ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Troopers Find 49 Pounds of Marijuana in I-80 Traffic Stop :30 11/02/20 News2 Midday Monday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol have arrested a California man after finding nearly 50 pounds of marijuana during a traffic stop on Interstate 80 near Kearney. At approximately 5:40 p.m. Saturday, a trooper observed a Dodge Grand Caravan make an unsafe pass of a semi-tractor/truck trailer. The trooper performed a traffic stop on the van. During the traffic stop, the trooper detected the odor of marijuana. A search of the vehicle revealed 49 pounds of marijuana contained inside suitcases in the rear of the van.

E-Ciagrette Use No Longer Allowed Indoors :30 11/10/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Starting Nov. 14, the expanded Nebraska Clean Indoor Air Act goes into effect prohibiting the use of electronic cigarettes in every enclosed indoor workplace with very few exceptions. This includes office buildings, manufacturing facilities, retail stores, restaurants, bars, etc. LB 840 passed earlier this year expanding the Act. The expanded Nebraska Clean Indoor Air Law exempts electronic smoking device retail outlets, or vape shops, from the indoor e-cigarette restriction. Communities are able to pass local policies that go beyond the Clean Indoor Air Act and businesses should check what local ordinances are in their area.

Troopers Arrest 34 Impaired Drivers During Thanksgiving Enforcement :30 11/30/20 News2 6pm Monday

Nebraska State Troopers removed 34 impaired drivers from the road and assisted more than 470 motorists during the Thanksgiving "Click It or Ticket" campaign. The campaign ran from Nov. 16 through Nov. 29. Throughout the campaign, troopers arrested 34 people for driving under the influence and cited 22 drivers for having an open alcohol container. Troopers also issued citations for speeding (776), minor in possession (7), driving under suspension (66), no proof of insurance (42), no seat belt (25), and improper child restraint (9). Troopers also performed 477 motorist assists during the campaign.

Rising Drug Overdoses Among Youth :30 12/11/20 News2 10pm Friday

According to a recent CDC report, there is an increasing number of nonfatal drug overdoses in youth. The data examines the data from roughly 90 million visits from 2016 to 2019. The overdoses are not typically with narcotics or illegal substances, yet there are common over the counter drugs such as Tylenol or Ibuprofen. In some cases, the youth does not realize they have overdosed on these medications until they have been transported to the hospital.

Lincoln County Commissioners Approve USDA Agreement :30 10/12/20 News2 10pm Monday

On October 12, 2020, the Lincoln County Commissioners approved an additional service to the wildlife damage management program. This addition provides funding to the USDA for aerial services. They will be able to use an aircraft for lethal control or predatory reduction in areas with a substantial number of coyotes. The aircraft allows them to cover larger amounts of land. With the availability of food, trash and small animals, wildlife finds their way into suburban and rural communities. They wander into these areas with people and learn there is food readily available.

Critters on the Move :30 10/22/20 News2 10pm Thursday

With harvest in full swing, animals are on the move, and anyone who drives rural Nebraska roads knows the danger and frustration of hitting a deer or other wildlife with a vehicle Public Information Officer from the Nebraska Game and Parks in North Platte Julie Gieser wants people to be safe as Nebraska critters scurry out of fields to find new homes. People might see animals on the move during and after harvest, such as deer, raccoon, badgers, fox, and coyote, because, according to Gieser, anytime existing cover is removed, such as a tree line or cornfield the animals move "out and find out to find new safe places to live."

New NSP K-9 Named for Trooper Dale Fahnholz 10/27/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

A new police K9 has officially joined the ranks of the Nebraska State Patrol. The newest NSP Police Service Dog is Fahn, named to honor Trooper Dale Fahnholz, who passed away suddenly on March 1, 2020. Fahn and his handler, Sergeant Workman, have been through months of training to earn certification. Fahn is a dual-purpose PSD, certified for narcotics

detection and patrolling functions. Fahn will be stationed in Grand Island and patrol the same troop area in which Trooper Fahnholz spent the majority of his career.

CONSUMER PROTECTION

North Platte and Hershey Combining Efforts at Fire Off Homestead Road :30 10/02/20 News2 Midday Friday

Local and area fire crews responded to a hay bale fire southwest of North Platte around noon. The fire at 3490 Homestead Road started by hay bales which were still wet when put up, causing them to combust and start fire. About 100 bales caught fire. The fire was contained within approximately 45 minutes.

US Postal Service to Increase Prices in 2021 :30 10/10/20 News2 6pm Saturday

Sending mail might get a little more expensive in 2021. The U.S. Postal Service filed notice with the Postal Regulatory Commission that it's planning to increase prices. The new proposal raises the price for first-class mail by 1.8% and all other categories by 1.5%. Some prices will remain unchanged, like the forever stamp at 55 cents while others will only go up one cent. The single-piece letter additional ounce is set to increase from 15 cents to 20.

Working From Home Money Scams :30 10/19/20 News2 6pm Monday

Bank scammers are now changing their methods following the changes that have come with COVID-19. As working from home has become more common and unemployment has risen, scammers are using this to their advantage.

Phone Calls Scamming NPPD Customers :30 10/23/20 News2 Midday Friday

A concerning phone scam is on the rise. Nebraska Public Power District telling customers to "hang up" if someone calls and asks you for money. If someone calls you to tell you your electric meter needs replaced, or that you will be disconnected if you do not make an immediate payment over the phone, hang up. You can call NPPD's customer service at 1-877-ASK-NPPD if this happens to you. NPPD will never call you and ask you to make a wire transfer, or to send gift cards or pre-paid debit cards such as Green Dot cards.

Political Texts, How Groups Get Your Information :30 11/01/20 News2 10pm Sunday

Voters are sounding off about constant calls and messages for the upcoming election. Many of them call it spam. Political campaigns begin ramping up at the start of election season, sending the unsolicited messages to inform voters, donors or activists of candidates' platforms, etc. Many times, the communication is coming from campaign workers or volunteers and being sent to a large list of phone numbers pulled from publicly available voter files. And that information, your information, is for sale.

Nebraska Secretary of State Reports Robo Calls Telling Voters to Stay Home :30 11/03/20 News2 Sunrise Tuesday

The Nebraska Secretary of State is reporting several instances of voters receiving robo calls to "stay home and stay safe" on Tuesday morning. According to the Secretary of State's

office, the anonymous calls started coming in Tuesday morning. However, Secretary of State Bob Evnen is reminding voters polling places across the state are open and "our voters and our poll workers will be kept safe."

BBB Warns of Online Shopping Scams Ahead of Black Friday :30 11/25/20 News2 Sunrise Wednesday

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused many brick-and-mortar businesses to improve their efforts in the digital space, and consumers are seeking great online shopping experiences to help them purchase their gifts and supplies. Ads for fabulous online deals are everywhere, tempting consumers with great prices and free shipping offers.

Omaha FBI Breaks Down Total Scam For The Year :30 11/25/20 News2 6pm Wednesday

The amount of money Nebraska victims have lost in scams just this year is mind-boggling. Fourteen million dollars stolen from 2,400 Nebraskans, and most of them can't afford the loss. Two FBI agents listen to a recorded scam call claiming my social security number has been used for identity theft and there's an arrest warrant out for me. Scammer on phone said, "You need to pay \$2,000 for that, a bail amount." On the cyber squad, the special agents specialize in scam investigations. Jake Foiles, FBI Special Agent said, "It's frustrating to see people are out there targeting the vulnerable. The elderly, the lonely." In this case, senior citizens threatened with the loss of social security.

Tips and Tricks for Thanksgiving Leftovers :30 11/27/20 News2 6pm Friday

As Thanksgiving dinners conclude, it's now time to start thinking of creative ways to use those leftovers. Food Nutrition and Health Extension Educator, Brenda Aufenkamp, says using smaller containers is a safer way to store your leftovers. she emphasizes the importance of storing containers level to each other instead of stacking. If you didn't store your turkey properly Aufdenkamp says you need to be sure to heat the leftovers to an internal temperature to 165 degrees. She says while turkey can be stored in a freezer for months, in the refrigerator you will have a shorter shelf life.

Reward Offered for Information on Missing Girl :30 10/01/20 News2 6pm Thursday

The family is hoping someone will come forward with information that could lead to the location of their daughter. Myra McKerrigan has been missing since July 19. She is a Hispanic female, born on December 25, 2004. She is 5'3, approximately 104 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. The Scottsbluff Police Department says Myra might be accompanied by 34-year-old Krystle Ramos who was last reported driving a Black Chevy Impala with plates: 7 WY CHUY. Krystal Ramos could be in the Colorado area looking for a male with the following identities, Lino Quintana or Marcello Margarito Quintana Torrez whose estimated age is 36 years old.

Keith County Attorneys Office Investigating Inmate Death :30

10/07/20 News2 10pm Wednesday

Keith County Attorney Randy Fair said 44-year-old James Mawson was booked in the Keith County Jail. He was brought in on a warrant for failure to appear last week in a Keith County case where he faced felon drug charges. Mawson died in a holding cell. Mawson was also scheduled to appear in Lincoln County Court Monday, before being found dead the night before. Lincoln County was going to issue a warrant for his arrest before learning of his death. Details of his death were not provided. However, an autopsy is scheduled this week.

NPFD Responds to Grass Fire Early Tuesday, Law Enforcement Suspects Arson :30 10/13/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

The North Platte Fire Department responded to a grass fire early Tuesday. It happened at 3:30 a.m. near the residence of 5856 South Old Highway 83. Fire crews say a mailbox was started on fire with fire works. The fire spread and burned two acres of land. No structures were damaged. This case is being investigated as arson by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office.

Indianola Man Facing Murder Charges in Tangled Crime scene :30 10/13/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Alva Clinton Decker III is accused of shooting and killing 30-year-old Steven Weaver on October 8th. Decker is accused of "purposely and with deliberate and premeditated malice" going after Weaver. He, alongside 36-year-old Charles Decker, are said to have "conspired" to kill Weaver. Charles Decker, however, died in a wreck on Highway 6/36 at mile marker 96. Weaver died at the same location. Alva Decker is now housed in the Red Willow County Jail with no bond. He is accused of shooting Weaver at the scene of the accident where Charles Decker died.

Bailey Boswell Found Guilty of First-Degree Murder :30 10/14/20 News2 Midday Wednesday

After three years, the Loofe family has justice for 24-year-old Sydney's death. As a jury of eight men and four women found Bailey Boswell guilty of first-degree murder, improper disposal of human remains and conspiracy to commit murder. The jury deliberated for just over three hours.

Early Morning Rollover Accident Near Hershey :30 10/20/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

Just before 2:00 a.m. 21-year-old Lyle Harms of Ogallala told officers he struck a curb going southbound on Link 56 C. He overcorrected, left the roadway, and rolled his pickup several times. Officers suspected alcohol use, in which Harms tested positive for. Harms was taken to the Lincoln County Jail but transferred to Great Plains Health due to injuries sustained in the accident. Harms was issued a ticket for Driving Under the Influence and released.

Accident at State Farm Road and Highway 83 10/20/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

A tanker truck and a small passenger car collided around 11:00 a.m., Tuesday, at the Intersection of State Farm Road and Highway 83. Officers on scene telling News 2 a car coming from east State Farm Road, turning left onto Highway 83 was struck by the tanker. So far News 2 is reporting one person from the passenger car has been transported to Great Plains Health with severe injuries. The truck driver is not injured.

Young Man Being Reunited with Family :30 10/22/20 News2 6pm Thursday

Pictures of 24-year-old Morgan Burmester helped troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol locate the young man this evening after a search began when his mother reported him missing Wednesday. Burmester was positively identified after being spotted by a trooper at Arther Bay

at Lake McConaughy near Ogallala, Thursday evening. Captain of Troop D, Nebraska State Patrol, Tyler Schmidt told News 2 Burmester was transported to the Ogalala hospital for treatment on some accidental cuts to his hands, and to be reunited with his family.

Driver Arrested Following Road Rage Incident :30 10/22/20 News2 6pm Thursday

At approximately 4:20 p.m. Wednesday, NSP received a report of a road rage incident on I-80 in Lincoln County. The incident reportedly included the driver of an eastbound Toyota Highlander pointing a firearm at another driver. Troopers were able to locate the vehicle and perform a traffic stop near mile marker 196. During the traffic stop, troopers located two handguns in the vehicle. The driver, Avery Rogers, 34, of Bowling Green, Missouri, was arrested for making terroristic threats and use of a firearm to commit a felony. Rogers was lodged in Lincoln County Jail.

Former State Fair Exec Headed to Trial :30 10/27/20 News2 Midday Tuesday

The former Financial Director for the Nebraska State Fair is headed to trial to defend himself against charges that he stole money from the fair. Patrick Kopke is charged with three counts of felony theft in Hall County. The charges are for theft of movable property of value greater than \$5,000. Each charge could lead to 20 years in prison each with potential reparation payments for the stolen goods. On Monday, Kopke waived an evidence hearing in Hall County Court. The judge transferred the case to Hall County District Court.

Kansas Man Arrested in Nebraska on Child Enticement Charges :30 10/29/20 News2 SunriseThursday

Nebraska State Patrol troopers took 24-year-old Bradley Burris into custody on Tuesday in Wood River. He is facing two counts of enticement of a child by electronic communication device. NSP investigators worked with the Fairbury Police Department, Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, and the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) to make the arrest. The investigation began with a report to the Fairbury Police Department. During the investigation, NSP, KBI, and several other agencies became involved. Investigators obtained search warrants for social media accounts connected to Burris and discovered multiple sexually explicit videos involving a juvenile.

Driver Cited After Rear-Ending NSP Commander's Unmarked Vehicle :30 11/02/20 News2 6pm Monday

The collision occurred at approximately 7:40 a.m. Monday. The NSP vehicle, an unmarked Dodge Durango, was stopped on Highway 30 at Monroe Road, east of Silver Creek, waiting for the vehicle in front of it to turn left onto Monroe Road. That vehicle was waiting as a train passed. A Cadillac CTS then struck the NSP vehicle from behind. The NSP commander suffered minor injuries in the crash but was transported to the hospital in Columbus to receive medical clearance. He was treated and released. The driver of the Cadillac was also treated at the hospital for minor injuries and has been released. The Cadillac driver was cited for careless driving and following too closely.

Abducted Child Recovered, Suspect Arrested Near North Platte :30 11/04/20 News2 Midday Thursday

At approximately 6:15 p.m. CT Tuesday, NSP received information regarding an assault and kidnapping that had occurred in Sedgwick County. The Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office provided information that the suspect had assaulted a woman, then drove off in the woman's vehicle with her child still in the vehicle. The suspect was believed to be traveling eastbound on Interstate 80 in Nebraska. At approximately 7 p.m. CT, troopers were able to locate the vehicle, a Mazda 3, at I-80 mile marker 177, near North Platte.

One Man Arrested. One Man Wanted for North Platte Shooting :30 11/12/20 News2 Sunrise Thursday

41-year-old Cortney Hansen was arrested after a warrant was issued on November 10. Hansen was charged with Aiding and Abetting-1st Degree Assault, regarding the shooting. The North Platte Police Department is searching for 48-year-old Nathaneal Anthony, for his involvement in the shooting. An arrest warrant has also been issued. Anthony is wanted for 1st Degree Assault, use of a Firearm to Commit a Felony, and Possession of a Firearm by a Prohibited Person.

Fiery Overnight Semi-Crash on I-80 Near Brady :30 11/12/20 News2 Sunrise Thursday

Nebraska State Patrol releases several photos on Twitter after two-semi crash on I-80 near Brady Wednesday night. According to the post, local fire crews responded to the crash, where a diesel spill caused a fire. There were no injuries reported.

20-Year-Old Man Dead in North Platte Stabbing :30 11/12/20 News2 Midday Thursday

19-year-old Harlie Saathoff is being held in the Lincoln County Detention Center. At court in Lincoln County Court Thursday, Judge Kent Turnbull set bail at one million dollars. Accused of stabbing and killing her boyfriend, 20-year-old Bryce Wood, Saathoff faces up to life in prison if found guilty. Court records tell the story of a troubled relationship pattern between Wood and Saathoff with Wood being arrested once for a felony domestic issue with Saathoff the victim in April 2020. Several other disturbances were indicated.

Death Ruled a Homicide :30 11/20/20 News2 10pm Friday

A close family member to a man who was found dead in the NPPD canal near Lake Maloney in June said the death of his loved one is ruled a homicide. 68-year old Nicholas "Nick" Legas was found floating in the canal about four miles west of the lake on June 8. His vehicle was found more than six miles upstream. An autopsy indicated Legas had no water in his lungs or esophagus, meaning he did not drown. His family member told News 2 Legas suffered blunt force trauma to his head, as well as strangulation.

SWAT Makes Arrest in Red Willow County :30 12/10/20 News2 6pm Thursday

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol SWAT Team have arrested a person wanted in connection with a homicide investigation in Red Willow County. During the morning hours of Thursday, December 10, NSP SWAT was activated to effectuate the arrest of Travis Terwilliger, 45, of McCook. Terwilliger had an active felony warrant for use of a firearm to commit a felony, accessory to a felony, and terroristic threats. With the assistance of the Red Willow County Sheriff's Office and McCook Police Department, NSP SWAT was able to apprehend Terwilliger at his home at 304 East 2nd Street in McCook without incident. Terwilliger was lodged in Red Willow County Jail.

NSP Investigating Shooting in Palisade :30 12/21/20 News2 Midday Monday

NSP Investigators were called-in Friday, after the Hayes County Sheriff's Office responded to the scene at 308 North Osborn in Palisade. A victim was located with multiple gunshot wounds. The victim was transported to Great Plains Health in North Platte and is expected to survive. The Hayes County Sheriff's Office has requested that the Nebraska State Patrol be the lead agency in the investigation. Preliminary investigation was completed at the scene Friday. The Hayes County Sheriff's Office, Hitchcock County Sheriff's Office, Palisade Fire and Rescue assisted on scene. The investigation remains ongoing.

In Home Disturbance Ends in Gunshot Wound and Double Arrest :30 12/28/20 News2 Midday Monday

An 18-year old arrived at Great Plains Health with a gunshot wound as officers with the North Platte Police Department (NPPD) investigate a disturbance the day after Christmas. As officers were responding to the scene, it was reported that an individual with a gunshot wound, had just arrived at Great Plains Health. During the investigation, NPPD learned that the 18-year old victim was involved in a disturbance at the home with two men. Both men were incarcerated at the Lincoln County Detention Center. The victim suffered serious but non-life-threatening injuries from the incident.

Colorado Family Killed in Wednesday Mornings Crash Near Hershey :30 12/24/20 News2 6pm Thursday

A Colorado family was killed in Wednesday morning's two vehicle accident near Hershey, according to the Nebraska State Patrol. The Nebraska State Patrol says 24-year-old Edgar Navarro, his passenger Idayalid Bautista, 25, and Alexa Navarro, 4, all of Westminster, Colorado, died at the scene. Navarro's and Bautista's two other children, a three-year-old girl and an eleven-month-old girl were both transported to Great Plains Health in North Platte.

North Platte Area Chamber and Development hosted their Business After Dark Event at God Father's Pizza on Friday. People were able to come and network, meet new people in the area and learn more about local businesses. This was the first event of this stature since the health pandemic began. The Chamber hosts networking events like this each month, but due to COVID-19, some of those events were canceled or postponed.

A Pumpkin Filled Weekend at The Dusty Trails :30 10/02/20 News2 10pm Friday

The annual tank race is a fundraiser hosted by the Nebraska Sports Commission. Eight teams will have the opportunity to dress up in costumes, decorate their tanks and race down the Platte River from Buffalo Bill State Recreation Area to Cody Park. With October, being full of pumpkin activities, there has been an additional competition added to the event. At the end of the race, each team will be responsible for decorating a pumpkin with a mystery bag of materials.

Former Alco Building and Parkade Plaza Under New Ownership :30 10/07/20 Local4 Midday Wednesday

Whitetail Management LLC purchased the property for slightly more than a million dollars. Shae and Jeff Caldwell who also own Whitetail Screen Print and Cycle Sport and Whitetail Outpost, own all the Parkade Plaza, except for the section where Brothers Tavern is located. Caldwell said it's a process that's been in the works for the past six months and is just another piece towards the continuation to revitalize the downtown area.

Local Golf Cart Business Expanding :30 10/07/20 News2 10pm Wednesday

McNew's Unlimited, a North Platte based business specializing in customized golf carts, is ramping up operations going into 2021. Company founder Nick McNew is moving the company across town to a bigger lot ahead of the expansion. An encouraging sign for small

businesses in North Platte. McNew has worked in a family business and believes in the importance of supporting this community. He partners frequently with local businesses to help customize his products for clients.

Grant Helping Workforce Economy :30 10/08/20 News2 6pm Thursday

The process is happening for facilitation of maintenance on Central's hydro-electric generation units. The lake level will drop around two feet, and levels will fluctuate with very low inflows for approximately 10 days. Following the 10-day outage,

Johnson Lake will go through a hydrocycling period, where the lake will continue to fluctuate until mid-November.

Most people with West Nile virus will have no symptoms or only mild flu-like symptoms such as a fever and headache.

Legislation to Help Local Meat Processors :30 10/01/20 News2 Midday Thursday

The Strengthening Local Processing Act would allow small meat processors to expand their capacity to process animals and serve more rural livestock producers. Under current federal law, in order for a farmer or rancher to sell individual cuts of locally raised meats they must first send their animals to one of a limited number of U.S. Department of Agriculture or

state-inspected slaughterhouses. These slaughterhouses are sometimes hundreds of miles away and there are far too few of them across the nation. As a result, many smaller meat and poultry processing plants are booked out for months, and small farms are unable to meet new demand due to a lack of processing capacity.

Honor Flight Exhibit Shows Veteran Appreciation :30 10/02/20 News2 6pm Saturday

The Patriotic Productions Honor Flight Exhibit is now at the Brule Activity Center. It is set up for the weekend. Organizer BJ Van Velson says this is a great way to bring something fun to the community. They got the chance view the many memorials in D.C. This is giving veterans an opportunity to re-live their experiences, and for family members, volunteers and patriots of all ages to reminisce and educate others about the importance of thanking and honoring our veterans.

Senator Fischer Tests Negative for COVID-19 :30 10/04/20 News2 10pm Sunday

U.S. Sen. Deb Fischer of Nebraska has tested negative for COVID-19, according to her office on Sunday. Fischer was an attendee at the White House's Rose Garden last week during a ceremony nominating Judge Amy Coney Barrett to the U.S. Supreme Court by President Donald Trump. Eight others who attended the event, including Trump and First Lady Melania Trump, have contracted the coronavirus.

If this passes, casinos with slots and cards could only be at race tracks. There are six licensed racetracks in Nebraska, including one in Lincoln.

Troopers with the Nebraska State Patrol (NSP) may be wearing a pink patch in October to honor and support those fighting breast cancer. The Pink Patch Project is a national effort that involves law enforcement agencies throughout the country, including many in the state of Nebraska. This is the third year that NSP has participated in the project.

Nebraska Voters to Decide on Legalizing Casino Gambling :30 10/14/20 News2 10pm Wednesday

Nebraska voters will be able to vote on legalizing casino gambling in the state. Voters will see three separate initiatives related to casino gambling: Initiative 429, 430 and 431. Initiative 429 would change the Nebraska constitution to allow games of chance at licensed horse tracks. Initiative 430 creates a gaming commission and 431 details the gaming tax breakdown. According to initiative 431, casino gambling in Nebraska would be taxed at a 20% rate. 70% of that tax dollar will go towards property tax relief if passed.

The Bigfoot Crossroads of America Museum and Research Center is announcing that the date of October 20, 2020 has been officially proclaimed the Bigfoot Crossroads of Nebraska Day by Governor Pete Ricketts and the State of Nebraska. Also, Harriett McFeely has officially been named "Nebraska Bigfoot Lady" and her partner, Kenny Collins, has officially been named "Nebraska Bigfoot Guy".

Poll Worker Training Underway in Lincoln County :30 10/20/20 News2 6pm Tuesday

Poll worker training has begun in Lincoln County and will continue over the next two days. About 120 people have signed up to work the polls on election day. Half are new to the process. County Election Commissioner Rebecca Rossell said 50% of her workers decided not to work the polls this election cycle due to the pandemic.
