WPNA 103.1 FM Programs Addressing Public and Community Issues

During the third quarter of 2018, WPNA's bilingual (Polish/English) locally produced programming addressed the following issues of concern to the public:

1. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (July 11th, 3:00 p.m., segment duration - 11 min.)
Afternoon host, Jacek Zielinski, interviewed Kuba Luczkiewicz, Chicago-based documentary and feature filmmaker, and Fr. Gerald Gunderson of Mary Seat of Wisdom Parish in Park Ridge, IL, about the movie "Labor of Love". The film tells the story of how the isolated rural community of Chikwa in the Eastern Province of Zambia has been inspired to form a parish in the midst of brutal temperatures, insufficient water, chronic hunger, extreme poverty and insufficient social service. Through a narrative, on-location footage and live, "Labor of Love" paints a highly cinematic multi-layered portrait of the lives of the residents of the Luangwa River Valley. The title "Labor of Love" encompasses the film's story line, which will explore Fr. Wilfred Bwezany Phiri's devotion for Chikwa community and a true

brotherhood manifested by Park Ridge parishioners building an empowering bridge across the ocean. The guests discussed how WPNA FM listeners can get involved in helping maintain the Zambian parish and contribute to the community it created there.

2. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (August 6th, 4:00 p.m., segment duration - 22 min.)
Afternoon host, Jacek Zielinski, interviewed Father Mikolaj Markiewicz of the St. Mary Maryville Sanctuary, on the topic of religious pilgrimage. The Maryville Sanctuary is hosting an annual pilgrimage for parishioners from Chicago. Fr. Markiewicz discussed the ways of participating in the pilgrimage that would be of interest to the station listeners.
3. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (August 26th, 5:00 p.m., segment duration - 16 min.)
Afternoon host, Daniel Bociaga, interviewed Iwona Węgrzyn-Bocheńska, Conrad Nowak, Ted "Flaki" Milówka, organizers of a motorcycle parade commemorating the 100th anniversary of Poland regaining independence in 1918. The parade was scheduled to drive on the streets of Chicago on September 2 and radio listeners were encouraged to take part as riders or spectators.
4. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (September 6th, 4:00 p.m., segment duration - 10 min.)
Afternoon host, Jacek Zielinski, interviewed Joanna Szmurlo and Jaroslaw Golembiowski, organizers of the Polonia Restituta concert held at the St. Adalbert church in Chicago on September 9th. The funds from the tickets were to support the struggling historical parish and celebrate the 100th anniversary of Poland regaining independence.
5. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (September 13th, 4:00 p.m., segment duration - 12 min.)
Afternoon host, Jacek Zielinski, interviewed Polish representation for the Para World Sailing Championships w Sheboygan, WI, held on September 15-22. The guests talked about their passion for sailing, pride in representing Poland and how the listeners can watch the competition and support Polish team.
6. *Afternoon with 103.1 FM* (September 27th, 5:00 p.m., segment duration - 16 min.)
Afternoon host, Jacek Zielinski, interviewed Stanisław Błaszczyna, world traveler and movie critic who was promoting his latest publications, including *Travels*, at a meeting with fans at the Polish Museum of America in Chicago.
