**WPNA 103.1 FM Programs Addressing Public and Community Issues**

During the fourth quarter of 2018, WPNA's bilingual (Polish/English) locally produced programming addressed the following issues of concern to the public:

1. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 3:30 p.m., segment duration - 10 min.)  
Guests Kuba Luczkiewicz, Chicago-based documentary and feature filmmaker, and Fr. Gerald Gunderson of Mary Seat of Wisdom Parish in Park Ridge, IL, discussed their trip to Chikwa, Zambia, taken to film "Labor of Love", a documentary for Mary, Seat of Wisdom Parish. The guests discussed how WPNA FM listeners can get involved in helping maintain the Zambian parish and contribute to the community it created there.
2. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (October 4<sup>th</sup>, 4:00 p.m., segment duration - 7 min.)

Guest Illinois Governor Bruce Rauner addressed Polish American community in his interview with WPNA FM's general manager, Jacek Niemczyk. The interview topics included the state budgetary issues and the upcoming gubernatorial election.

- 3. *Morning with 103.1 FM*** (October 8<sup>th</sup>, 8:00 a.m., segment duration - 5 min.)  
Morning show hosts, Mateusz Pankiewicz and Magda Marczevska, discussed the upcoming Polish Film Festival in America, the world's most extensive annual showcase of Polish film outside of Poland. The festival program highlights were summarized for the listeners, including the meeting with Pawel Pawlikowski, eminent Polish filmmaker, recipient of Oscar ("Ida") and BAFTA ("Last Resort", "My Summer of Love") and Chicago showing of his new and already internationally-acclaimed film COLD WAR.
- 4. *Morning with 103.1 FM*** (October 11<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 a.m., segment duration - 7 min.)  
Morning show hosts, Mateusz Pankiewicz and Magda Marczevska, discussed the upcoming annual Open House Chicago event that offers a behind-the-scenes look at more than 250 buildings throughout the city, allowing visitors to explore churches, skyscrapers, historic homes, theaters and more. The buildings of historical significance to the Polish community were also mentioned.
- 5. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM*** (November 9<sup>th</sup>, 4:00 p.m., segment duration - 12 min.)  
Afternoon hosts discussed the upcoming Polish Independence 10K Run/Walk held on Montrose Harbor on November 11<sup>th</sup>, commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Poland regaining independence. Other commemorative events and their programs were discussed with information on how to attend them.
