Politics & Government	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	1/8/2024	6 Minutes	The Texas government said it has spent more than \$100 million since April 2022, to transport on buses tens of thousands of migrants who recently crossed the border into Mexico. The arrivals have aggravated the situations such as homelessness and social services in those cities, increasing pressures on President Joe Biden, as he runs for reelection, who faces the demands from his own political party to ease the burden of the cities that receive immigrants
Natural Disaster	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	1/13/2024	4 Minutes	Tens of millions of Americans were affected by snowstorms, flooding and possible tornadoes, airlines delayed more than 7,600 flights across the country. Airplanes were grounded at Chicago's Ohare International Airport because of high winds and snow. Meanwhile, in Iowa, Republican presidential candidates suspended events three days before the caucuses.

Israeli Spokesperson Eylon Levy also weighed in on comments by UK Foreign Secretary David Cameron that more aid needs to enter Gaza, saying: "We draw attention to the fact that Kerem Shalom has an excess capacity to deliver aid if it is not in peace."
Politics & Government	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	1/26/2024	6 Minutes	Dozens of Pro-Palestinian demonstrators protested in front of the court's headquarters in the Hague, Netherlands, where they expressed their dissatisfaction that they have failed to order a ceasefire in Gaza, since it has only limited itself to ordering Israel to prevent acts of genocide against the Palestinian people and to do more to help civilians. The court also called on Palestinian armed groups to release hostages captured after the start of the conflict.
Politics & Government	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	1/27/2024	6 Minutes	President Joe Biden issued a statement offering to end the immigration crisis if Republicans pass the law he is negotiating with them. The President argued that these are the reforms that the United States has had on the border, which would give him a new emergency authority to close the border when it is overrun. President Biden stressed that the reform law would also provide funds to secure the border, assign more border agents, asylum officers, immigration judges and machines to detect and stop fentanyl trafficking.

The Prague based journalist for a radio station funded by the U.S. Congress and designated by Russia as a foreign agent, meaning she receives foreign funding for activities deemed political. Your Employer claims that your detention is unjust and was carried out for political reasons.

The fight against gangs had an impact of more than 75 thousand detainees in less than two years, which earned Nayib Bukele to be re-elected as president for 2024 -2029. During the night, he led a celebration in Barrios Square where he stressed that no one in the history of the country had won the presidential elections with such great difference in votes.
Politics & Government	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	2/6/2024	6 Minutes	According to the New York Times, the Israeli Military's internal assessment indicated that more than one-fifth of the remaining hostages in Gaza have already died. Israeli intelligence officials have concluded that at least 32 of the 136 hostages taken by Hamas and its allies on October 7 have been killed since the start of the war. These figures are higher than those previously publicly announced by the Israeli authorities. The news is likely to exacerbate the debate in Israel over the government's action in Gaza regarding hostages.

The leader pointed out to the Israeli authorities that article 53 of The Fourth Geneva Convention prohibits the destruction by occupying power of property belonging to private individuals "except when such destruction is absolutely necessary due to military operations." He said he received reports of destruction of infrastructure, such as residential buildings, schools, and universities.
Religion/Social Issue	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	2/10/2024	5 Minutes	In the Vatican, Pope Francis summoned three women to participate in the meeting of The Meeting of the Council of Cardinals to reflect on "The Feminine dimensions of the church", as he considered that in the last two sessions "The Voice of women was not sufficiently heard." He made an unexpected an unusual call to "demasculinize" the Catholic Church, as he declared last year that masculinizing the church has been one of the greatest sins.

The National Weather Service said more than 30 million people, from West Virginia to New England, were under a winter storm warning because of 15 centimeters of heavy, wet snow that fell overnight.

The Chief Police Department Stacey Graves said there are two minors among those detained in addition to the recovery of several firearms from the scene. The fatal victim was identified as Elizabeth "Lisa" Lopez Galvan, 43, who was a radio DJ and mother of two.

Trump, who says he is the victim of a witch hunt, is expected to appeal the ruling.

More than 50 states will present arguments to The International Court, although it is expected to take several months for the Justices to deliberate before issuing an opinion.
Health & Social Issue	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	2/20/2024	6 Minutes	The World Health Organization warned about the rapid spread of measles in the world, with more than 306 thousand cases reported in 2023, representing an increase of 79 percent in year. As the numbers rise, the organization fears that the Americas region will be affected by measles outbreaks. The latest global data indicates 306,291 cases reported to the organization in 2023, compared to 171,156 cases the previous year, although the organization stresses that the real figures are much higher.
Social Issue	Noticias 22 @ 7pm	2/21/2024	6 Minutes	In the United States, the Fentanyl crisis has left between 110,000 and 112,000 deaths from overdoses in 2023, in Mexico the data is not measured according to projections by The Drug Control Bureau. There is also no record of the substances used to mix the drug and increase its effects at a lower cost. Authorities warned that fentanyl consumption and overdose deaths are already a problem for Mexico, in cities such as Tijuana and Mexicali where deaths have been detected since 2022.

The President of the Court, Dora Martinez, led the ceremony in the center of the country, where the credentials were also presented to the Vice President Felix Ulloa. Electoral authorities confirmed Bukele's victory two weeks after the election was held with nearly 85 percent of the vote.

Other countries such as Jordan and France, have already carried out aid airdrops in the Palestinian territory, where a quarter of the population is one step away from famine.

Data from the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development indicates that Mexico is among the top five countries with the highest consumption of this resource. The agency detailed the consumption per capita of water in Mexico was 697 thousand liters, although consumption has relatively remained relatively stable, in the last two decades, Mexico continues to be among the world's largest consumers.
