
SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:




SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:

Childhelp is the nation's oldest and largest nonprofit dedicated to the fight against child abuse and neglect. The National Childhelp Child Abuse Hotline is 1-800-4-A-Child, staffed 24-7-365 with dedicated professional crisis counselors who are available to assist in over 170 languages. The hotline offers crisis intervention, information and referrals to thousands of emergency, social service and support resources. All calls are confidential. April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. Childhelp exists to meet the physical, emotional, educational and spiritual needs of abused, neglected and at-risk children. Every year over 3 million reports of child abuse are made JUST in the US, every year more than 3.6 million referrals are made to child protection agencies involving more than 6.6 million children. And the US has one of the worst records among industrialized nations, between 4 and 7 children die EVERY DAY due to child abuse and neglect; physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse and child neglect. More than 80% of the children who die as a result of child abuse or neglect aren't even old enough for kindergarden.


SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:

In 2009 Patrick re-established the Pittsburgh NORML Chapter, after the introduction of PA's first medical cannabis bill. NORML stands for National Organization for the Reform of marijuana Laws. Medical marijuana is now LEGAL in PA, but many legal questions swirl around this substance involving the marijuana consumer, the employers in PA, the law enforcement agencies in PA and the justice system in PA. Patrick Nightingale in 2017 joined with 2 of his attorney pals to form Cannabis Legal Solutions, a new law firm dedicated to the needs of PA's emerging cannabis industry. Marijuana is still illegal in the eyes of the US federal government and THAT is a major factor in how legal medical and recreational marijuana laws are being crafted state by state, and also how the legal and medical marijuana laws are being enforced from state to state..


SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:

OSN is an all volunteer non-profit, dedicated to alleviating the suffering of and improving the welfare of cats and dogs by reducing their overpopulation thru spay neuter programs, and by educating the public about the impact of animal overpopulation on the environment and community. Operation Spay Neuter partners with local veterinarians to subsidize the spaying and neutering of pets for individuals who have a financial need and also for those who care for homeless companion animals and stray-ferals. Operation Spay Neuter, thru a collaborative effort with veterinarians thruout the area, offers a low-cost spay/neuter program to low income pet owners. The ultimate goal is to have no more unwanted or homeless litters of dogs and cats born into our community. Operation Spay Neuter on their web site offers specific instructions on trapping feral cats. Trap, Neuter, Return. There are HUGE feral cat populations in many areas of Western PA.


SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:

Hampton Sides' latest non-fiction adventure story is more of a brutal depiction of the horrific Korean War's Battle for The Chosin Reservoir. The real life generals, the captains and the soldiers who were there, and the real life horrible graphic details of life during war, for both soldiers and civilians. The Korean War happened just 5 years after WWII had ended, from 1950 to 1953. Many of the US soldiers and officers who fought in The Korean War also fought for the US during WWII. Here in Pittsburgh, there is a beautiful Korean War memorial, very close to PNC Park where the Pittsburgh Pirates play. Some 2300 Western PA soldiers died in the Korean War and some 8K went missing. Its been referred to as the Forgotten War. The cold in Korea during the battle for The Chosin Reservoir was at times 20 below zero, the ground was frozen solid, making it impossible for soldiers on either side to dig foxholes. American, Korean and Chinses soldiers died from extreme cold, as many of them weren't properly equipped with life saving warm clothing, which hadn't been invented yet.



But opioid overdose deaths nationally now outnumber traffic fatalities (40K) and also the number of casualties suffered in the Vietnam War (60K). Addiction to alcohol, drugs, and other substances causes more deaths, illnesses and disabilities than any other preventable health condition.. CLEAR stands for the Coalition for Leadership, Education and Advocacy for Recovery. Oasis Recovery center offers interventions, which can be traumatizing, unnerving experiences for all those involved. Oasis provides expert counseling and pre-intervention training for all family members and close friends of the addicted BEFORE the intervention is actually staged.







And the other distinct medical medical program introduced in the late 1990's was Child's Way, the 1st pediatric extended care center in the state of PA. The mission of the Children's Home of Pittsburgh is to promote the health and well being of infants and children thru services which establish and strengthen the family.. And including all 3 programs, The Pediatric Specialty Hospital, Child's Way and The Adoption Program, if insurance doesn't cover the costs, the Children's Home of Pittsburgh/Lemieux Family Center fills in the gaps.



Have U Herd Goatscaping Will send a consultant to your property to estimate the job. Goatscaping has been used in Western PA for a few years now, with the goats removing undergrowth (vitriolic vegetation) from difficult to access areas. And these goats don't just do landscaping, they are also available for public and private parties, photo shoots, wedding showers and of course, Goat Yoga. "Breathe, Bleat, Relax, Repeat." Annually, NamstHay Goat Yoga of Pittsburgh puts on 4 to 5 large public yoga events for different local charities, including Animal Friends, Hope Haven Farm Sanctuary, The Washington Area Humane Society and Humane Animal rescue. These Goat Yoga events feature over 20 goats, and everyone is welcome to pet, feed and take pictures with the goats as well. The goats are also kid-friendly.


SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:


SUBJECTS AND/OR TOPICS COVERED:
