October 10, 2022 - Wednesday's Child: Dalton dreams of being adopted after 13 years in foster care

When a child enters foster care, there is always the hope that it's temporary, but for some, the weeks turn into months and months turn into years. In this week's Wednesday's Child, we reintroduce you to 18-year-old Dalton, who was also featured in 2016. Dalton has lived in foster care since he was 5 years old. "I've been through way too much, heartache, abandonment," Dalton said. As a young child, Dalton dreamed of becoming a paleontologist — it's a passion he's still excited about today. "Ever since I was three or four, I've loved dinosaurs," Dalton said. Dalton graduated from high school this past year and is now working towards taking classes at Salt Lake Community College that will help him towards his goal of becoming a paleontologist. But before he starts school, he is hoping to find a connection with a potential adoptive family.

October 19, 2022 - Wednesday's Child: Aariah is looking for a strong mother-daughter bond

SALT LAKE CITY — Aariah loves soccer and would love to play on a competitive soccer team but the 16-year-old said the unpredictability that can come with living in foster care has made that difficult for the high schooler. "I have no control of my life," Aariah said. While visiting America First Field, home of Real Salt Lake, Aariah shared insight into her life while getting a private tour of the stadium from RSL's Zach Farnsworth. For the past year, Aariah has been working as a Certified Nursing Assistant, saving money for her future. "I've always wanted to help people," said Aariah. "I think that's what I want my life to be around, when I'm older." Aariah has lived in foster care for two years and she misses having a mother-daughter relationship. "I just want that close mother-daughter relationship, and I think I look for it in everyone," she said.

November 2, 2022 - Wednesday's Child: Red's new forever family found on the East Coast

SALT LAKE CITY — When 13-year-old Red entered foster care two years ago, she never imagined being adopted by a woman in New York, but today that's exactly where Red is living and not only does she now have a mother, but she also has two sisters, three dogs, and two cats. "I was really excited to have a family to call my own and have a fresh start and go somewhere new, and this is exactly what I needed," said Red to KSL TV's Shara Park. Red and her mother, Kim, offered to share their adoption story in hopes of bringing awareness to the need for more foster and adoptive families. "I never intended on doing a cross-country adoption, but it was the most incredible thing," Kim said. For six years Kim, who is a single mother of two, considered adopting, she had gone through the process of becoming a foster parent. "I saw her picture and read her bio, and I was like, she sounds amazing," Kim said. "When I inquired about Red, her case workers got back to me right away, and the process, as long as it was, was significantly easier than I could have imagined."

November 16, 2022 - Wednesday's Child: Angel wants to be a big brother for a new family

WEST JORDAN, Utah — It doesn't matter if it's shooting hoops or throwing a baseball, 12-year-old Angel loves being active. "I like to play sports at school, mostly basketball," Angel said. Sports are an escape for Angel, who has lived in foster care for nearly two years and is concerned about his family. "I'm worried because I want to know if my mom is okay, and I want to help her with things," Angel expressed. Family is important to Angel. He entered foster care with his siblings, who have since been adopted, and he misses them. "Especially my baby sister," Angel said. "Angel just genuinely cares. He cares about his younger siblings, he cares about those he calls family, and so something that would be really important for Angle is to keep that sibling contact," said Gabbi Pagan, Angel's Youth Connections Advocate at Raise the Future. "It doesn't have to be every single weekend or every month, but just so he knows that his siblings are being taken care of would be something very important to him."

December 7, 2022 - Wednesday's Child: Domanic wants to connect with a family that loves him

SOUTH JORDAN, Utah — At Bricks and Minifigs in South Jordan you'll find a treasure trove of LEGO® sets. From special characters to exotic cars, it's heaven on earth for 10-year-old Domanic. "I just love building things," Domanic said. Building with LEGO® bricks is an escape for Domanic, who has lived in foster care longer than any child should. "Since I was five. So like fives years," he said. It was just recently that Domanic was in the final stages of adoption with a family, only to be let down. "It was frustrating," he said. Despite the disappointment, Domanic is still hopeful his forever family is out there. "I want people who love me," Domanic said. "He knows that he's deserving of a forever family," Kylee Treseder said. Treseder is Domanic's caseworker with the Utah Department of Child and Family Services. "Dominic is one of the sweetest kids I've ever met. I think the thing that really amazes me about him is how he's able to open up."
