The Labor Department released the June jobs report today. The US added 209 thousand jobs last month still strong job growth but less than expected and a slowdown from recent months. Experts say it's hard to say if the job market will slow down in the next few months because it is such a fluid situation. Some professors say ignoring the application of AI is not going to make it go away and framing its use in the classroom in a range of different areas can prepare students when they enter the workforce. Since Chat GPT launched nearly a year ago, it's been used to generate original essays and raised concerns about cheating inside institutions.
