They offer a "Men's Residential Program" for residents of the Mission, a "Women and Children's Program" with 30 beds available for the women's program and 38 beds available in the "Men's Residential Program". They also provide "Emergency Shelters", "Chapel Ministry", a "Chronic Mental Illness Program", and a "Women and Children's Program". There are some "Light of Life" programs.

Between 10,000 and 17,000 people die annually who are considered medically suitable for organ, tissue and cornea donation, yet only a fraction of those people are donors. When just one person signs up to be an organ and tissue donor, he or she can save up to 8 lives through organ donation and enhance the lives of 75 others through tissue donation. More than 4000 people in Pennsylvania are currently on the waiting list for a life-saving organ transplant. In the hundreds of thousands nationally, anyone, regardless of age or medical history can sign up to be a donor, regardless of the donor's or their families' religious beliefs.
