"Pressley Ridge" got its start as 2 of Pittsburgh's oldest child care agencies "The Protestant Home for Children" and "The Allegheny Home for the Friendless" Home, established in 1832 by the First Presbyterian church, was the 1st Agency for abandoned, neglected and orphaned children west of the Allegheny Mountains. The Friendless was the 2nd Agency for abandoned and orphaned children, founded by the Second Presbyterian church in 1861. Both homes just mentioned were located on the North side of Pittsburgh. And over 150 years ago, the term "Pressley Ridge" Community-based treatment services was always used. Pressley Ridge: Community-based treatment services, Foster care, Education services and Residential treatment services.

By donating organs one individual can help up to 8 people, while tissue donors can improve the lives of up to 50 people. Every day, 1 million people wait for tissue and corneal transplants while every 10 minutes someone new is added to the organ list. The heart, kidney, pancreas, lungs, liver and intestines can all be transplanted as life-saving organs. Tissues such as bones, ligaments and tendons are needed for vital surgical procedures to repair injured or diseased joints and bones. Corneas, heart valves and skin are also able to be donated. Between 10,000 and 12,000 people die annually who are considered medically suitable for organ, tissue and cornea donation; yet only a fraction of them are donors. organ donation is a possibility only after all efforts to save the patient's life have been exhausted, tests have been performed to confirm life absence of vital signs and death has been declared.
