Part of the problem according to the OSPA is that much of this goes on behind closed doors so nobody can see what is happening. The prices are hidden and so are the millions in profits. He wants the public to be made aware of what he calls a "broken" prescription drug system and hopes lawmakers will get involved to create more transparency. And, ultimately be able to lower drug prices and allow pharmacists to staff their stores better.
