ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Troopers Find 262 LBS of Marijuana in I-80 Traffic Stop :30 07/08/21 News2 Midday Thursday

According to NSP, at approximately 9:45 a.m. Wednesday, a trooper performed a traffic stop on an eastbound Ford Transit Van for driving on the shoulder of I-80 near Lexington at mile marker 238. During the traffic stop, an NSP K9 detected the odor of a controlled substance coming from inside the vehicle. Troopers searched the vehicle and located 262 pounds of marijuana contained in large boxes in the cargo area of the van. The driver, David Hernandez Fuentes, 24, of Ceres, California, was arrested for possession of marijuana with intent to deliver and no drug tax stamp. He was lodged in Dawson County Jail.

Grant Will Cover Overtime to Keep Drunk Drivers off the Road :30 07/19/21 News2 Midday Monday

The Lincoln County Commissioners voted to sign a grant application that would pay for the Lincoln County Sheriff's overtime as part of the Drive Sober or get Pulled Over campaign between Aug. 20 - Sept. 1. The amount for the Office of Highway Safety grant would be \$15,120 and the sheriff's office applies for these grants on a regular basis.

Troopers Find Drugs and Weapons for Multiple Incidents :30 08/02/21 News2 Midday Monday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested several people after finding controlled substances and firearms in multiple incidents. During the encounter, the trooper detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside one of the vehicles, a Toyota Camry. Troopers then performed a search of the vehicle and located five pounds of methamphetamine and seven ounces of marijuana. Troopers also located a handgun.

Fentanyl Related Overdose Deaths Spike :30 08/17/21 News2 5pm Tuesday

Investigators with the Drug Enforcement Administration Omaha Division, Lincoln Police Department, Omaha Police Department and Nebraska State Patrol are alerting the public to an increase in overdose deaths that began August 10, from fentanyl-laced drugs.

NSP Arrests 55 Latest Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over Campaign :30 09/09/21 News2 6pm Thursday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol removed from the road 55 impaired drivers during the annual *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* campaign to close out the summer travel season. During the campaign, troopers made 55 arrests for driving under the influence. Troopers also issued citations for speeding (930), driving under suspension (91), no proof of insurance (71), minor in possession (9), open alcohol container (18), no seat belt (20), and improper child restraint (8). During the two-week effort, troopers also performed 796 motorist assists. The *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* campaign ran from August 20 through September 6. The effort was made possible thanks in part to a grant for \$25,000 from the Nebraska Department of Transportation – Highway Safety Office.

Logan County Couple Arrested After Pursuit :30 09/14/21 News2 6pm Tuesday

A pursuit in excess of 100-miles per hour at time ended Monday near Stapleton with a Logan County couple arrested. 36-year old Joseph Duran of Logan County is jailed in North Platte after taking a Lincoln County deputy on a high speed chase out of Lincoln County and into Logan County. His wife, 36-year old Alissa Duran is in the Custer County jail for attempting to recover drugs from the incident. The Lincoln County Sheriff's Department reports that during the pursuit, Duran was seen throwing out at least two bags from his vehicle. A search of the bag revealed almost one pound of suspected dispensary Marijuana. A Nebraska State Patrol Trooper recovered another bag that contained at least four ounces of suspected Methamphetamine.

Wild Bat Found in Omaha Henry Doorly Zoo :30 07/09/21 News2 6pm Friday

Dozens of people who spent the night at Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium during a series of camps last weekend are due for a round of rabies shots after a potential exposure at recent overnight events. "On Sunday, July 4, one guest reported to the campout leader that she awoke and noticed a wild bat near her head," Friday's release from the zoo states. No scratches or bite marks were found on the female, but zoo workers rounded up and seven wild bats from inside the Scott Aquarium, where a series of overnight campouts was

held over the weekend. The bats were sent for rabies testing to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's Veterinary Diagnostic Center, and the Douglas County Health Department was notified about the potential exposure.

Paws on the Platte Take Over Westfield Shopping Center :30 07/15/21 News2 6pm Thursday

The ceramic dogs from Paws on the Platte continue their grand tour around North Platte. This weekend, the Westfield Shopping Center is hosting their second "Who let the dogs out?" event. There will be a petting zoo, storytime, and games. This event takes place from 3-5 p.m. on July 16. Next week is the Paws on the Platte's community art celebration and auction. The dogs from this year's Paws on the Platte will be auctioned off as a part of the Paws-itive partner fundraiser on July 23 at Pals Brewery.

Lets Fair with the Dogs :30 07/19/21 Local4 6pm Monday

The Lincoln County Fair of 2021 has begun and the 4-H Club and Open Class Dog Shows were held Monday afternoon at the Lincoln County Fairgrounds. Many dogs of all shapes and sizes went out to the fairgrounds to show their stuff by impressing the judges with tricks and skills that they have learned from their owners. The shows featured handlers with their dogs in obedience and agility.

This allowed artists to unleash their creativity and bring their dogs to life and theme their dogs around things like North Platte, celebrities, movies, activities, occupations, songs, famous artists, and their own pets.

Kids Race Turtles and Toads at the Lincoln County Fair :30 07/26/21 News2 6pm Monday

The Lincoln County Fair had many activities for kids. On Sunday, July 24, the Lincoln County Ag Society hosted the toad and turtle races. CONSUMER PROTECTION

Tyson Foods Recalls More than 8 Million Pounds of Chicken Products :30 07/03/21 News2 6pm Saturday

Tyson Foods is recalling more than 8 million pounds of chicken products that may be contaminated with Listeria, a bacteria that can be especially dangerous for pregnant women. The recall includes frozen, fully cooked chicken products made between December 26, 2020 and April 13, 2021. Three people have become ill and one has died of infections tied to pre-cooked chicken produced at Tyson Foods, the USDA said. Investigators are looking for others who may have gotten sick after eating the chicken.

FBI Says Reports Hate Crimes Rising Nebraska and Iowa :30 07/08/21 News2 10pm Thursday

FBI officials in the Omaha area say that, in the past few years, our region of Iowa and Nebraska — and across the country — reports of hate crimes are increasing. FBI officials in Omaha want to make sure that any possible hate crimes in our area don't go unnoticed. The reporting of incidents that fall in the gray area of free speech and actually committing a crime are up locally, and the complaints are not coming against any particular hate groups.

Schuler Man Scammed into Bitcoin Investment :30 07/15/21 News Midday Thursday

A Schuyler man claims to have lost nearly \$33,000 in an investment scam, according to the Grand Island Police Department. GIPD said Edwin Castillo reportedly lost \$32,980.65 over the course of eight months by being advised to invest in the popular cryptocurrency Bitcoin. According to Castillo, the website he used to invest the money in has since crashed and he's no longer able to access it. The Grand Island Police Department handled Castillo's report.

Hastings Utilities Warns Scams Attempts :30 07/30/21 News2 Midday Friday

Scammers are once again disguising themselves as the Hastings Utilities Department, and customers are asked to be aware of these attempts to get their money or personal information. The department reported that an automated call is warning customers that their utilities will be disconnected within 30 minutes unless immediate payment is provided. The call prompts the customer to dial 1 on a call menu to reach a customer service representative. The Hastings Utilities Department does not operate in this manner and has never employed an outside agency to collect payments.

Omaha Meat Processor Recalls more than 295,000 Pounds of Raw Beef :30 07/31/21 News2 6pm Saturday

An Omaha meat processor has recalled more than 295,000 pounds of raw beef products intended to be made into ground beef that may be contaminated with E. coli. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service announced Greater Omaha Packing's recall Thursday. The beef products were produced on July 13 and bear establishment number "EST. 960A" inside the USDA mark of inspection. The packages were distributed in Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota and Nebraska. Officials say contamination was discovered when FSIS collected a routine product sample that confirmed positive for the presence of E. coli.

CRIME AND PERSONAL SAFETY

Pleasanton Man Who Died in Fatal Shooting Faced Multiple Charges :30 07/07/21 News2 10pm Wednesday

According to court records, 23-year-old Marcus S. Keyser of Pleasanton, was scheduled to appear in Buffalo County District Court on Tuesday for a hearing on three charges of felony first-degree sexual assault in December of 2020. Keyser pleaded not guilty to those charges. Court documents show Keyser allegedly assaulted two victims on three separate charges. The charges were dismissed Wednesday in Buffalo County. In a press release, the Lexington Police Department said the shooting occurred at 3:11 a.m. on Tuesday on the 800 block of West 9th Street. No further details were provided.

Losing Control :30 07/07/21 News2 10pm Wednesday

An Oregon man lost control of his vehicle on July 6 just before 7 p.m. south of Maxwell on South Cottonwood Canyon Road. 43-year old Tucker Mortensen of Tualatin, Oregon was

arrested arrested for Driving Under the Influence First Offense after failing a field sobriety test. The test was confirmed further with a breath sample above the legal limit at the Lincoln County Detention Center. Mortensen was issued a citation for Driving Under the Influence and released to an adult, as possible injuries from the accident kept him from being able to be incarcerated.

Van Crashes into Local Salon :30 07/08/21 News2 Midday Thursday

A 74-year old woman walked away uninjured after her vehicle crashed into a local salon Wednesday afternoon. First responders were dispatched to Salon Callidora at 3 p.m.. Police say Marlene Rowlette attempted to park her Dodge Caravan when she hit the accelerator rather than the break. There were no injuries in the accident. About 50 thousand dollars worth of damages is estimated.

80 Year Old Woman Sentenced 8-10 Years :30 07/12/21 News2 10pm Monday

On July 12, Lavetta Langdon, an 80-year-old McCook woman, appeared in Red Willow County Court for sentencing after being convicted of murdering her husband, Larry Langdon in August of 2020. Court documents said she shot him twice in his sleep and confessed to the police. The two had been married since 1960. Lavetta said she was abused for over fifty years by her husband. Red Willow County Attorney Paul Wood, on behalf of the state, gave insights from doctors on Lavetta's case to show that there was a motive and that it gave elements of first-degree murder. Larry's murder was captured on a home security video and reviewed by the judge.

Nebraska Man Killed After Being Pinned Between Semitrailers :30 07/13/21 News2 6pm Tuesday

Authorities say a man has died after being pinned between two semitrailer trucks in southwestern Nebraska. The Omaha World-Herald reports that the accident happened Sunday in Wauneta, killing 54-year-old Brian Stute of Benkelman. The Nebraska State Patrol says Stute had parked his semi at a grain elevator to unload and was at the rear of the trailer when the driver of another semi parked behind his. Investigators say that when the other driver got out to talk to Stute, the rig rolled down a slope and pinned Stute. He was taken to a nearby hospital, where he was pronounced dead. The patrol is investigating.

Colorado Man Arrested Following Chase in Buffalo County :30 07/16/21 Local4 Midday Friday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested a Colorado man following a pursuit on Interstate 80 early Friday morning. At approximately 1:30 a.m. Friday, a trooper clocked a 2012 Audi traveling 103 miles per hour on I-80 eastbound near Kearney. The trooper attempted a traffic stop, but the vehicle accelerated and fled. The trooper initiated a pursuit. The vehicle reached speeds in excess of 150 miles per hour during the pursuit, before the vehicle exited at the Shelton interchange, driving north to Highway 30 and eventually stopping after becoming high-centered on railroad tracks at the junction of Highway 30 and Schauppsville road.

TN Man Sentenced Child Porn Case Following Stop Nebraska :30 07/22/21 News2 6pm Thursday

A Tennessee man has been sentenced to more than 30 years for producing child pornography. US District Court Judge for Nebraska John Gerrad sentenced Robert Lee

Wright, 38, to 400 months imprisonment for production of child pornography and distribution of child pornography. There is no parole in the federal system. After his release, Wright will be on supervised release for life and be required to register as a sex offender. Additionally, Wright was ordered to pay \$66,000 in restitution.

3 Year Old Missing at Johnson Lake Drowned :30 07/22/21 News2 Sunrise Thursday

The Gosper County Sheriff's Office says a 3-year-old girl drowned at Johnson Lake after a flotation toy she was on overturned. A news release says that the child, identified as Avery Grace Mendiola, of Lexington, was riding on a flotation toy that had drifted out to the main area of the lake. Authorities were called around 5:45 p.m. on Wednesday after witnesses said the toy flipped over and the child fell into the water. Initial reports indicated the child wasn't wearing a life jacket.

Two Suspects Arraigned in Lexington Drive By Shooting :30 07/27/21 News2 6pm Tuesday

Two 19-year-old suspects accused of killing a Lexington man earlier this month in a drive-by shooting were arraigned in Dawson County Court Tuesday morning. Adalberto Saenz-Gonzalez and Francisco Hernandez-Corona appeared before Judge Jeffrey Wightman. They are being charged with first-degree murder and use of a deadly weapon to commit a felony in the shooting death of 23-year-old Marcus Keyser. Both men plead not guilty to the charges. They are being held in the Dawson County Detention Center on \$1 million bonds. The Lexington Police Department said Keyser was found with gun shot wounds in front of his garage on the 800 block of West 9th Street at around 3 a.m. on July 6.

Sentencing Hearing Set for November :30 08/02/21 News2 10pm Monday

A sentencing hearing has been set in the case of Bailey Boswell. Boswell was convicted last October of killing and dismembering Sydney Loofe in 2017. According to the Nebraska Judicial Branch, the case is slated for Nov. 8, 2021 at 10 a.m. before a three-judge panel. The panel includes Judge Vicky L. Johnson, Judge Darla S. Ideus and Judge Peter C. Bataillon. The three-judge panel will decide whether there's enough evidence to warrant the death penalty. The hearing will be held on the third floor of the Saline County Courthouse in Wilber. The defendant is ordered to be transported to the courthouse by the sheriff.

1 Million Bond Set for Brian Rosenthal :30 08/03/21 News2 Midday Tuesday

A Nemaha County judge set Brian Rosenthal's bond at \$1 million on Tuesday morning. He would have to pay 10 percent of that to get out of jail. Rosenthal is accused of sexually assaulting a child on four occasions between December 2017 and February 2018. According to court documents filed in Nemaha County, the child was between the ages of 12-16 years old. Each count carries a mandatory minimum sentence of 15 years in prison if convicted.

Indian Meadows Golf Course Facing Thousands of Dollars in Damage :30 08/03/21 News2 10pm Tuesday

Few details are known about the damage caused at North Platte's Indian Meadows Golf Course. Damage was found with golf carts, and the golf course itself. People are asked to contact the North Platte Police Department or Lincoln County Sheriff's Department with any information about the vandalism. News 2 is being told estimates of damage to the carts and course could reach as high as \$50,000.

Nebraska State Trooper Passes Away:30

08/05/21 News2 10pm Thursday

The Nebraska State Patrol family is mourning the sudden loss of Trooper Nicholas Goodwin #73. Trooper Goodwin, 37, passed away Thursday in Scottsbluff. He was a 14-year veteran of the Nebraska State Patrol and served in the Carrier Enforcement Division, stationed in Scottsbluff. Trooper Goodwin was found early Thursday afternoon inside his patrol vehicle, outside the NSP office in Scottsbluff, with an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound. NSP has requested that the Scottsbluff County Sheriff's Office investigate the incident.

Pilot Walks Away in Experimental Plane Crash in Fillmore County :30 08/06/21 News2 6pm Friday

A pilot from Arkansas walked away after his experimental plane crashed Friday morning in a Nebraska cornfield. Fillmore County Sheriff Bill Burgess said the crash happened around 7 a.m. Burgess said Peter Muller of Clinton, Arkansas told him that his plane lost power while he was trying to fly between Manhattan, Kansas and Grand Island. The plane crashed into a cornfield just north of Highway 6 about four miles west of Fairmont. Burgess said Muller was flying the plane in stages as part of a longer trip from Clinton, Arkansas to Boise, Idaho.

Man Nearly Beaten to Death Arrest Made :30 08/12/21 News2 Midday Thursday

The North Platte Police Department is naming the young man in a violent assault in North Platte as 23-year-old Geoffery Allen. Allen has died from his injuries. Now, 20-year old Logan Divine is being charged with 1st Degree Murder and Use of a Weapon to Commit a Felony. According to police, 20-year-old Logan Divine hit, kicked and struck the victim with a baseball bat several times at two locations in North Platte.

Kenesaw Suspect Now at Mary Lanning :30 09/13/21 News2 6pm Monday

The man whose actions forced Kenesaw residents to shelter-in-place for several hours Saturday is now in the Behavioral Services Unit at Mary Lanning Hospital in Hastings. Adams County Chief Deputy Kevin Mauck told Local4 Monday that the man was taken into custody around 4:30 p.m. Saturday near the railroad tracks on the west side of Kenesaw. A message Saturday from the Adams County Emergency Management office indicated that there was man walking around town carrying a weapon. Mauck said the man reportedly threatened to harm himself, but no weapon was found when the suspect was taken into custody. He was then taken to Mary Lanning hospital.

Man Found Deceased Near South River Bridge :30 09/14/21 News2 Midday Monday

Police were called to the 1500 Block of South Jeffers at around 10:37 a.m. Sunday. Public Information Officer Matt Elder said officers found a 59-year-old man deceased under the bridge. Investigators determined there was no foul play and the man died of natural causes. The North Platte Police Department extends its condolences to the family of the deceased. The North Platte Fire Department and Lincoln County Sheriff's Office also assisted with the investigation.

After the storms hit, the News/Weather team informs the viewers with power outage information, downed trees/limbs, dangerous driving conditions, closed roadways and other helpful emergency information in times of need, and how to help in the aftermath.

Storm Damage Delays US Senior Opens 3rd Round in Omaha :30 07/10/21 News2 6pm Saturday

A severe overnight storm with damaging winds has caused the third round of the U.S. Senior Open to be pushed back three hours. Winds topping 50 mph knocked over television camera towers and downed trees at the Omaha Country Club and left about 200,000 people across the city without electricity. Tournament officials had announced Friday that play would begin at 7:15 a.m. local time, with the hope of avoiding inclement weather. But heavy rain and high winds began shortly after midnight, and there was a continued threat of storms throughout the day. Jim Furyk starts the day with a two-shot lead.

Nebraska Public Power District continues to restore power to customers following the strong storms that moved across the state Friday evening and Saturday morning. First Death Due to Delta Covid 19 Variant :30 07/08/21 News2 6pm Thursday

LLCHD said it was a woman in her 40s who was hospitalized. She was fully vaccinated, but according to Scott Holmes with the Environmental Health Division, she had underlying conditions that put her at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19. Special testing at the Nebraska Public Health Lab identified the delta variant (B.1617). Vaccination remains the best protection against the virus and its variants, and recent studies show it helps prevent serious illness and hospitalizations, according to Holmes. LLCHD also pointed to CDC data from several states that shows 99.5% of people who have died from COVID-19 in the U.S. were unvaccinated.

Pandhandle Mosquitos Test Positive for West Nile :30 07/14/21 News2 Midday Wednesday

A Panhandle mosquito trap site has recently collected mosquitoes positive with West Nile virus. These are the first confirmed positive mosquitoes in Nebraska. These positive mosquitoes give Panhandle Public Health District (PPHD), along with other health departments, an indicator of the location of the virus and where people may come into contact with mosquitoes carrying the virus. Multiple locations across Nebraska are routinely monitoring sites to trap and test mosquitoes over the summer months. Human cases of West Nile are also used for surveillance. At this time, there have been no human cases of West Nile detected.

Blood Drive at Bethel Church :30 07/16/21 News2 6pm Friday

People rolled up their sleeves at Bethel Church this afternoon for a blood drive put on by the American Red Cross in support of Grace Koebek, a 2018 Maywood graduate dealing with adult acute myeloid leukemia. Her faith and family has helped her as she continues her battle with cancer. Her family worked with the Red Cross to host the event with hopes of holding more in the future.

Nebraska Covid 19 Vaccination Doses Expiring in Few Weeks :30 08/04/21 News2 6pm Wednesday

In the early days, the idea was to manufacture as much vaccine as possible, but now that vaccinations have slowed, unused doses are piling up. The state of Nebraska has

administered 1.9 million COVID-19 vaccination doses so far. That amounts to 93% of its allocation, meaning there are 124,000 doses still waiting to be used — and the vaccine has a limited shelf life. At the end of August, 45,000 of the state's Pfizer doses will expire and will need to be disposed of like regular medical waste.

UNL Releases Latest Covid-19 Protocols :30 08/06/21 News2 Midday Friday

The University of Nebraska released its latest COVID-19 protocols ahead of the 2021 Fall semester, which does not include a vaccine requirement. According to a release, the new guidance was put together due to rising COVID-19 cases nationwide. All vaccinated faculty, staff and students, as well as visitors to campus, are encouraged, but not required, to wear face masks indoors. Unvaccinated individuals should continue to wear masks. (Masks are required indoors for all individuals at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.)

American Red Cross Suffering with Blood Donation Shortage :30 08/11/21 News2 10pm Wednesday

The American Red Cross is experiencing a shortage of blood nationwide. The need comes from the increasing number of elective surgeries, transplants and people delaying their health needs due to the pandemic. Representatives of the American Red Cross have been pleading for more people to donate. According to the American Red Cross, in the United States, out of 100 people, only three people are blood donors.

Great Plains Health Offer Free Stroke Screening :30 09/10/21 News2 6pm Friday

Great Plains Health is hosting a stroke screening next week in hopes of helping people learn about the disease and understand how to recognize the signs for early intervention. Neurologists, occupational and physical therapists will be on hand to answer questions and speak about prevention and post stroke therapy. There will be EKG's, dietary and smoking cessation information, blood pressure and vital signs checks, cholesterol and blood sugar checks.

The Three Rivers Health Department (3RPHD) has announced Monday that the first death of West Nile Virus has been confirmed within the health district. Most people exposed to the virus don't get sick, but about 20 percent develop symptoms like headaches, fevers, muscle and joint aches, nausea and fatigue. In a very small proportion, less than one percent, the virus affects the nervous system, leading to a more serious illness that can cause neck stiffness, disorientation, tremors, convulsions, paralysis and even death.

North Platte Chief Police to Retire in November :30 07/07/21 News2 10pm Wednesday

North Platte's Chief of Police is retiring after serving the city for three years. Daniel Hudson announced his retirement to city officials last month. His last day is November 2, 2021. Hudson was selected through a nationwide comprehensive recruitment process in 2018. He previously served the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) for 26 years.

North Platte Hoping for Brighter Future :30 07/19/21 News2 10pm Monday

Monday morning the North Platte Northwestern Energy Economic Development Fund Committee and the North Platte Quality Growth Fund Citizens Review Committee met to discuss items such as Sustainable Beef LLC and Rail Park Development Funding. A large portion of both the meetings went to discussing Sustainable Beef LLC as it tries to move into North Platte. CEO of Sustainable Beef LLC, David Briggs was present at the meetings today. Briggs was asking for \$500,000 from both the Quality Growth Fund and the Northwestern Energy Fund. The estimated cost of the Sustainable Beef LLC project is \$9,791,790.

The Clerk's Office chose all-mail voting because it would be cheaper for the Hershey School district. Following the election, the Lincoln County Clerk's office will bill the district.

According to a press release by the Nebraska Judicial Branch, Judge Kent D. Turnbull of North Platte will leave the bench August 31, 2021. Turnbull has served the citizens of the State of Nebraska in the 11th Judicial District since taking the bench on October 22, 1999. After taking the bench in 1999, Turnbull was retained in his position by area voters, most recently in 2020. The first step in replacing Turnbull will be for the Judicial Resources Commission to call a meeting to determine whether his retirement creates a judicial vacancy on the County Court for the 11th Judicial District based on judicial workload statistics.

Lincoln County Assessors Three Year Plan :30 07/26/21 News2 Midday Monday

Once every six years, the Lincoln County Assessor is tasked with evaluating every commercial, residential, and agricultural property in her jurisdiction. This includes all properties in North Platte, starting with all the industrial land in 2022. After that, the residential properties in town will be split in half each of the next two years.

Bruns, who is a veteran of the United State Marine Corps. and was elected by voters to serve on the county board last November, said it was never his intention to run for senator until numerous people approached him about it.

Governor Ricketts Says Nebraska Won't be Adopting Mask Guidance :30 07/27/21 News2 6pm Tuesday

Tuesday, Governor Pete Ricketts issued a statement following news that the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued new guidance attempting to re-impose mask guidance for vaccinated people. "The CDC's new guidance suggesting that vaccinated people wear masks indoors flies in the face of the public health goals that should guide the agency's decision making," Ricketts said. "The CDC announcement only furthers the distrust many have with the CDC and does not help to encourage more people to get the vaccines that are helping bring the pandemic to a conclusion. The State of Nebraska will not be adopting their mask guidance." "Furthermore, I will reiterate my expectations for schools and universities in the fall. Schools should convene in person without mask or vaccine requirements," Ricketts said.
