV take care of their pets.

Wednesday, March 1

6:15 4 minutes

- A Shenendahowa grad is living in New York City, singing on the subway, playing his guitar and making a difference. Will Boyajian, performs in the 42 Street/Times Square stop, collects plenty of cash with his singing, but he gives away every dime before calling it a day. He has a sign on his guitar case that says, "If you're homeless or need help, take as much as you need from the case." Boyajian, who graduated from Shen in 2008, says he makes as much as \$400 a day. He says only a handful of people have actually cleared out the entire guitar case. If there's leftover, he hands the rest out on the street. Boyajian saved up money for the project by spending eight months as a performer on Norwegian cruise lines. The 26-year-old started his "#Hopeful Cases" campaign a couple of weeks ago and wants to change the way New Yorkers think about giving. He's also had interest from people in L.A. and Chicago who want to do the same. Boyajian is going to be leaving New York City later this month to act in a Capital Rep production of "They Built America: The Workers of the Erie Canal." Then, he'll be back on a cruise ship, entertaining from April through December.

Wednesday, March 8

7:45 4 minutes

- Two Bethlehem Middle School students are being recognized for helping a stranger in need. The school district says Peyton Roach and Marissa Gourd were waiting for the school bus one morning last week when they noticed an older man had fallen to the ground and couldn't get up. Marissa stayed with the man while Peyton ran to get her parents. Police were called and helped the man get to his feet. He's now doing fine.

Wednesday, March 15

6:15 4 minutes

- There's a great program in Troy helping dogs in trouble by putting them together with local veterans who suffer from PTSD. Joni Bonilla is the founder of Operation At Ease. She finds rescue dogs and helps the vets train them as service dogs, of which there are too few with very long waiting lists. But the program needs money to continue and a 17-year old senior at Emma Willard is coming to the rescue. Rosemarie Davidson has battled depression in the past and has her own therapy dog. She says she needed to do something to help THIS program...and she has. She's raised \$16,000 dollars so far and has a goal of \$20,000 which will allow "Operation At Ease" to get it's own space.

Wednesday, March 22

6:15 4 minutes

- A local realtor wants to make people feel at home when they move into a new neighborhood. Alexander Monticello has been giving away yard signs that read "Welcome to our neighborhood" in English and a dozen other languages. He says it's not a political statement, he just believes it's a good message and good business.
