The heroin/opioid epidemic is deeply affecting Western PA, as it is the rest of the country. Families, spouses, Parents, grandparents are now raising their own grand-Children because either Mommy or Daddy or both, are Either in jail or in rehab, because of the heroin/opioid Epidemic. EMT's are now reviving the SAME over-dosed people maybe a couple times A WEEK. There will be more deaths due to drug overdoses this year in The US than there were deaths during the Viet Nam War. An estimated 71.6K people will die this year due to a drug overdose, just over 58K American soldiers died in Viet Nam. According to the US Centers for Disease Controls & Prevention, drug overdoses are now the leading cause of accidental death in America, killing ,more people than guns or car accidents COMBINED. School districts across the country are all now supplied with Narcan (or Nalaxone), the life-saving OD -reversal drug. Even the police and the EMT's now have to wear gloves at OD/drug arrest crime scenes because of extremely toxic opioids such as fentanyl and carfentanyl, both of which are now being added to heroin. Oxycodone, hydrocodone, oxycontin, Percocet, Percodan, Vicocdin, dilaudid and others...national studies find that 80% of heroin addicts began their addiction by abusing prescription medication.



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

Stuart Fisk has been involved in HIV research, nursing, and prevention since 1988, he's provided hospice, Nursing and medical care for persons living with HIV Disease since 1992, with a focus on providing care for Persons with substance abuse and mental health disorders. Stuart Fisk was also involved in the development and legalization of Prevention Point Pittsburgh, a Syringe exchange program providing a broad range of Prevention services for injection drug users in the region. AIDS FREE Pittsburgh partners with health systems, Local government agencies, community organizations and their clients, and everyone works together to diagnose the undiagnosed early in the course of infection, support efforts to reduce HIV transmission among high-risk groups, engage persons with HIV and link them to care within 48 hours of diagnosis, and increase access to PrEP. The vision of AIDS FREE Pittsburgh is a community where new HIV infections are rare, where people living with HIV receive the care they need, and young people can grow up in a world without AIDS. Specifically AIDS FREE Pittsburgh values and encourages the active participation of communities that are most affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic: people of color, people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ).



Sonny Pugar was a great local drummer who played With everyone locally here in the Pittsburgh area, and Also he played with national acts too. Sonny died of Colon cancer in 2004, and in his memory and in his Honor, an annual music event was arranged, featuring Some of the area's best well known and up and com-Ing musical acts. "The Rhythms of Life Concert" was Born, we're in our 14th year now, and the money raised For our yearly concert goes towards paying local musi-Cians to play at all the local hospitals. We started at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, and now years later, we're sending local musicians out to 12 different hospitals and care facilities, and we pay the musicians too. Our musicians play about 12 gigs a month and in the last 8 years, we've made some 500 visits to area hospitals, including some 200 musicians who perform for the patients and their families, the doctors, nurses and staff. Imagine being stuck in a hospital for days or even weeks, the sound of "live" music being performed would be a welcome break for a patient of any age. Sometimes the patients come into the performance area wearing surgical masks, or are attached to their "towers" of IV medicines. The Music Smiles program, "live" music in caring places.





Ken Kaszak has sold exercise equipment, he spent years in the nutrition/fitness industry, which to this day continues to be largely unregulated, he's an author, Ken's most recent book is "Cut Your Calories Now!", and he is a life-long student of economics. Ken Kaszak In 1991 decided to apply the techniques of economic analysis and investment research to the areas of nutrition, fitness and the "body-image" industry. Never in our country's history have so many people been obese. 2/3rds of the USA's population is overweight, despite warnings that being overweight can lead to type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure and other serious health issues. In 1990, the Nutrition Labeling Education Act was passed, which was the beginning of food labels. In 1992 the Food Pyramid was being debated, and all the food industry groups were complaining to the USDA about their positioning on the Food Pyramid! Ken Kaszak is the author of an essay, "There Used To Be A Bookstore;" clients of fitness clubs and gyms every January swear to stay in shape during the brand New Year. Then by early March, they're done, no longer showing up at the gym or fitness club, but the establishments continue to deduct their monthly membership fees! Ken Kaszak wrote the essay "Don't Spectate, Participate," as millions of Americans sit in front of their TV's or computer monitors idle for hours a day, then they add food to the equation. This is a huge contributing factor to the obesity epidemic existing currently in the USA.





Scenic Pittsburgh champions sound scenic policy, supports legislation that limits visual pollution such as billboards and other outdoor advertising, and advances sustainable place-making. Scenic Pittsburgh utilizes targeted advocacy and public awareness initiatives to preserve the beauty of the region's scenic resources, such as the mountains, the hills, rivers, vistas and neighborhoods for future generations. Scenic Pittsburgh partners with organizations and community leaders to promote the region's scenic resources as a catalyst for vibrant and sustainable communities. Visual pollution includes billboards, and most billboards are for national brands, out of state products and services, with no connection to the local economy. And alcohol and tobacco products are the predominate advertisements on billboards in lower-income neighborhoods.
