MOST SIGNIFICANT ISSUES - RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING

ISSUE: BOOK/POLITICS

April 3rd, 2022 5am to 5:30am 28:50 minutes of a 30 minute show

Guest: Oregon State University Professor Dr. Christopher McKnight Nichols. He co-wrote and edited a book about U.S. grand strategy, and who has played a role in shaping it over the last century. "Rethinking American Grand Strategy" contains chapters from various scholars who say that politicians, policymakers and academics need to include more types of strategies and strategists, to optimize their country's goals in the world. Grand strategy used to be associated mostly with military power, but these experts say they need to also include social movements, health care, gender, race, and environment. We discussed how Putin's approach in Ukraine reflects the old military might grand strategy model, but he wasn't expecting the newer, soft power elements of political resistance, and citizens fighting for their country internally. So that's why Russia is losing the public relations campaign throughout the world. This approach also shows the need for a global grand health strategy lacking during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The O.S.U. study found people had a roughly 25% increased risk of developing a psychiatric disorder in the four months after a COVID-19 infection, compared to people who had other kinds of respiratory tract infections. The findings support previous research discovering mental health issues among post-COVID-19 patients. The study is published in World Psychiatry, using data to match more than 46,000 COVID-19 patients, and comparing them to others suffering with respiratory ailments. They found a minor but significant increase in risk for anxiety disorders. Chan is the study's co-author, a Ph.D. student in the College of Public Health and Human sciences at Oregon State.

He says here in Portland they are doing a lot of loans in the range of \$1.5 million dollars for people who want to build buildings they can work out of and also live in. He says the Portland business climate is excellent and hot right now.
