It's also extremely dangerous trying to leave an abusive relationship; you have to be extremely careful with your planning.

As part of their mission to end feline overpopulation and to reduce the populations of cats living outdoors, they also assess at their clinic, all kitting friendly cats trapped or captured during the TNR process and TNR trap neuter return. All done kittens and socialization and after they're spayed/neutered and vaccinated, they're offered up for adoption thru the HCMT's network of Foster Homes.
