(2) *Wanted Wednesdays*: A segment in the 5:00 PM news on Wednesday, profiles one of Hawaii's most sought-after fugitives. Since 2007, tips from viewers have led to more than 70 arrests of wanted felons that have been profiled. Typical duration is 1:30 to 1:45.

Douglas passed only 30 miles north of Oahu -- the closest a hurricane has come to the island since Hurricane Dot in 1959. "it was not an active season, but all it took was one, and it was an intense hurrricane as it passed by the islands. We were lucky." This year, sea surface temperatures are below normal in the area where storms usually spawn.
