ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Alcohol Inspections Held in Lincoln County :30 04/05/21 News2 Midday Monday

Investigators with the Nebraska State Patrol conducted alcohol inspections in Lincoln County during the evening hours of Friday, April 2. In total, 16 businesses were inspected. Three of those businesses sold alcohol to a minor for a non-compliance rate of 19 percent. Only one of the businesses failed to check the minor's identification. The businesses included liquor stores, convenience stores, restaurants, and bars. Legal Marijuana Now-Now Recognized as a Party in Nebraska :30 04/22/21 News2 6am Thursday

A political party focused on legalizing marijuana can now run candidates and claim registered voters in Nebraska after it gained official state recognition. Secretary of State Bob Evnen says the Legal Marijuana NOW Party has met the requirements to qualify as a political party. The designation allows voters to register with the party, and party officials can nominate candidates for partisan offices. Activists Mark Elworth Jr. and Krystal Gabel, who frequently run for public office, say they collected more than 10,000 signatures over four years to gain party status. Approximately 6,800 signatures were needed.

Stickers Bring Awareness for Alcohol Awareness Month :30 04/22/21 News2 Midday Thursday

April is Alcohol Awareness Month and Community Connection of North Platte is teaming up with area mentors and mentees and the Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition (SAP) to remind others of the dangers of alcohol, especially among the nation's youth. The groups are working with area businesses by placing special stickers, designed and printed by Community Connection, on the containers and boxes of alcohol. The goal, they say, is to remind people to help keep alcohol out of the possession of kids.

College Student Drinking Down During Pandemic :30 04/22/21 News2 Midday Thursday

A new survey from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln shows college students' drinking rates dropped during the pandemic — contrary to popular belief. Distress, boredom and the widespread promotion of increased drinking during the pandemic on social media could have been a recipe for a disaster in the form of college student alcohol use. But findings from a Husker research team show the influx of students moving back in with their parents actually contributed to a substantial drop in college students' alcohol use.

Troopers Locate Over 400 lbs of Marijuana Hidden Inside ATMS :30 05/03/21 News2 Midday Monday

According to NSP, a trooper observed a Mercedes Sprinter Van fail to signal a turn while exiting Interstate 80 at the Giltner Interchange, at mile marker 324 at around 10 a.m. During the traffic stop, an NSP K9 detected the presence of a controlled substance inside the vehicle. Troopers searched the vehicle and located a plastic tote containing packages of marijuana. There were also 14 ATMs and a large safe inside the van. With the assistance of the Grand Island Fire Department, all 14 ATMs and the safe were opened, revealing that they were full of packages of marijuana. The total weight of the marijuana was 426 pounds.

Alcohol Inspections Held in Keith County :30 05/07/21 News2 6pm Friday

During the evening hours of Wednesday, May 5, investigators with the Nebraska State Patrol conducted alcohol inspections in Keith County. In total, 15 businesses were inspected. One business sold alcohol to a minor for a non-compliance rate of 7 percent. All businesses checked the minor's ID. The businesses included liquor stores, convenience stores, restaurants, and bars. Businesses that fail the inspections are referred the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission. Clerks who sell alcohol to a minor are cited for procuring alcohol for a minor. Troopers Arrest Two Locate 186 Pounds of Marijuana :30 05/17/21 News2 6pm Monday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested two people after locating more than 180 pounds of marijuana during a traffic stop Saturday. At approximately 7:45 a.m. Saturday, a trooper observed a Dodge Charger fail to signal a turn and drive on the shoulder while exiting Interstate 80 at mile marker 324, in Hamilton County. During the traffic stop, an NSP K9 detected the odor of a controlled substance inside the vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed 186 pounds of marijuana contained in heat sealed packages.

Carry Out Alcohol from Restaurants Becomes Permanently Legal :30 05/26/21 News2 10pm Wednesday

Nebraska restaurants can now offer carry-out alcohol permanently under a new state law inspired by Gov. Pete Ricketts' efforts to help struggling businesses during the pandemic. Ricketts announced Wednesday that he signed the measure into law. It went into effect immediately. The governor issued an executive order to allow carry-out alcohol in March 2020 to aid restaurants that were struggling financially because of the pandemic and mandatory social distancing restrictions.

Troopers Arrest 16 Impaired Drivers to Kick off 100 Days of Summer :30 06/02/21 News2 5pm Tuesday

The summer travel season is officially underway, and the Nebraska State Patrol is reminding motorists to buckle up and put the phone down to help keep the roads safe. Memorial Day

Weekend marked the start of NSP's annual "100 Days of Summer" initiative. From Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day Weekend, troopers across Nebraska will be working special enforcement and education campaigns in an effort to reduce serious injury or fatality crashes. Those efforts may include enforcement campaigns related to exhibition speeding, impaired driving, recreation area safety, community outreach and more. Over Memorial Day Weekend, troopers arrested 16 drivers for impairing driving, issued 297 citations for speeding, and responded to several crashes.

Two Arrested After Incident at Wood River Interchange :30 06/03/21 News2 Midday Thursday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested two people after an incident at the Wood River interchange of Interstate 80. At approximately 7:40 p.m. Wednesday, troopers responded to a report of a fight at a truck stop at the Wood River interchange, at mile marker 300. Upon arrival, troopers located the people believed to be involved in the incident. During the investigation, an NSP K9 detected the odor of a controlled substance coming from inside one subject's vehicle. During a search of the vehicle, troopers located suspected methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia, and a machete. A search of another vehicle involved in the incident led to the location of additional methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia.

Troopers Find 55 LBS of Cocaine In Cozad :30 06/04/21 News2 Midday Friday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol arrested an Arizona man following the discovery of 55 pounds of cocaine in a vehicle in Cozad. The incident occurred at approximately 1 p.m. Thursday, when a trooper contacted a driver at the Cozad interchange off Interstate 80. During the encounter, the trooper became suspicious of criminal activity. Troopers searched the vehicle and found 55 pounds of cocaine hidden in floor compartments of the vehicle. There was also a small amount of marijuana in the vehicle. The driver of the vehicle was accompanied by an adult female passenger and a small child.

Gray Wolf Found in Nebraska :30 04/14/21 News2 Midday Wednesday

Genetic testing results recently confirmed a large canine killed Jan. 28, 2021, near Uehling, was a gray wolf. The female wolf had been legally shot by coyote hunters, who contacted the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission. Genetic testing showed the animal originated from a population of wolves found in Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan.

A Special Delivery :30 05/11/21 News2 Midday Tuesday

It's a very special delivery out at the Buffalo Bill State Historical Park. It's a little - not so little - bundle of joy, born Monday morning around 9:00 a.m. The staff at the park say they are pretty sure the brand new baby bison is a girl, but mom, P.J. is not letting anyone get too close to be completely sure, just yet. And just like when any baby is born, the baby bison now needs a name. The Park Superintendent is opening up a contest soon, so be thinking of the perfect name for this little gal. Adam Jones says he did not name the parents (P.J. and Taco), and he is looking for something "much better" for their baby. So he wants your input. There was a hint of a prize for the winning name, but those details are not finalized yet.

Voting Open for Bison Naming :30 05/18/21 News2 Midday Tuesday

The baby bison at Buffalo Bill State Historical Park is ready for a name, and the staff at the Nebraska Game and Parks are closer to giving him one. Originally announced as a "girl" bison, the park is realizing after closer inspection that she is actually a he. And "he" needs a name. Since his May 10 birth there have been many name suggestions floating around on social media. The park opened up an opportunity for folks to share their ideas on the Nebraska Game and Parks Facebook page for the son of P.B. and Taco. Now the suggestions are narrowed down to five options. The options are: Billie, Cody, Mocha, Scout, and Oakley. And everyone has the chance to vote until May 26.

Minnesota Barn Fire Kills an Estimated 12000 Pigs :30 05/18/21 News2 6pm Tuesday

A hog barn fire killed an estimated 12,000 pigs Sunday night, according to the Waseca Police Department. Fire Chief Jason Forshee says crews were dispatched to Woodville Pork around 10:30 p.m. Sunday after two large buildings erupted with flames. "Upon arrival, we had a building that was mostly engulfed. We ended up paging out a total of, we had nine departments on scene," Forshee said. Those nine departments supplied more than 20 tankers to combat the blaze. Crews were able to spare a third nearby building using a fire break. Forshee stated, "Our estimates on numbers right now is an estimate that 9,000 piglets were lost and 3,000 sows for a total of 12,000." Firefighters remained on scene extinguishing the flames and hot spots until 2 p.m. Monday. The fire's cause is still undetermined, but local farming experts say the lack of rain and high winds are a major contributor to farm facility fires.

Paws on the Platte is Back :30 05/21/21 News2 6pm Friday

A unique way to raise money for PAWS-itive Partners began on Thursday. If you love dogs then you will love what some local artists are creating. Paws on the Platte is back and News 2 is here to tell you where you can find the statues. CONSUMER PROTECTION

Company Targets Homeowners for Free Water Testing :30 04/23/21 News2 10pm Friday

North Platte's Municipal Light and Water is sending a warning to homeowners in regards to a Colorado company scheming people out of their money. Chris Holley is the water protection specialist for Municipal Light and Water and has worked for the water department for five years. And just when he thought he'd seen about everything, a flier was brought to his attention. The city department said they do extensive testing throughout the year. If customers want their water tested or have questions or concerns they encourage them to call the office.

How to Save Money at the Pump :30 05/07/21 News2 6pm Friday

On Friday, drivers had the opportunity to pay less at the pump. May is Renewable Fuels Month and the Nebraska Corn Board taught drivers about their car's ethanol abilities. One local Kwik Stop hosted an event in honor of Renewable Fuels Month. The event allowed drivers to fill up their cars with ethanol-based products at a very cheap cost. Experts on ethanol taught drivers which ethanol works best for them. Curtis Harms the Director of Communications for Nebraska Corn Board explained that ethanol products can be used by more than just Flex-Fuel cars.

Hacking Infrastructure in a Digital Age :30 05/14/21 News2 10pm Friday

The recent cyberattack on the Colonial Pipeline caused widespread panic in some states leading to a shortage of resources. As more information is being gathered about the Colonial Pipeline cyber attack, there are other cyber security questions arising. Utility companies are only one aspect of infrastructure, but as people in the midwest and beyond experienced from a weather-related incident involving rolling blackouts in February, electricity is something everyone arguably depends on nearly as much as oxygen. These utilities have necessary systems in place to fight against persons, and entities, that would seek to harm them.

CRIME AND PERSONAL SAFETY

Buffalo County Sheriffs Office Responds to Robbery at Gas Station :30 04/11/21 News2 5pm Sunday

The Buffalo County Sheriff's Office responded to a strong-armed robbery at a gas station around six miles east of Kearney off at the mile marker 279 interchange of I-80 on Sunday. According to preliminary information, a lone adult male jumped behind the counter, pushed past a clerk and removed money from the cash register. The subject then exited the store and fled westbound on I-80 in a silver Chevrolet four-door car with no license plates. Authorities were contacted, and a short time later the suspect vehicle was spotted on I-80 several miles west of Kearney. The vehicle was stopped by a trooper with the Nebraska State Patrol and the suspect taken into custody.

Former Husker Found Not Guilty on Sexual Assault Charges :30 04/15/21 News2 Midday Thursday

Former Husker football player Katerian LeGrone was found not guilty of first-degree sexual assault on Thursday. LeGrone was being charged with sexual assault stemming from an incident on August 25, 2019. Another former Husker, Andre Hunt, was also accused of the crime but testified in the trial as part of a plea deal. According to the probable cause affidavit, the victim showed up at Hunt's apartment on August 25. Soon, they were in the bedroom where the woman says she felt forced into sexual contact by LeGrone and Hunt.

Two Killed in Crash Near Holdrege :30 04/28/21 News2 Midday Wednesday

At approximately 7:50 a.m. Tuesday, a Chevrolet Silverado was traveling westbound on Highway 6, four miles west of Holdrege, when it crossed the center line and struck an eastbound Dodge Grand Caravan. The Silverado's lone occupant, Dylan Skeen, 29, of Holdrege, was transported to CHI Health Good Samaritan Hospital in Kearney, where he was pronounced deceased. The driver of the Grand Caravan, Kerri Bernstrauch, 36, Holdrege, was pronounced deceased at the scene. A child passenger in the Grand Caravan was also transported to CHI Health Good Samaritan and then flown to Omaha for further treatment of serious injuries.

Pursuit Manhunt Lead to Two Arrests Near Big Springs :30 05/03/21 News2 6pm Monday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested two people following a pursuit and manhunt overnight near Big Springs. At approximately 12:50 a.m. MT Monday, a trooper observed an eastbound Acura RL sedan speeding on Interstate 80 near Sunol at mile marker 67. The trooper attempted a traffic stop, but the vehicle accelerated and fled eastbound. The trooper initiated a pursuit. During the pursuit, the trooper observed the two occupants of the vehicle throwing something out of the car, which was later recovered and found to be a handgun. The suspect vehicle reached speeds in excess of 130 miles per hour.

Former Minden School Board Member Charged :30 05/06/21 News2 6pm Thursday

The former Minden school board member who refused to wear a mask in school now faces criminal charges. Katie Sinsel, 42, was charged this week and has pleaded not guilty to two misdemeanor charges of 2nd degree trespassing and disturbing the peace. Sinsel was removed from an April 12 Minden school board meeting because she refused to wear a mask as a COVID precaution. She was then removed from the school board meeting by the Minden Police Chief. A special board meeting was held on April 26 where Sinsel was removed from the board.

Two People Die and Two Others Injured in Fiery Crash :30 05/09/21 News2 10pm Sunday

Two people died and two others were hurt in a fiery crash about 7 miles south of Valley in eastern Nebraska Saturday. Chief Douglas County Sheriff's Deputy Wayne Hudson said the an eastbound van collided with a westbound truck around 4 p.m. Saturday on West Center Road near the Platte River, and one of the vehicles caught fire. The sheriff's office said the van was trying to pass another vehicle just before it collided with the truck. The driver of the van and one person in the pickup truck died, but their names were not immediately available Sunday.

Sunday Collision :30 05/09/21 News2 10pm Sunday First responders caught word at 12:01 p.m., Sunday of a two-car collision at E and Jeffers in North Platte. Both vehicles sustained extensive damage. There were no serious injuries. Officials say one car ran a red light before striking the other. Medical personnel was called to help those involved but no one was taken to the hospital. Debris littered the roadway as the NPPD and Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies needed to guide traffic for nearly an hour as the cars were towed away and the wreckage cleaned off the street.

Former State Trooper Arrested on Child Enticement Charges :30 05/18/21 News2 Midday Tuesday

A former Nebraska State Patrol trooper has been arrested on suspicion of child enticement and possessing child pornography. The Nebraska State Patrol said 24-year-old Brandon Dolezal was arrested early Saturday. The criminal investigation began after a teen told a school resource officer at Gering High School that he was concerned because two girls he knew were messaging with an older man on Snapchat. Court documents said interviews with the girls and a search of Snapchat records revealed that one of the girls had sent explicit photos to Dolezal and the conversations were sexual in nature.

NSP Investigating Incident Cass County :30 06/08/21 News2 6pm Tuesday

Deputies with the Cass County Sheriff's Office were attempting to serve multiple arrest warrants at a residence at 9901 Adams Street in rural Cass County at around 9:30 p.m. As deputies were attempting to make contact with the subject, they heard an apparent gunshot come from inside the residence. Deputies then heard a person call for help.Deputies entered the residence and located a female with an apparent gunshot wound. Deputies attempted live-saving measures, but the woman passed away at the scene. There were two people in the residence at the time of the incident. The Cass County Sheriff's Office has requested that the Nebraska State Patrol conduct the investigation, which will be conducted as an incustody death investigation.

Three Judge Panel Sentences Murderer Aubrey Trail :30 06/09/21 News2 Midday Wednesday

A three-judge panel announced the sentencing for convicted murderer Aubrey Trail on Wednesday, giving him the death penalty for the 2017 killing of Sydney Loofe. Trail, as well as his co-defendant Bailey Boswell, were found guilty of first-degree murder for the killing of the 24-year-old. The panel heard arguments in March, as the prosecution attempted to prove there were aggravating circumstances involved in the murder. There are nine different definitions of aggravating circumstances, but the three-judge panel only had to determine if Loofe's murder contained one.

NSP Identifies Victims Killed Along Tri-County :30 06/10/21 News2 10pm Thursday

Two people were killed Thursday after their vehicle crashed into a canal near Maxwell, according to the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office. According to LCSO Chief Deputy Roland Kramer, the driver of the Chevrolet pickup lost control as it was approaching the curve near the intersection of State Farm Road and Box Elder Road before rolling into the canal. The truck was 80 percent submerged in the water when law enforcement arrived at the scene. A male was pulled from the vehicle. A female was also recovered by the Lincoln County Dive Team. Both occupants, Alex Sanchez, 74, of North Platte and Kimberly McCarter, 52, of Papillion were pronounced dead.

Nebraska Court Rejects Inmates Request New Murder Trial :30 06/12/21 News2 6pm Saturday

A man serving a life sentence for murdering an Omaha woman in 1999 failed to win a new trial despite his claims that follow-up DNA testing exonerated him. The Nebraska Supreme

Court upheld the first-degree murder conviction of Daryle Duncan. Duncan was convicted in 2001 of fatally stabbing of one of his neighbors, Lucille Bennett. He also was sentenced to up to 20 years in prison for use of a deadly weapon to commit a felony. Duncan argued in his appeal that new DNA evidence found on two billfolds should have cleared his name.

Sheriffs Office 2 Drowned Crash into Nebraska Canal :30 06/14/21 News2 6pm Monday

A western Nebraska sheriff's office says two people drowned last week when the pickup truck they were in rolled into a water-filled canal. The North Platte Telegraph reports that the crash happened Thursday afternoon when the truck lost control on a rural road and went into the Tri-County Canal near Fort McPherson National Cemetery. The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office says by the time first responders arrived, workers with the Central Nebraska Public Power & Irrigation District had already jumped into the water and pulled out 74-year-old Alex Sanchez, of North Platte, who died at the scene. A county dive team later recovered the body of 52-year-old Kimberly McCarter, of Papillion.

Central Nebraska Man Convicted of Killing His Stepmother :30 06/19/21 News2 6pm Saturday

A 45-year-old central Nebraska man has been convicted of killing his stepmother last year. A jury on Friday found Trent Esch guilty of first-degree murder in the death of 62-year-old Crystal Esch north of Broken Bow. He was also convicted of use of a weapon and possession of a firearm by a felon. Crystal Esch was found shot to death in her home last July. She had a protection order against her stepson for threatening behavior and messages.

Nebraska Teen Charged an Adult Death of 6 Month Old Daughter :30 06/20/21 News2 10pm Sunday

A Nebraska teen has been charged as an adult in the death of his 6-month-old daughter. The Omaha World-Herald reports that 17-year-old Alejandro Flores, of Omaha, was ordered held this week on \$225,000 bail on a charge of intentional child abuse in the death of Ruby Flores-Martinez. She wasn't breathing when police responded to an apartment on June 3. Flores rode in the ambulance to the hospital as medics performed CPR on the baby. She died two days later. The police report said he initially didn't know what happened but later confessed to injuring the girl.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / JOBS / MONEY MATTERS

Consignment Boutique Closing 34 Years :30 04/08/21 News2 6pm Thursday

After thirty-four years, a local boutique is closing its doors. Once More With Style located in downtown North Platte is hosting its retirement sale. They have items for men, women, and children including shirts, outerwear, accessories, and shoes. People are able to find clothing at affordable prices with all the markdowns and additional discounts during their retirement sale. There are some items 50 percent off. Through the years, Once More With Style employees and customers have built relationships with one another.

First Black Woman Union Pacific Locomotive Engineer :30 04/19/21 News2 6pm Monday

The first Black Woman to be a train engineer for the Union Pacific Railroad is releasing a new autobiography about her career. Edwina "Curlie" Justus has written "Union Pacific Engineer," about her 22-year career with the railroad at North Platte. In her book, Justus shares her efforts to become the first African-American woman to work as a train engineer for Union

Pacific during the 1970s, at a time when such a career field was still dominated by men. Both Edwina and her former husband, the late Art Justus, became train engineers for Union Pacific. After the storms hit, the News/Weather team informs the viewers with power outage information, downed trees/limbs, dangerous driving conditions, closed roadways and other helpful emergency information in times of need, and how to help in the aftermath.

Updates on North Platte River Water Supply :30 04/09/21 News2 10pm Friday

On April 9, the Bureau of Reclamation- Wyoming office presented information about the North Platte River water supply and the Glendo reservoir. There is incoming snowmelt. The Bureau of Wyoming shared that the reservoirs have additional storage and preparation that they are holding water for the incoming drought season. If there are no additional storms, there could be less water in the reservoirs. As we are entering into the runoff season, we could see more water stored during this time.

Robert Vesely who lives in Spencer was able to capture what he believes is the sound of the earthquake from a camera inside his garage Friday morning. Although you can't see any movement, a quake-like sound is audible.

Missouri River Expected to See Lower Flows this Year :30 06/06/21 News2 10pm Sunday

Two years after Missouri River flooding ravaged parts of Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas and Missouri, officials are now dealing with what's shaping up to be one of the river's driest years. The Norfolk (Nebraska) Daily News reports that significantly less water is expected to flow into the river this year because conditions remain so dry and snowpack is below normal levels. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers says its forecast from last month hasn't changed. The Corps estimated Thursday that 17.9 million acre feet of water will flow into the river this year.

Nebraska Offer Additional Payments 2019 Flood Relief :30 06/19/21 News2 6pm Saturday

Nebraska will pay out public assistance beyond what it normally offers to local governments hit by the 2019 floods. The Nebraska Emergency Management Agency says Gov. Pete Ricketts has approved the payments for the state's share of disaster relief. The money will go to Nebraska's power, irrigation and natural resources districts, which don't usually receive that form of assistance from the state. The agency says Ricketts approved the state share because of the extent of flood, wind, and winter storm damage. Ricketts' decision

follows President Joe Biden's move to increase the federal cost share from the normal 75% of the cost to 90%.

On April 8, DHHS, the Douglas County Health Department, and Nebraska Medicine consulted with CDC and FDA about a rare and severe type of blood clot diagnosed in a Nebraska resident. On April 13, CDC and FDA released a joint statement recommending a pause on Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccinations nationwide while more investigation is completed.

Live on Nebraska Share Importance of Organ Donation :30 04/15/21 News2 6pm Thursday

April is Donate Life Month. Right now, there are 300 people across the state that are in need of a life-saving transplant. In 2020, Live On Nebraska reports having over 1,000 donors including 670 tissue donors, 264 birth tissue donors and 72 organ donors. The Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services has announced the resumption of offering the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine. Appropriate providers should resume administering doses of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, according to state officials. Nebraska is following Friday's recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in lifting the pause. The two federal agencies had earlier recommended a pause in using Johnson & Johnson doses. The safety and effectiveness of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine has been confirmed by the CDC and the FDA. Nebraska providers who have a current supply of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine should resume using those doses, according to state officials.

FDA Authorizes Pfizers Covid 19 Vaccine for Children 12 to 15:30 05/10/21 News2 6pm Monday

U.S. regulators on Monday expanded the use of Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine to children as young as 12, offering a way to protect the nation's adolescents before they head back to school in the fall and paving the way for them to return to more normal activities. Shots could begin as soon as Thursday, after a federal vaccine advisory committee issues recommendation for using the two-dose vaccine in 12- to 15-year-olds. An announcement is expected Wednesday. Most COVID-19 vaccines worldwide have been authorized for adults. Pfizer's vaccine is being used in multiple countries for teens as young as 16, and Canada recently became the first to expand use to 12 and up.

The communities that make up the six counties that are contained within the West Central District Health Department are some of the lowest by percentage in vaccine rates, and highest in positivity rates, in not only the state but the country right now, according to published comparisons. And the WCDHD's Executive Director Shannon Vanderheiden says she is hearing from all over the country and internationally about it.

North Platte Receives Special Award from the Governor :30 04/06/21 News2 Midday Tuesday

This week, Governor Pete Ricketts signed a proclamation declaring April 5-9, 2021, as Community Development Week (CD Week) in the state of Nebraska. The Gov. also named the City of North Platte as the recipient of 2021's "Governor's Showcase Community Award" for outstanding achievements in economic development and the impactful use of state and federal funds.

Updates on the Lincoln County Jail Remodeling Project :30 04/12/21 News2 10pm Monday

New cells were added to the Lincoln County Jail as a part of the remodeling project on Monday. The Lincoln County Jail is going to house federal inmates as well as inmates from neighboring counties and the state of Nebraska. Other agencies pay to house inmates at the Lincoln County jail. The jail collects roughly \$30,000 a week. That money will fund the remodeling project once the remodeling is completed. The money will not come from Lincoln County taxpayers. As a part of the project, the booking area is being updated to add more observation rooms for mentally ill patients. The full renovation project is scheduled to be completed around November 2021.

Expanded Consumer Firework Sales Bill Advances in the Legislature :30 04/14/21 News2 10pm Wednesday

After a 34-2 vote Wednesday, legislation to expand consumer fireworks in Nebraska has passed to the next stage in the Unicameral. Local firework businesses say it's a good first step, but there's work to be done. Firework stores in Nebraska said there was a boom in business last year after firework shows were canceled. Missouri made \$51 million in firework sales in 2019. Nebraska made \$6.6 million. Even with the possibility of expanded firework sales, local businesses say safety plays a big role. The current bill, LB 152, gives the final say to the state fire marshal to determine what are safe and unsafe fireworks.

Nebraska Advances Phaseout of Social Security Income Taxes :30 04/27/21 News2 Sunrise Tuesday

Nebraska has taken a big step toward phasing out taxes on Social Security income, but lawmakers say they might limit the benefit for higher earners. Lawmakers gave initial approval, 47-0, to a bill that would eliminate the tax over 10 years. Two additional votes are required before the proposal heads to Gov. Pete Ricketts. Nebraska has roughly 320,000 residents that rely on some form of Social Security, either as a retirement, disability, or survivor benefit.

Sherriff's Adding New Cameras to Patrol Vehicles :30 05/03/21 News2 6pm Monday

The Lincoln County Sheriff Office is purchasing new cameras for their patrol vehicles. The current car cameras are outdated and between 11 to 12 years old. Lieutenant Newton went before the Lincoln County Commissioners for final approval to purchase the cameras on May 3. The cameras will be bought through a state of Nebraska contract. The price is a little over \$150,000. The sheriff's office will purchase 20 cameras and 26 radios.

Lawmakers Approve Casino Regulations :30 05/20/21 News2 6pm Thursday

Nebraska lawmakers have passed a bill that would implement provisions of a constitutional gaming amendment approved last year. Nebraska voters legalized all forms of games of chance at licensed horse racetracks through an initiative petition drive last November. Senator Tom Briese introduced <u>LB561</u>, providing the regulatory framework necessary to implement that constitutional amendment.

Second Annual First Responders Picnic :30 05/23/21 News2 5pm Sunday

On May 23, residents gathered in Cody Park for the second annual First Responders Picnic. Members from North Platte's Fire and Rescue Department and North Platte Police Department were socializing with kids and parents. "I love these things. I am a people person. I enjoy people asking questions and talking to them," said Deputy Fire Marshall Mike McConnell. People were able to meet local first responders in uniform in a non-emergency situation. Attendees of the picnic could also explore an ambulance, fire truck and police patrol vehicle. The departments plan on hosting another picnic in May of 2022.

Officials Push Nebraska Complete Long Delayed Expressways :30 06/14/21 News2 Sunrise Monday

Officials in northeast Nebraska continue to press the state to complete its long-delayed system of four-lane expressways to connect every community larger than 15.000 people to an Interstate. About 178 miles of the 600-mile system remains undone 33 years after the expressway system was launched back in 1988. Concerns about the projects prompted a group of state senators and a lobbying group of area businesses and cities, called 4 Lanes 4 Nebraska, to push for progress in the Legislature this spring. Transportation Department officials say progress is being made even if it's not coming as fast as some want.

Parents of Three Girls Killed in 2019 Crash Sue Sarpy County :30 06/14/21 News2 Midday Monday

The parents of three girls killed in a traffic crash in 2019 are suing Sarpy County. The lawsuit claims the design of the road where the girls were killed was deficient. The families want the county to fix Platteview Road and other parts of the county's southern thoroughfare. The lawsuit also challenges Nebraska's \$5 million cap on judgments against government entities. The lawsuit was filed by the families of 16-year-old Abigail Barth; 15-year-old Alexandria Minardi; and 16-year-old Addisyn Pfeifer, all of Gretna. The families of a fourth girl who was killed and another who was injured did not join the lawsuit.

Body Scanners Inbound :30 06/14/21 News2 Midday Monday

The Lincoln County Jail is getting safer. During the daily Lincoln County Commissioners meeting today, the Lincoln County Commissioners are discussing legislation about new body scanners at the Lincoln County Jail. These measures are after an increase in security problems at the jail. Not only the employees are going to be in a better environment at the jail, but the prisoners too.

Buffalo County Employees Get Friday Off :30 06/17/21 News2 6pm Thursday

Buffalo County workers will benefit from the newly declared federal holiday. President Biden Thursday signed a bill passed by both the House and Senate which establishes June 19 or "Juneteenth" as a national holiday. It commemorates June 19, 1865, when Texas slaves were informed of freedom by Union soldiers two months after the Civil War ended and 2 1/2 years after the Emancipation Proclamation. On Thursday afternoon, Governor Ricketts notified state workers that they would get Friday, June 18, as a holiday in concert with the federal holiday.
