Quarterly Issues Programs List for Station – WTLT-FM
October 1 – December 31, 2022

Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. WTLT News:** WTLT aired five news programs that examined issues and current events.
- B. Public Service Announcements:** WTLT aired public service announcements from various local and national nonprofit organizations.
- C. LTHS Sports:** As always, the community asks WTLT to provide live play-by-play coverage of LTHS sports. WTLT was able to meet the community's request by airing football, basketball, and soccer.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

- A. WTLT News:**
Public affairs/news program – WTLT aired five one-hour installments of *WTLT News*, hosted by Jake Gripp and Jack Hull. These programs included local news coverage, interviews with Lyons Township High School administrators, and dialogue with LTHS students.
- B. Public Service Announcements:**
WTLT aired public service announcements for various nonprofit organizations. PSAs aired once per hour every day for an approximate total of eighteen hours of airtime this quarter.
Meet the Need: In addition to regularly aired PSAs, WTLT conducted a public service campaign for local nonprofit organizations. From November 21 to December 30, WTLT aired one PSA dedicated to local nonprofits per hour. This totaled twenty-four hours of airtime this quarter.
- C. LTHS Student Sports:**
LTHS community members consistently ask WTLT to provide play-by-play coverage of LTHS sports. WTLT was able to meet this need by broadcasting the following this quarter:
Football: WTLT aired six football games for a total of fifteen hours of airtime.
Basketball: WTLT aired six basketball games for a total of nine hours of airtime.
Soccer: WTLT aired one soccer game for a total of one and a half hours of airtime.
