SUMMARY: The program “The Long Shadow of Asa Carter” documented the strange and secret life of Asa Carter, the speech writer who penned the late Governor George Wallace’s infamous “Segregation now, Segregation forever” inaugural address in 1963.

ISSUES: Emergency Preparedness, Public Policy

GUEST: Dr. Jose Rubiera, Director, Cuban Meteorological Service

SUMMARY: Dr. Rubiera is a hurricane expert and talked about his role as chair of the World Hurricane Council. He addressed meteorology in Cuba, Fidel Castro’s support for the weather service in Cuba and relations with the NOAA National Hurricane Center.

ISSUES: Public Policy, Leadership, Crime

GUEST: Former Gov. Robert Bentley, new Gov. Kay Ivey

SUMMARY: Playback of the historic proceedings of April 10th where incumbent Governor Robert Bentley announced his resignation in a plea deal to avoid prosecution on ethics violations, playback of inauguration and inaugural address of Lt. Gov. Kay Ivey being sworn in as Bentley’s successor.

ISSUES: Culture, Civil Rights

SUMMARY: First segment – Original American Music – Gospel, Second Segment – Apartheid in South African and its impact on the U-S South.

SUMMARY: Discussed criminology as a growing career, growth of criminology education, problems of law enforcement and community relations, problems recruiting and retaining law enforcement officers.

GUEST: State Senator Gerald Allen (R-Cottondale), State Rep. Chris England (D-Tuscaloosa)

SUMMARY: Discussed State Budgets passed by legislature and their impacts, the successes and failures of the session, the impact of the impeachment investigation and subsequent resignation of Governor Bentley on the session.

SUMMARY: Memorial Day program honoring fallen military and highlighting concerns current vets face in dealing with the Veteran's Administration.
