4/3/23	12:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Focus on the Family: Seeing God through My Son's Autism</i> – Guest Emily Colson shares stories of God's provision of wisdom in connecting with her Autistic son in her desperation after finding herself housebound as a single mom.
5/3/23	9:00am	30 min.	<i>Insight for Living</i> – Pastor and teacher Chuck Swindoll addresses what the Bible says about each person's individual personality traits and how parents can learn to tailor their child-rearing skills to nurture healthy relationships and strong faith with each unique child.
5/8/23	9:15 pm	15 min.	<i>The Storyteller: Mary Lathlin (Manitoba Cree)</i> – Mary spent the early years of life unschooled and unaware of another lifestyle than her family's trapping subsistence in Northern Manitoba. That is, until laws requiring formal education reduced her classroom to four-walls and harsh new ways. She ran away and married a man who became physically and emotionally abusive, unfaithful, and eventually had a stroke... all before softening and accepting Christ. How God healed their marriage and Mary's heart in his timeline.

4/12/23	1:00 pm	3.5 min.	<i>Montana Family Foundation Legislative Update:</i> Montana Family Foundation President Jeff Laszloffy discusses the components and background of proposed Senate Bill 458 which seeks to define the terms male, female, and sex in the Montana Code Annotated.
5/3/26	1:00 pm	30 min.	<i>Sekulow: Russia Alleges Assassination Attempt on Putin</i> US Senator Marsha Blackburn joins Jordan and Logan Sekulow in discussing the allegations by Russian officials of a “death by drone” assassination attempt on President Putin, and some of the issues with the Russian-propagated video footage.
5/4/23	10:00 am	30 min.	<i>Turning Point: An International Prophecy – Globalism</i> Dr. David Jeremiah examines how the ability to instantly share information and exchange money provides opportunity and foundation for financial and military globalism. Dr. Jeremiah offers a working understanding of the terms and implications for individuals and churches.
5/19/23	5:55 pm	5 min.	<i>Breakpoint: What is Christian Nationalism, Exactly?</i> Colson Center Fellows Timothy Padgett and John Stonestreet help listeners understand Christian Nationalism, the concerns most followers of the movement accurately identify, the problem with the “zero sum” arguments by opponents and advocates, and the absence of reasonable voices trying to understand any opposing points of view.
6/12/23	1:00 pm	30 min.	<i>Sekulow: Photos of Attack on Elderly Pro-Life Advocates Released –</i> Guests Cece Heil and Mike Pompeo join the panel to discuss the release of photos showing attackers of two Baltimore pro-life advocates and the recovery and response of the elderly victims.

4/5/23	12:30 pm	30 in.	<i>Focus on the Family: God-Honoring Money Habits for Kids</i> – Personal finance writer Matt Bell shares how his journey of financial self-destruction as a young man led him to relationship with Christ, and how listeners can help their kids learn to manage money in ways that honor God and lead to financial peace.
4/28/23	1:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Faith and Finance: No Need for Title Fraud Insurance</i> – Program Host Rob West explains the difference between Title Insurance (which he recommends) and Title <i>Fraud</i> Insurance, which he explains is an unnecessary expense because existing US law protects consumers from title theft or fraud already.
5/7/23	10:00 am	30 min.	<i>Moody Presents: The Battle Inside the Walls</i> – Pastor Mark Job addresses financial practices and pitfalls that may be societally prevalent in the developed world, but are contrary to the culture of God’s word.
5/23/23	6:00 pm	30 min.	<i>Adventures in Odyssey: Easy Money</i> – Odyssey teens Sam and Butch are trying to earn money for hockey equipment. But financial ambition goes too far when one nearly works himself to death while the other gambles for easy money and finds that losing is a lot easier than gaining.
6/7/23	1:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Faith and Finance: Stay in the Market or Go?</i> Christian Financial Advisor Cole Pearson encourages listeners not to respond emotionally to market volatility by getting out. Instead, he recommends diversifying, considering company character and keeping a long-term investment perspective.

4/24/23	11:00 am	30 min.	<i>Discover the Word:</i> The panel discusses how dysfunction in the family can draw people to God rather than push them away: meeting people in their dysfunction with the example of God's redemptive healing of relationships.
5/13/23	9:30 am	30 min.	<i>Parenting Today's Teens: Consequences Don't Have to Ruin the Relationship</i> – Program host Mark Gregston acknowledges the tension parents feel in trying to move toward teenage children when they are making poor decisions, but reminds listeners that relationship with our teens is more important than their choices. How to let consequences take effect without damaging the relationship.
6/3/23	8:00 pm	30 min.	<i>RealLife Loading: How Would Jesus Date?</i> Host Shelby Abbott leads a Generation Z roundtable discussion of vulnerability, sexual pressure, and dating according to Biblical principles.
6/14/23	7:00 pm	30 min.	<i>A New Beginning: Handling Hardship and Difficult People</i> – Pastor Greg Laurie calls listeners to aim for forgiveness while leaving vengeance to the Lord, but says the timeline can be different per situation. Charting a path to a more peaceful life through forgiveness.
6/16/23	10:30 am	30 min.	<i>Truth for Life: How to Share Christ with Someone</i> – Alistair Begg addresses the key points a Christian should cover when sharing faith, regardless of personal style. And why we can't forget to explain the cost of following Jesus, along with the great reward.

4/7/23	10:30 am	30 min.	<i>Truth for Life: We Are All Witnesses</i> – At Jesus trial, Peter denied knowing Him and hid in fear. But weeks later and right up to his death, Peter boldly and publicly proclaimed his faith. How his yo-yo journey to becoming a cornerstone of Christian faith can inspire others who deal with fear or doubt.
4/17/23	9:15 pm	15 min.	<i>The Storyteller: Matt McIntosh (Oklahoma Cree)</i> – As a Pastor’s kid, Matt grew up going to church and knowing <i>about</i> religion, but could not relate to God or Jesus. As a teen, he realized he believed the Christian narrative out of a great fear of hell, even as he lived counter to Biblical guidance. He shares how one week at a youth conference changed the root of his belief and his ability to live accordingly.
5/12/23	10:00 am	30 min.	<i>Turning Point: A Theological Prophecy – The Falling Away</i> – Dr. David Jeremiah connects the emerging trend to deconstruct faith with the Biblical prophecy of a “great falling away,” and the difference between breaking down Christian faith for better understanding, and reducing Christianity to out-of-context points that are easy to discount but don’t reflect God’s heart.
6/6/23	7:30 pm	30 min.	<i>Open the Bible: Troubled and Dependent</i> – Pastor Colin Smith addresses what it looks like to bless someone through the Old Testament story of Joseph and the unique features of the blessing Jacob imparted to his sons.
6/23/23	8:00 pm	30 min.	<i>In Touch: Staying by the Stuff</i> – Dr. Charles Stanley realizes those who serve most visibly are often regarded as most important in human terms. He shows how God values those serving in the background just as much as he continues a series on the book of Samuel.
