"ALS" is also referred to as "Lou Gehrig's Disease", named after the famous New York Yankee 1st Baseman, who announced to the world that he was battling a strange, progressive neurodegenerative disease. Lou Gehrig made his announcement on the 4th of July, 1939. He would be gone almost exactly 2 years later. There is still no cure or treatment to stop or reverse ALS. There is over \$6000 people in the USA are diagnosed with ALS each year, 15 new cases each day. About 60% of people in the USA with ALS are men, 93% of them are Caucasian men. For unknown reasons, military veterans, combat or non-combat, are approximately twice as likely to be diagnosed with ALS as the general public. ALS is also very difficult to diagnose as symptoms mimic other conditions.
