ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Allen Back in Jail in Frontier County :30 08/11/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

It was ordered by a judge that 23-year old Maxwell Allen of McCook be taken back into custody by the Frontier County Sheriff on August 7th for violating his bond by failing a drug test on August 6th. Allen was out of jail on a bond set at ten percent of \$100,000. He is facing seven felony drug charges in Frontier County.

Troopers Find 2300 Pounds of Marijuana During Motorist Assist :30 08/17/20 News2 Midday Monday

Neb. Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested one person after discovering nearly 2,300 pounds of marijuana during a motorist assist on Interstate 80. When a trooper stopped to assist, the trooper became suspicious of criminal activity. The driver, Nolan Amado, 33, of Buckeye, Arizona, was arrested for possession of marijuana – more than one pound, possession with intent to deliver, and no drug tax stamp. Amado was lodged in Dawson County lail.

Medical Marijuana Ballot Initiative Gets Enough Signatures :30 08/26/20 News2 6pm Wednesday

Nebraskans for Medical Marijuana announced Wednesday that their signature drive succeeded in collecting enough signatures to put their constitutional amendment to legalize medical marijuana on the 2020 statewide ballot. The Nebraska Constitution requires petitioners to collect signatures from 10% of registered voters to qualify a constitutional amendment for the ballot. That threshold, as of July 2 when the campaign's signatures were submitted, was 122,275.

Meth Arrest Leads to Discovery of Stolen ATV :30

08/31/20 News2 6pm Monday

Troopers and investigators with the Nebraska State Patrol arrested a Newman Grove man and have recovered stolen property thanks to continued investigation. Friday morning, troopers arrested Roger Weichman, 49, of Newman Grove, for possession of methamphetamine after contacting him in a pickup that was stopped in rural Pierce County. During the ongoing investigation, troopers located an ATV that had previously been reported stolen from Knox County. Additional potentially stolen items were located in the vehicle, which was discovered on Saturday.

Monday Accident Sends Four to Hospital :30 09/01/20 News2 10pm Tuesday

A drunk driver sent himself and three others to Great Plains Health with injuries ranging from minor to life threatening with his actions on Monday. On August 31 at 9:21 p.m., the call came in about a two vehicle injury accident around mile marker 99 on U.S. Highway 83. Eli Brooks was medically cleared and arrested by Nebraska State Patrol for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol above .15. Brooks was placed in the Lincoln County Detention Center. The case remains under investigation by Nebraska State Patrol and Lincoln County Sheriff's Office. Alcohol is a factor in the accident.

North Platte Teens Arrested Following Shots Fired From Vehicle :30 09/08/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

On Monday around 5:25 p.m., the Lincoln County 911 Center received a report of a vehicle traveling on East State Farm Road shooting guns out the window while the vehicle was in motion. Deputies arrived and found the vehicle was occupied by five boys. Deputies smelled burnt marijuana inside the vehicle and searched it. Deputies located two separate pistols in the vehicle, one of which was recently stolen in Brady. Controlled substance was found in the vehicle as well. All five of the young men were arrested for various charges.

Troopers Arrest 73 Impaired Drivers in Drive Sober Campaign :30 09/09/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

Nebraska State Patrol troopers removed 73 impaired drivers from the road during the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaign to close out the summer driving season. The effort, which ran from August 21 through September 7, was part of a national campaign involving law enforcement agencies throughout the country. In addition to the 73 arrests for driving under the influence, troopers also issued citations for speeding (1,196), driving under suspension (97), no proof of insurance (54), open container (24), minor in possession (17), no seat belt (26), and improper child restraint (13). Troopers also performed 767 motorist assists for drivers in need of help on the road.

Ecstasy, Marijuana, Handgun Found During I-80 Traffic Stop :30 09/14/20 News2 10pm Sunday

Troopers observed an eastbound Kia Optima traveling at 101 miles per hour on I-80 near mile marker 152 at around 9:40 p.m. Sunday. During the traffic stop, the trooper detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed 970 pills of suspected ecstasy, four pounds of marijuana, drug paraphernalia, and a loaded handgun.

Investigators Find Controlled Pills at North Platte Business :30 09/18/20 News2 Midday Friday

Thursday morning, investigators with the CODE (Cooperative Operation for Drug Enforcement) Task Force served a search warrant at a business at 1909 East 4th Street in North Platte. During the search, investigators located more than 500 Alprazolam pills, commonly known as Xanax. The owner of the business, Michael Hunt, 46, was present at the time of the search. Investigators then served another search warrant at Hunt's residence, at 492 West North River

Road. Investigators found a .50 caliber rifle and approximately 5,000 rounds of ammunition for various firearms at the residence.

Advocates to File New Medical Marijuana Amendment Language for 2022 :30 09/28/20 News2 Midday Monday

After the most recent attempt was stopped by the Nebraska Supreme Court, advocates for medical marijuana in Nebraska plan to submit new petition language on Monday. At 1 pm, Nebraskans for Medical Marijuana will file new petition language with Secretary of State Robert Evnen that the committee intends to qualify for the November 2022 ballot in Nebraska, according to a release. In early September, the Nebraska Supreme Court removed the 2020 medical cannabis initiative from the ballot, ruling that the initiative did not meet the single-subject requirement for ballot initiatives.

Showman from various ages boasted their knowledge of the animals to the judges. Due to COVID 19 restrictions spectators were not allowed in the barns to view the animals. Social distancing was highly encouraged among those watching the presentations.

27 Cats, 3 Lizards and 1 Hamster Removed from Home :30 07/28/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

The Nebraska Humane Society was called to help remove dozens of animals from an Omaha home Tuesday afternoon while assisting with an eviction. What they found inside was

unexpected: 27 cats, three lizards, and one hamster, according to Kelly Brown with the NHS. The owner of the pets gave up her rights to the animals.

Bison Roaming South Central Nebraska :30 08/26/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

As of Thursday morning, the Phelps County Sheriff's office is investigation the possibility of one bison being shot by a resident, this after a herd got loose Wednesday morning. According to the sheriff's department the owner of the bison has brought in a professional company that specializes in capturing the animal. Phelps County Sheriff Gene Samuelson asked that residents not to take matters into their owns hands by shooting at or attempting to capture them on their own, but to let the experts make contact with the animals themselves. At and least two bison have been killed after being struck by vehicles today on Highway 23 in south central Nebraska Wednesday.

Horseback Riding Through Labor Day Weekend :30 09/07/20 News2 10pm Monday

COVID-19 may have made it hard to find activities to do on Labor Day. Over at Dusty Trails, some people chose to saddle up to enjoy this holiday weekend. Horse lovers and riders of all ages rode through Buffalo Bill's Historic Ranch and along the North Platte River keeping their eyes open for wildlife as they galloped through the beautiful serene landscape. All of the riders were a horse apart complying with CDC social distancing guidelines which made this a great activity on Labor Day Weekend. The Dusty Trail provided the perfect setting to spend time with family while creating memories to last lifetime.

BBB Scam Alert: Don't Plant Mystery Seeds from China :30 07/28/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Recipients should hold on to the seeds, and the original packaging, until someone from the state department of agriculture or APHIS contacts them. Under no circumstances should anyone plant the seeds. The package bears the name "China Post" and may be labeled as jewelry, small electronics, or some other item.

Groceries Are Getting More Expensive :30 08/06/20 News2 Midday Thursday

Prices are spiking at supermarkets, and it's not just because people are eating in and dining out less. From February to June, meat and poultry prices rose nearly 11%. Beef and veal prices recorded the highest climb - spiking 20%. People are paying more for other staples, too. Egg prices are up 10%, and cereals and fresh vegetables are up 4%. This is all new data from the Bureau of Economic Analysis which tracks personal consumption expenditures to help measure inflation.

Having a Fun and Safe Time on the River :30 08/10/20 News2 10pm Monday

With COVID-19 shutting down many places, the river has become one of the main hot-spots for folk in and near North Platte. Staying safe on the water is important. According to emergency officials, the river is seeing more people than normal for this time of year. The Director of Emergency Management for Lincoln County Brandon Myers explains the importance of preparing for a day on the river. "Stay hydrated, drink plenty of water before during and after. Put sunscreen on and again be mindful of what the water is doing. If the water is high or if it's moving fast be sure to keep those in consideration."

North Platte Pharmacies Participating in Drug Disposal Program :30 08/25/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

Seven pharmacies across North Platte will be accepting leftover medications this week in an effort to help reduce drug overdoses in the state. Unneeded medications can be dropped off safely and free of charge at Depot Drug, Walgreens, U-Save Pavilion Pharmacy, Westfield Pharmacy, Great Plains Health, RX Express Pharmacy, and U-Save Pharmacy. The initiative comes after Nebraska Governor Pete Ricketts declared August 24 - August 31 Nebraska Drug Overdose Awareness Week. Data from The Nebraska DHHS shows that every five days someone dies from an overdose in Nebraska.

Hyundai Warns Owners to Park Outside Recalls 180,000 SUVS :30 09/11/20 News2 Sunrise Friday

For the second time this month, Hyundai is telling some SUV owners to park outdoors because an electrical short in a computer can cause vehicles to catch fire. The Korean automaker is recalling about 180,000 Tucson SUVs in the U.S. from 2019 through 2021 to fix the problem. The company says corrosion can cause a short circuit in defective anti-lock brake circuit boards that can start a fire.

CRIME AND PERSONAL SAFETY

Dawson Co. Sheriff Arrests Shawn Erpelding :30 07/05/20 News2 10pm Sunday

The state patrol confirmed that Dawson County Sheriff's deputies Monday arrested Shawn Erpelding. Dawson County Deputies had stopped to assist a stranded motor vehicle on Interstate 80 about 9:00 AM Sunday. A male, identified as Shawn Erpelding, then ran from the scene towards the Platte River. The state patrol and other law enforcement agencies were then alerted to search for him.

Omaha Woman who Shot Husband Near Cozad Released on Bond :30 07/10/20 News2 Midday Friday

A University of Nebraska Medical Center resident physician accused of killing her husband near Cozad was released on a ten percent bond of one million dollars Thursday. The 31-year-old is accused of fatally shooting her husband in front of their two children while stopped along Interstate 80 on June 17. Jourdan is charged with second-degree murder and use of a deadly weapon in the death of her husband, 35-year-old Joshua Jourdan.

Two Killed in Crash on Hwy 83:30 07/14/20 News2 10pm Tuesday

Nebraska State Patrol and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department responded to a fatality crash on Highway 83 on Tuesday. The Lincoln County 911 Center received a call at 6:49 p.m. of a head on collision at mile marker 93 on U.S. Highway 83, around seven miles north of North Platte. Deputies discovered the two male subjects in the passenger vehicle were deceased. The driver of the semi-truck had minor injuries.

Community Mourns Death of Broken Bow Business Owner :30 07/13/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

The community of Broken Bow mourned the loss of a local business owner who was murdered over the weekend. People, including family members stopped by to pay their respects to 62-year-old Crystal Esch, also known as Cris, at Costa's Styling Salon Monday. Esch was the owner of the salon that is located in the downtown area. It's a tragedy that has deeply impacted the community.

Curtis Man Pleads Guilty to First Degree Assault :30 08/10/20 News2 6pm Monday

A Curtis man was due for trial in Frontier County after nearly killing his wife. On July 27, 2020, Matthew Farr plead guilty in a plea agreement to first degree assault and use of a deadly weapon to commit a felony. A court report by a Frontier County Sheriff's Deputy indicated that the couple had been arguing in the pickup Farr was driving on March 5, 2018, when he allegedly reached over to open the door and pushed her out of the pickup. The pickup then went forward and stopped on top of her and then eventually moved off of her.

Troopers Recover Stolen Vehicle Driven by 14-Year-Old :30 08/12/20 News2 6pm Wednesday

During the traffic stop, the driver, a 14-year-old girl was taken into custody on several charges, including possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, no operator's license, and theft by receiving stolen property. The juvenile had also been reported missing. She was lodged in the Lancaster County Youth Services Center. There were two passengers in the vehicle at the time of the traffic stop. One passenger, Jay Schultz, 43, of Lincoln, was arrested on multiple outstanding warrants. Schultz was lodged in Lancaster County Jail. The other passenger, an 18-year-old male, was released.

North Platte Police Department Investigate 26 Year-Old Woman's Death :30 08/12/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

The North Platte Police Department is investigating the death of a 26-year-old woman. Police were called to the 2600 Block of West 21st Street at 7:01 p.m. Tuesday. The woman was found deceased inside the home. Foul play is not suspected at this time. The death remains under investigation. An autopsy has been ordered.

15-Year-Old Boy Missing from North Platte :30 08/17/20 News2 Midday Monday

Chief Deputy Rolland Kramer with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department said Crue is classified as a runaway. He said there are people in North Platte who know where Crue is hiding and they need to do the right thing and tell someone where he can be found. Kramer said a tip can be given anonymously through Lincoln County Crimestoppers, or by simply calling law enforcement. Crue's mom, Natasha Jarvis Burch, has made a plea on Facebook hoping to locate her son.

Nebraska Physician Charged in Husbands Death Pleads Not Guilty :30 08/17/20 News2 6pm Monday

A Nebraska resident physician accused of fatally shooting her husband in front of their two children in June pled not guilty in Dawson County District Court Monday. Kathleen Jourdan told police she shot her husband because she feared for herself and children during an argument between the couple inside their vehicle, which pulled over alongside Interstate 80. The two children were placed into protective custody with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. Dawson County Judge Jeffrey Wightman set Jourdan's bond at 10 percent of \$1 million, which Jourdan posted last month. District Judge James Doyle continued her bond.

Suspect Arrested After Driving into Cornfield in Pursuit :30 08/25/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

NSP received citizen reports of a vehicle driving extremely slowly on residential streets in Aurora for an extended period of time. A trooper located the vehicle and attempted to make contact, but the vehicle fled. The suspect vehicle, a Chevrolet Tahoe, accelerated to more than 50 miles per hour on residential streets in Aurora. The trooper initiated a pursuit. Troopers did not pursue into the field, but set up a perimeter in the area, along with the Aurora Police Department, Hamilton County Sheriff's Office, NSP Air Wing, and NSP Police Service Dog Units.

Arson Investigation at Elementary School in Central Nebraska :30 08/26/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

According to a press release, Kearney Police were called to investigate a possible fire call at Bryant Elementary School on Tuesday evening. Officers found smoke in the building and fire sprinklers were already activated suppressing the fire. It was determined that a paper towel dispenser had been set on fire in the boy's bathroom inside the school. This incident is currently under investigation as a possible arson by Kearney Police, Nebraska State Fire Marshal, and Kearney Vol. Fire Department.

Lincoln County Dive Team searches to Locate Vehicle in the North Platte River, Instead find a Boat :30 08/24/20 News2 6pm Monday

The Lincoln County Dive Team searched the North Platte River for four hours after a kayaker spotted what they believed was a vehicle submerged in the water at around 12:20 p.m. Monday. After thoroughly searching the area for four hours, they located a small white Jon boat, not a vehicle. Law enforcement said they do not plan to retrieve it.

North Platte Man Wanted on Warrant :30 09/02/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

The North Platte man who took law enforcement across the city Friday has escaped custody. 28-year old Rosendo Duran was arrested Friday after running from the Nebraska State Patrol and the Lincoln County Police Department, first by a pursuit in two separate stolen vehicles, and then on-foot. Cody Thomas with the Nebraska State Patrol is confirming that law enforcement put a hold on arresting Duran by taking him to Great Plains Health for evaluation.

Active Search Underway:30 09/03/20 News2 6pm Thursday

The Lincoln County Detention Center lists the 28-year-old as Rosendo Duran Jr. He was arrested on August 28 for fleeing a traffic stop by the NSP, leaving the vehicle and escaping on foot, stealing a pickup, and fleeing on foot, again, in a residential area in North Platte. On September 2, Duran left or "eloped" from Great Plains Health while he was there for a reason not relating to his arrest, according to the NSP. NSP says a tip came in about Duran's whereabouts, and a K-9 with state patrol was able to locate Duran hiding near the South Platte River, near West South River Road.

North Platte Police Department Looking for Runaway :30 09/04/20 News2 Midday Friday

The North Platte Police Department is announcing a missing young woman. 17-year old Aracely Sanchez is reported as a runaway with the department. She left her home in North Platte, and her whereabouts are unknown. Sanchez is 5'2, 120 pounds with brown hair and brown eyes. NPPD says she does not have a vehicle.

City Of McCook Employees Found Dead :30 09/07/20 News2 Midday Monday

McCook police officers found personal items of one of the employees outside the sludge pump house, prompting them to check inside for the men. Due to toxic gases and hazardous materials inside, McCook Fire and Rescue and the Red Willow Western Rural Fire Department Hazardous Material Team came to the scene to recover the bodies of 65-Year-Old Larry Dickie and 43-Year-Old Kenneth Keslin.

Man Dies, Woman Injured in Boating Incident at Lake Mac :30 09/06/20 News2 10pm Sunday

A Colorado man died in a boating incident Saturday afternoon at Lake McConaughy State Recreation Area. A Colorado Springs woman was injured in the same incident. According to reports gathered in the investigation, Campe had fallen overboard from a pontoon boat, and Kiesow, her boyfriend, had jumped in to rescue her. He then had to be rescued by others on the pontoon and another boat nearby.

North Platte Man Arrested for Stalking :30 09/16/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

46-year old Eugene Richter of North Platte was arrested Tuesday morning at 7:30 a.m. on a warrant for "Stalking." The LCSD conducted a search during the arrest, discovering a concealed .9 mm pistol and several magazines. Richter was inside of St. Patrick's Catholic Church at the time of his arrest. Richter did not have an active concealed carry permit, plus he has an active protection order against him, which prohibits him from having a firearm.

Nebraska Native Loses Everything in Fire :30 09/15/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Western wildfires are so intense, people across the mid-west are seeing the smoke even here. As the blazes continue, we learn of a Nebraska native and her family, who lost their home and all of their belongings due to a recent wildfire in Oregon. Those wildfires continue. Haley McKee grew up in Maxwell, and still has family in the area. She worked for some time at a local western outfitters store.

Larry Frost Father of Scott Frost Died Wednesday :30 09/16/20 News2 10pm Wednesday

Some sad news to pass along: Larry Frost, the father of Scott Frost, has died. Larry played for the Huskers in the 1960's. He's in the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame for his athletic career at Malcolm High School. After college, Frost went on to be a high school football coach.

Jake Gardner, Accused of Manslaughter for Shurlock's Death, Has Died By Suicide: 30

09/20/20 News2 10pm Sunday

Jake Gardner, accused of manslaughter for the shooting death of James Scurlock this summer, has died by suicide according to Gardner's attorney, Stu Dornan. A warrant for Gardner's arrest was issued after a grand jury indicted him for manslaughter and other charges related to the death of James Scurlock. Gardner did not turn himself in after the warrant was issued. Gardner was in Oregon. He was supposed to turn himself in today.

Three Teens Headed to Prison for February Attack at YRTC 09/21/20 News2 6pm Monday

Three teenage boys are in prison for convictions related to a vicious beating last winter at the Kearney YRTC. Julian Tapia, 17, was convicted of one count of first-degree assault and three counts of second-degree assault. He's been sentenced to 8-21 years in prison. Jabreen Sidney, 17, was sentenced to 5-15 years in prison for first degree assault. Brendan Lee, 18, was convicted on three counts of aiding and abetting a felony. He was sentenced to two years for each count, but will serve those sentences concurrently, or at the same time.

Newlyweds in Tragic Accident in Sandhills :30 09/21/20 News2 6pm Monday

Ty and Shelby Millison of Dunning, both in their 20's were driving on Highway 91 when their Lincoln town car was hit head-on by a F-350 pickup, according to Blaine County Sheriff Tim Sierks. Ty Millison, 23, died on impact according to Sheriff Sierks. His wife was taken to Kearney and is currently in a medically induced coma. The sheriff said the pickup that collided with the Millison's vehicle had one tire drop off the edge of the highway, and when it came back on the highway the driver overcorrected and hit the couple. The driver of the pickup had non-life-threatening injuries.

Authorities ID Body of Man Found in Lexington Pond :30 09/22/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

The Dawson County Sheriff's Office said the body is that of Eduardo Farias-Garcia, 24, of Lexington, television station NTV reported. Authorities said Farias-Garcia was wearing only shorts and tennis shoes when he was found. He appeared to have been in the water for about a week, investigators said. Results from an autopsy are expected in the coming weeks.

Bailey Boswell Murder Trial Starts Wednesday in Lexington :30 09/22/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Jury selection will start Wednesday for the trial of Bailey Boswell. The 26-year-old is facing first-degree murder charges in the death of Sydney Loofe. The trial is taking place in Lexington, 170 miles away from the home in Wilber where prosecutors said Loofe was strangled and dismembered. Boswell's attorney requested the change of venue because he said the case was too high profile to get a fair trial in Wilber.

Nebraska's leading economic indicator rose during July, according to the most recent report from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The July leading indicator rose 0.59%, the third consecutive monthly increase. The rate of improvement, however, slowed relative to May and June. "The Nebraska economy continues to recover from its sharp decline in March and April, but the pace of recovery appears to have moderated," said economist Eric Thompson, director of the Bureau of Business Research at the university.

It's also expected that federal assistance will make up 50 percent of this year's net farm income. But when the PPP loans came out, 19 percent went to agriculture, impacting 22,000 jobs.

After the storms hit, the News/Weather team informs the viewers with power outage information, downed trees/limbs, dangerous driving conditions, closed roadways and other helpful emergency information in times of need, and how to help in the aftermath.

Flood Warning :30 07/08/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

Releases from Lake McConaughey continue where the North Platte River at North Platte is expected to fluctuate around the flood stage of 6.0 feet through Friday, July 10th. Minor flooding can be expected in low lying and agricultural land nearby. People should be cautioned against being in the water along the banks of the river especially near Cody Park.

Testing the Platte River's Capabilities :30 07/09/20 News2 Midday Thursday

The North Platte "chokepoint" is that reach of the North Platte River extending a few miles on either side of the Highway 83 bridge where the encroachment of invasive phragmites vegetation has significantly reduced the river's flow capacity at flood stage relative to conditions that were present in the late 1990s when PRRIP objectives were originally developed.

Powerful Storm Leaves 2 Dead, Heavy Crop Damage in Midwest :30 08/11/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

Hundreds of thousands across the Midwest remained without electricity on Tuesday after a powerful storm packing 100 mph winds battered the region a day earlier, causing widespread damage to millions of acres of crops and killing at least two people. The storm known as a derecho tore from eastern Nebraska across lowa and parts of Wisconsin and Illinois, blowing over trees, flipping vehicles and causing widespread damage to property and crops.

Nearly all the dozens of people reported missing after a devastating blaze in southern Oregon have been accounted for, authorities said over the weekend as crews battled wildfires that have killed at least 35 from California to Washington state. The smoke filled the air with an acrid metallic smell like pennies and spread to nearby states. While making it difficult to breathe, it helped firefighters by blocking the sun and turning the weather cooler as they tried to get a handle on the blazes, which were slowing in some places.

The man was in his 60s and lived in the West Central District Health Department, which includes Arthur, Hooker, Lincoln, Logan, McPherson and Thomas counties.

Nebraska Once Again Added to Chicago Travel Quarantine Order :30 09/02/20 News2 Sunrise Wednesday

The Chicago Department of Public Health Commissioner issued an Emergency Travel Order directing people traveling to or from Chicago from states experiencing a surge in new COVID-19 cases to quarantine for 14 days. Chicago officials first issued the quarantine order in early July. Initially, it applied to travelers from 15 states but has been updated weekly based on increasing numbers of confirmed cases of the coronavirus. Symptoms of West Nile illness are usually mild, including fever, headache, body aches, fatigue, skin rash on the trunk of the body, swollen lymph glands, and eye pain. However, the symptoms may be more severe, sometimes causing permanent neurological damage, and in some cases may result in death.

Great Plains Health Performs First Brain Surgery :30 09/15/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Great Plains Health Neurosurgeon, W. Lee Warren, MD and the surgical team performed the first brain surgeries at Great Plains Health. The report states the U.S. adult obesity rate passed the 40% mark for the first time, standing at 42.2%. The report found the rate of childhood obesity is also on the rise. They now head to a final, third vote on Thursday, the session's final day, and will then go to Gov. Pete Ricketts, who is expected to sign them.

Lawmakers Pass Tax Cut for Military Retirees :30 08/13/20 News2 Sunrise Thursday

Military retirees who live in Nebraska will get a tax cut starting in 2022 under a bill slated to become state law. Lawmakers gave the measure final approval Wednesday and sent it to Gov. Pete Ricketts, who proposed it at the start of this year's session. The bill would exempt half of a military retiree's benefits from Nebraska state taxes.

Grand Island Mayor Under COVID Quarantine :30 09/01/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

Grand Island Mayor Roger Steele is quarantining. Director Teresa Anderson of the Central District Health Department announced late Tuesday morning that Steele was quarantining because of possible exposure to the coronavirus. Lincoln Police Investigator Mario Herrera was shot on Aug. 26 while trying to serve a warrant. He died early Monday morning. On Monday, along a 60-mile stretch, he was returned to Lincoln, led by police escort from Omaha to Lincoln. That route was lined with

supporters at almost every overpass, at every turn the hearse took. All along the way, people gathered to show respect from the road, to the overpass, to the air. People were waiting for Investigator Herrera as his body was returned home.

Smith Camp was appointed to the court by President George W. Bush in 2001 and was confirmed unanimously by the Senate.
